#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the Seventh day of March, next at seven of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. Polls will open at 5 P.M. and will remain open until 10 P.M. The business of the Town Meeting will open at 7 P.M.
  - 4. To vote on the Presidential Preference Primary.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Snow Removal for the ensuing year.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Forty-Six Dollars and Fifty-Three Cents (\$346.53) for T.R.A. so called.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$13,000.00 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town:

#### # 50 Shedd Hill Road,

such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, N.H. R.S.A., as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town.

- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of public landings.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars to put into a capital reserve fund for a new fire truck.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Police Department for the ensuing year.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$225.00) in support of the operating costs of the Elliot Community Hospital for the year 1972.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Forty-Five Dollars (\$445.00) for the support of the Monadnock Region Association.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights for the ensuing year.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Public Library.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.
- 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Dump.

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, or take any action thereon.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for the Bi-Centenuial Fund.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$72.00, to support the services of the community Health Clinic of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) for the purchase of a new snow removal truck.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Fifteen Dollars (\$315.00) as its fair share of the operating costs of the North Cheshire County Home Health Service.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Non-partisan ballot system.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote on article #22 of the 1962 Town meeting.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) to be used by the Stoddard Conservation Commission to commence the development of a land use plan; and to investigate the possibility of other future projects. Said funds may also be used as matching funds to obtain either federal or private money.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of seven members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15, Chapter 36, N.H. R.S.A. 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board shall consist of one Se-

lectman and six other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, no later than three (3) weeks following Town Meeting, as provided in Chapter 36, N.H. R.S.A., 1955.

- 30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its discretion new subdivisions and plats thereof showing streets, or the widening thereof, of parks, and upon the adoption of this article, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Registry of Deeds of the County of Cheshire a certificate or note showing that the said Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of authorization, as provided in Section 19, and Sections 19-29 inclusive, Chapter 36 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. If this article is adopted, it shall further be the duty of the Town Clerk to issue all certificates of failure when the Planning Board shall fail to take action as provided in Chapter 36: Sections 19, 20-29 inclusive.
- 31. Concerning the duties of the town road agent and winter maintenance of paved roads.

Resolved that the road agent and the selectmen shall be required to maintain all paved roads within the town of Stodward free from snow to a width of 36' or three cars wide.

Resolved that the road agent and the selectmen shall be required to clear all roads of snow after each snowstorm promptly.

Resolved that the road agent and the selectmen shall be required to maintain all paved hills free from ice or snow through the use of road salt where slippery road conditions normally prevail after plowing.

Resolved that the road agent and selectmen shall be required to sand any part of any road when so requested by a member of the public; and, when snow has ceased to fall and further snow is not expected within 48 hours; and, when the surface of the road is covered with snow and hazardous after plowing.

Resolved that the road agent and the selectmen shall be required to clear the road of slush when packed snow upon the

paved surface has melted and is of sufficient thickness to be plowed off, and follow this up with sanding of areas that subsequently freeze after the thaw.

Resolved that the road agent and selectmen shall be required to provide and deliver sand to any barrel marked for the use of the public and located upon any hill where accessible to the general motorist provided the barrel has been presented to the town free of charge for this purpose.

Resolved that the road agent and the selectmen shall be bound to these standards of winter road maintenance on paved roads as part of their duties and henceforth these standards shall be considered the minimum acceptable by the town.

32. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

In the Spring and Summer of 1970 we attempted to equalize valuations. For the most part, we think we were successful. We did this not only because it needed doing in regards to the Town's tax structure, but also to comply with the State law. This law, in effect, says that cities and towns in New Hampshire shall assess at 100% of full value. As many of you know from looking at your property valuations from previous years, the assessment has averaged from 10% to roughly 21%. In 1970 we tried to equalize the valuations on every parcel in town at 10%. The State Tax Commission informed us that according to their comparative tax survey we were assessing at 13%. This past year we took the first step to comply with the law by tripling the valuations on every parcel in town so that we are now assessing at 39%. This is why the tax rate dropped from \$5.40 per one-hundred dollars of valuation, to \$2.05. We anticipate taking the second step this coming year by doubling this year's valuation. This will put us at 78% of full valuation and close enough to the law to satisfy the Tax Commission. This increase together with anticipated increases in appropriations (we guess) will drop the tax rate from \$2.05/\$100.00 to between \$1.10 and \$1.20/\$100.00 of valuation.

We hope this will help you better understand our tax structure, and the reason it has changed for the past two years.

# REPORT OF STUDY COMMITTEE INVESTIGATING TOWN PLANNING

During the past year the Study Committee concerned with town planning has held several meetings at which we have considered the various potential problems Stoddard may encounter which might be avoided through the use of town planning. After speaking with members of planning committees from communities comparable to Stoddard and with members of the State Planning Commission, the Committee has come to several conclusions. The first is that in order to assure that Stoddard remain a healthy community in which to live it would be advisable to develop a community plan.

A community plan requires a stock-taking by the community of its physical, financial, and other resources and a frank appraisal of its deficiencies. There must follow decisions concerning the place the community is to occupy in the area of which it is a part and how its resources can best be used to achieve this. From these decisions a plan must be developed to serve as a guide to the private and public development of the community.

The first step of Community Planning involves formulation of a master plan for the town. A comprehensive plan includes three basic features:

- 1. A complete, up-to-date survey, with maps, figures and data, covering existing conditions such as land use, housing, population, transportation, utilities, water, sewerage, recreational facilities, schools, etc.
- 2. Analysis and conclusions drawn from the survey.
- 3. Recommendations (in the form of maps, charts, and printed texts) as to how Stoddard's best features can be preserved; how improvements can be made; how future major expenditures can be budgeted to avoid unduly heavy financial burdens at any one time.

The chief value of such a plan is that it provides both the recommendations and facts which the town can use to build

up the community in an orderly and healthy manner; to keep the best features as they are; to make it a still better town in which to live, work and play; and to show how this can be done at less cost than undertaking projects on a haphazard basis and at the last minute. For example, a town plan and town ordinances regarding subdivision might avoid a repeat of the current Granite Lake situation with which the town and state are currently concerned.

At the present time Stoddard must rely on the legislation provided by the State of New Hampshire for control of subdivision of land. There are many gaps between the state's laws and the town's needs. Therefore, the committee recommends the passage of articles twenty-seven and twenty-eight which this committee has submitted in the town warrant.

The Study Committee has discovered that there are several advantages in adopting local subdivision regulations. Such regulations can insure that land divided for building or sale meets certain minimum specifications. The lots must have adequate waste disposal and water supply, proper roads and drainage ways, accurate boundaries, and adequate open spaces. Local government can require that adequate public facilities such as roads be provided for the subdivisions. The ordinances can, in fact, fulfill several functions:

- 1. Local regulations can fill in gaps left by the state level regulations. Often land is divided into long, narrow lots larger than one and one-half acres thereby avoiding the state law.
- 2. A local subdivision ordinance can prevent a developer from selling land for building sites to unsuspecting purchasers who will be unable to develop their lots because they would fail to meet minimum zoning or sanitary code requirements.
- 3. The subdivision regulation can require the developer to provide a public road network within the subdivision.
- 4. The community can require the developer to dedicate land within the subdivision for public access or other

public purposes related to the subdivided land.

Community Planning encourages the preservation of scenic and historic areas, important natural resources such as ponds, lakes, streams, wooded areas, and wetlands; it encourages a proper distribution and density of population to avoid health, safety and fire hazards. Planning aims to provide a good living environment with social, educational, and recreational opportunities for everyone.

# NORTH CHESHIRE COUNTY HOME HEALTH SERVICE

This visiting nurse program has been organized for three years and has made the services of a registered professional nurse available to the Towns of Gilsum, Marlow, Stoddard, Sullivan and Surry.

Mrs. Edith Hasbrouck, R. N. has provided home nursing care ordered by a physician, guidance in general health practices, visits to mothers of new-born babies, and help with the use of community resources. There is also available a qualified physical therapist.

At present a Child Health Conference is scheduled one morning each month with Dr. Gilbert Fuld, Pediatrician from Keene Clinic, as attending physician. Appointments are made by Mrs. Hasbrouck for parents to bring their pre-school children for immunizations, vision, hearing and dental screening, and health education. So far every appointment has been kept which have meant some busy mornings. Volunteers are needed for various kinds of assistance at these Conferences.

Nursing care visits have increased from 307 in 1970 to 327 in 1971, divided among the towns as follows:

Residents of these towns are beginning to become more acquainted with the service, as nursing care visits have increased in recent months. We are certified to serve Medicare patients, and have set a nominal fee for others, while no one is refused care because of inability to pay.

Presently a county-wide group is meeting to look into the possibility of co-ordinating agencies to provide better service and coverage, and an attempt to serve those towns that do not now have any service available.

We have been conducting our third annual membership drive, which helps in part to meet our budget. A grant of Federal and State funds has helped us get started and will keep the service in operation until June 30, 1972. After that date, there is no money available except membership fees and what the towns appropriate at the Town Meetings. Our total annual budget is about \$5,000.00. We are asking each town to contribute at the rate of \$1.35 per capita in order to keep this service available.

The office is in the Gilsum Fire Station, with the nurse available from 9 a.m. to noon, Monday through Friday. The telephone number is 357-0969, and calls should be made between 9 and 10 a.m.

# REPORT OF CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Your Conservation Commission has spent considerable time and study attempting to determine some of the more practical conservation projects and planning that might be of long range benefit to the town and townspeople.

We recognize that we have not considered all possibilities and would welcome all the help and suggestions you might give, as well as any resident with the time and interest to join our Commission.

- 1. Recognizing "Stoddard Rocks" as both a historical and geographic landmark in town, it was decided to attempt to obtain a public right for townspeople and their guests both to reach and enjoy the Rocks over suitable hiking trails. Arrangements, not entirely to our satisfaction because of their short range (only five years), have been worked out with the landowner, Mr. Williams, and it is hoped that they will be concluded by a proper easement at no cost to the town.
- 2. Also in regard to open space and recreation, a similar easement permitting hiking, riding, picnics, etc., but restricting vehicles, has been worked out for the Andorra Forest with Dr. and Mrs. Faulkner.
- 3. Your Commission is currently investigating the possibility of development of the wet area or swamp between Eaton's Store and Route #123 as a scenic and recreational pond which would greatly improve the appearance of the town, and at present have the verbal agreement of the landowners to dedicate the land to this use.

Such a project, however, first would require some funding to be used for preliminary planning, survey, appraisals and legal assistance in order to present plans and costs for consideration at a future town meeting. Secondly, if such a project were to be approved, while some sources of outside funding might be available, town matching money would be required.

- 4. A fourth consideration we see is a need for a town land use or capability map to be used both by this Commission and by a town Planning Committee or Board for future planning. Therefore, for this reason, we support the establishment of a Town Planning Board and hope the town so sees fit to vote.
- 5. Finally, a fifth area of future concern which should be studies, is that area of wet land off Route #9 and north of Granite Lake which may well be critical as a water recharge area for the lake.

Therefore in order to obtain funds for planning, technical investigation, surveys, appraisals and legal assistance, as well as matching funds to obtain additional outside monies for the above uses, and to be able to present at a future town meeting suitable plans and cost estimates of specific projects as developed, we are requesting through the town warrant a sum of \$750.00 (seven hundred and fifty dollars).

#### SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS MESSAGE

There are a number of things I would like to discuss in this report to you that attest to the idea that it is our continuing desire to achieve a system of education that recognizes each child for his own worth, strives to provide for this recognition through varied methods of instruction and attempts to do so within reasonable economic bounds. Through the efforts of many people we are moving in this direction. The process of education is not an individual matter. It is one that requires a coordinated effort on the part of all members of the system wherein each one's peculiar talents can be utilized to their fullest for the benefit of the children, their school and community. Many of the programs to be discussed, although on the surface not seemingly related to the foregoing, do never-the-less have as their ultimate goal the strengthening of the system educationally as well as economically. The discussion that follows is not necessarily in any order of importance.

Accountability is becoming a byword in the economics of education. It is, perhaps, long overdue. As we approach the two million dollar mark in total budgets in Supervisory Union #24 it is becoming vital that we develop techniques whereby we know well where the educational tax dollar is going and whether or not it is reaching the goals we have set. Accountability in its strictest sense is rather sophisticated for small school districts that do not have access to the computer. Yet there is no excuse. We have begun to work with our staffs in developing their budget requests on the basis of the goals they desire to accomplish. In addition we are looking to them for evidence of long range planning in the development of their programs and for the ways in which these programs will be evaluated. Expenditures for teaching materials are now made by a modified program format so that we may readily identify amounts of money being spent in each subject area. This will lead us to the point whereby we may begin to relate the economic factors of our program to the educational results. This is not an easy task. However, we feel it to be most vital in assisting your school board members in interpreting their budget needs and school programs to you. At the same time it will lead us down the road to greater economic efficiency. In a day when education is going to have to compete with many other vital community needs this process is of high priority. Not simply to keep getting more dollars, but to use better what we have.

Continuing along the line of economics, a considerable amount of effort has been spent in some of our districts in trying to discover ways by which we may make better use of community resources in expanding our school programs. The rather traditional outlook that an education ought to take place soley in the school, and that it was the exclusive domain of the certified professional portrays a weak position. This is not to say that the teacher is no longer a vital person in the process, for most certainly he is and will continue to be, although the role will probably undergo some significant changes. The point to be made is that we have in all of our communities persons who have particular talents who, on a part time, paid or unpaid basis could enrich the variety of educational experiences that could be made available to our students. Also, as space needs become known community facilities could become a reasonable alternative to expensive building programs. Currently, this is the object of study by the Henniker and Hillsboro Districts. For the smaller districts shared use of such facilities as libraries, town halls and the like along with talented residents may be one approach to providing an educational program that would help meet the requirements of the State Elementary Standards.

Before closing out on this theme I would like to make two proposals.

1. Each community develop a Human Resources Commit-

- tee whose function would be to identify those residents who possess skills and a desire to share them, and to develop ways in which these talents might be used.
- 2. A committee should be developed composed of representatives of municipal and school departments for the purpose of sharing information and plans relative to fulfilling community needs now and in the future and to develop methods by which the available tax dollars may be used more effectively.

And finally these things are also happening to make for a better educational opportunity for each child:

- —A course in how to individualize instruction sponsored by the Union-wide curriculum project—CAPE.
- —Plans are now being developed through a joint committee school, college and community to initiate a community services center to meet the numerous social needs of the residents in the area served by Supervisory Union #24.
- —Initiation of individualized instruction and continuous progress programs in our schools wherein each child is recognized for his individual worth and appropriate methods of instruction used to meet his particular needs. Success is emphasized rather than failure.
- —An advisory committee of teachers who meet monthly with me to discuss items of concern. This represents a small beginning at developing better lines of communication between the central office and those with whom we work.
- —A project designed to use in a more effective manner the skill and experience of staff members in the instructional process. Commonly referred to as Differentiated

Staffing, the gist of the project is to identify the various tasks a teacher has to perform, assign specific responsibilities and roles to each person and provide the environment wherein staff members can work as a team and benefit by what each has to offer. Two pilot programs will be initiated in Hopkinton commencing in September of 1972.

Each effort described in this report manifests our sincere desire to make the educational opportunity available to your children the best we possibly can. Despite all the fancy pronouncements we find in wordy philosophies of education, it still comes down to the desire to provide at a reasonable cost a sound and up to date system of education. I am blessed with many fine people on my staffs and on the school boards in Union #24 who can make this happen.

With your support it will.

# Report of the Forest Fire Warden and District Chief LEST WE FORGET — IT CAN HAPPEN HERE

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar-holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947 nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

- Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand — a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
- Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
- If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them DEAD OUT when leaving.
- MOST IMPORTANT Instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year — 1971 — was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.
