THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. to 6:30 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Barnstead in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Barnstead Town Hall in said Barnstead on Tuesday, the 12th (Twelfth) day of March, next at 10:00 a.m. of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. The second session for purpose of discussing and voting upon the Articles of the Town Warrant shall be held on Saturday, March 16, 1991 at 1:00 P.M. at the Barnstead Elementary School, and for all other business to come before the Meeting. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for, receive and expend federal or state grants, which may become available during the course of the year, and also to accept and expend money from any other governmental unit or private source to be used for purposes for which the town may legally appropriate money, provided: (1) that such grants and other monies do not require the expenditure of other town funds, (2) that a public hearing shall be held by the Selectmen prior to the receipt and expenditure of such grants and monies; and (3) that such items shall be exempt from all provision of RSA:32 relative to limitation and expenditure of town monies, all as provided by RSA 31:95b.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300,000.00 for the construction and original equipping of a Public Works Facility, and said sum to be in addition to any Federal, State or private funds made available therefore and to authorize the issuance of not more than \$300,000.00 of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA Chapter 33) and to authorize the Town officials to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon. ($\frac{2}{3}$ ballot vote required)
6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to erect the proposed Public Works Facility on the Stevens' Property, so called, behind the Police Station and to maintain and develop the current highway garage site as a storage area for road maintenance materials, i.e. salt, cold patch, etc.

7. To see if the Town will vote to establish a committee to be known as the Public Works Facility Building Committee whose purpose will be to perform all tasks necessary to assist the Selectmen in developing building designs, selecting a contractor, and completing the task of building a new Public Works Facility. This Committee shall consist of five (5) members appointed at large, three (3) Selectmen and the Road Agent.

8. In the event that Article 5 fails, will the Town vote to establish a Capital Reserve under the provisions of RSA 35:1 for the purpose of construction and equipping of Public Works Facility and to raise and appropriate the sum of Sixteen Thousand Six Hundred and no/100 Dollars, (\$16,000.00) to be funded from surplus to be placed in this fund.

9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the amount of Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars, (\$5,000.00) for an engineering study of the Bosco Bell Bridge, same being placed in the Bosco Bell Bridge Capital Reserve fund. (Not Recommended)

10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the amount of Eighteen Thousand and no/100 Dollars, (\$18,000.00) for Town Hall Restoration and the same being placed in the Town Hall Restoration Capital Reserve fund.

11. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the amount of Ten Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$10,000.00) for Reconstruction of Town Bridges and the same being placed in the Reconstruction of Town Bridges Capital Reserve fund.

12. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars, (\$5,000.00), toward the purchase of a new Police Cruiser and the same being placed in the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund.

13. To see if the Town of Barnstead will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,746.17 for the Youth Services Bureau's Court Diversion services for first offenders (an effective alternative to the juvenile court system) and other youth oriented programs, i.e. The Challenge Course, the Youth Companion Program and short-term counseling.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

BARNSTEAD POLICE DEPARTMENT

1990 found an increasing demand for police services. In addition to the statistical report which follows, the department played a very important role with the young children of our community, both within and outside the school. Countless hours were volunteered by police officers in an effort to make a difference and protect the safety of our children in their everyday lives. Programs included: Bicycle Safety, Seat Belt Safety, School Bus Safety, Shopping Mall Safety, Emergency Telephone Use, Drug Abuse Resistance Education, Halloween Safety, McGruff, and Captain Smiley.

The concern and supportive cooperation of our school principal, Barbara McKinnon, made these programs possible and a pleasure to perform. The State of New Hampshire found this cooperation between the school and police department an exceptional relationship in awarding the 2nd Annual Gold Circle Partnership Award to each.

Police Officers volunteering their time off duty hours was not limited to our children. Officers spent many hours and several hundred dollars out of their own pockets in an effort to reflect the pride they have in the police station which has made a significant difference in it's operations. The station house has installed a spirit of dedication and professionalism in addition to improved efficiency and safety of department personnel. I would like to thank these officers, Trooper Harry Nedeau, New Hampshire State Police, and Steve Hillsgrove for his enormous contributions.

Complaints were received regarding the absence of a sign indicating the location of the police department. Estimates received indicated a cost of \$2,400.00. I would like to thank my brother-in-law, Raymond Rose of Berkley, Massachusetts, who donated his time, labor, and materials to give the Town of Barnstead a very attractive sign at no cost to the town.

I would also like to thank the citizens and businesses who took an active role in the maintenance and painting of the station. Not only did they donate their time and labor, but in many instances brought materials with them. Too numerous to mention in my allotted space for this report, I will be expressing thanks on an individual basis. It is cooperation and involvement like this which truly brings a community together.

The economic slump is becoming increasingly depressing and with it an increase in crime and social unrest. The importance of community involvement and responsibility for reporting activity of this type is crucial to efforts of your police department to curtail such activity and resolve differences.

The residents of Barnstead are to be commended for their support in 1990. I look forward to your continued support and involvement in 1991.

I would also like to thank the many area police departments, Belknap County Sheriff's Department, and a special thanks to the New Hampshire State Police for their support and assistance during 1990.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

During Calendar Year 1990, the State of New Hampshire experienced an average number of wildfires. The three leading causes of these wildfires were fires kindled without a fire permit from the Forest Fire Warden, permit fires that escaped control and rekindled fires. All of these fires are preventable, but ONLY with your help.

Please help your town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. New Hampshire State Law (RSA 224:27 II) requires that, "No person, firm or corporation shall kindle or cause to be kindled any fire or burn or cause to be burned any material in the open, except when the ground is covered with snow, **without first obtaining a written fire permit from the Forest Fire Warden of the town where the burning is to be done.**"

Violations of RSA 224:27 II and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines up to \$1,000 and/or a year in jail and you are also liable for all fire suppression costs.

The State of New Hampshire, Division of Forests and Lands assisted many towns in wildland fire suppression during 1990, including a 262 acre fire in Moultonboro and several fires in Hooksett.

In 1990, the New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands trained 844 local Wardens and Deputy Wardens in the Incident Command System (ICS), an incident management system for all types of emergencies. In 1991, Wardens will be trained in the use of Class A foam in wildfire suppression.

REPORT OF THE LAND CONSERVATION INVESTMENT PROGRAM COMMITTEE

Beginning in the Spring of 1990 the Committee engaged in discussions with several land owners that stated an interest in the Land Conservation Investment Program (LCIP). The Committee's main concern was to find a location that would be most acceptable to the N.H. Land Conservation Investment Program.

The Committee agreed in October, 1990, that a 179 acre land tract owned by Mr. and Mrs. Norman Harrison seemed to offer the best opportunity of meeting most of the criteria set forth by LCIP.

A Public Hearing was held on October 23, 1990, at 7:00 P.M. in the Town Hall. The consensus of all persons present at that meeting was the Committee should proceed with a formal application to the N.H. Land Conservation Investment Program.

The application was completed and submitted before the due date of November 1, 1990. The Town of Barnstead will be advised in early, 1991, if the application will be accepted and funded.

The Committee would like to acknowledge the efforts of Roberta Jordan, land agent for LCIP, without whose effort this application would not have been possible.

The Committee would like to thank Fred Goodrich for granting a conversation easement on a tract of 138 acres to make it possible to have sufficient land to meet the matching fund requirement.

The Committee would like to thank Mr. and Mrs. Norman Harrison for their contribution of a possible passive recreation area on Suncook Lake.

The above will be accomplished at no cost to the Town of Barnstead.

REPORT OF THE BARNSTEAD PLANNING BOARD

In 1990 the Planning Board formally adopted the Master Plan, Capital Improvement Plan and Transportation Improvement Plan. The Local Water Resources Management and Protection Plan has been determined by the Office of State Planning to be "conditionally consistent". The changes to make the plan fully consistent are scheduled to be completed in March of 1991. The Planning Board is grateful to the large number of people who put in many hundreds of hours to complete these plans which we use as tools to determine the impact the proposals presented to us will have on the Town of Barnstead.

The Board has proposed changes to the Zoning Ordinance (including adoption of a Commercial District Sign Ordinance) and changes to the Building Regulations including adoption of the Council of American Building Officials One and Two Family Dwelling Code. A booklet containing the questions, the reasons for them, and a sample ballot will be distributed to every household in town by the end of February.

The Board has completed development of Excavation Regulations required by RSA 15:E and will be holding public hearings in the spring prior to adopting the Regulations.

The Board has also proposed substantial changes to the Subdivision Regulations and will hold a public hearing on them in February.

During the coming year the Capital Improvements and Transportation Improvement Committees will re-convene to update the plans for 1992-1997 for use by the Budget Committee, Selectmen, and School Board during next year's budget deliberations.

The Master Plan Committee will also re-convene to audit the performance of the Planning Board in following the Master Plan.

There has been NO liability exposure for the community or our service, as we DO ABIDE by the federal, state, and local regulations and guidelines. COST.....Through accepting Medicare assignment ALONE, we have saved Barnstead Residents over \$10,000.00 (Ten Thousand Dollars) in out-of-pocket expenses.

LAKES REGION COMMUNITY HEALTH AGENCY

SUMMARY OF SERVICES 1989-90

The fiscal year of this Agency is July 1-June 30. This report will reflect this Agency's activities in Barnstead from July 1, 1989-June 30, 1990.

There have been 37 Barnstead residents seen by this Agency. There have been an average of 11-12 per month. The following visits have been made:

The costs for services are calculated through Medicare cost reporting methodology. The skilled services, such as nursing, physical therapy, home health aide, occupational therapy, and speech therapy are eligible for third party payment (i.e., Medicare, Medicaid, private insurance). These payors reimburse only for skilled services provided during an acute illness. When a person enters the chronic phase of a long term illness the third party payors, with the exception of Medicaid, no longer pay. Medicaid will continue to pay in certain circumstances when the patient is homebound.

The Homemaker Program is funded partially by a Federal Social Services Block Grant; Older Americans Act funds; client contribution; town "match". **Both grants require strong community financial support.** To be eligible to receive services from this program individuals must meet mandated lower income guideline requirements. Those people requiring services that are not covered by a third party payor are asked to pay for services on a sliding scale based on their ability to pay.

The Early Intervention Program provides services to families with a special needs child. The services are coordinated through the Lakes Region Community Services Council as the funding source. There have been two families in Barnstead who have received services through this program during this year.

The Agency has sponsored, with funds from the Developmental Disabilities Council, an integrated playgroup for Barnstead families with young, preschool children. This is provided during the school year. It has been quite successful, after a slow start. The grant will terminate in early December.

TOWN SHED STUDY COMMITTEE

Our Committee was charged with reviewing the needs of our Highway Department with regards to improvements to the Town Shed.

The Committee began by determining that the following needed to be addressed: 1) What were the problems with the existing facility; 2) What changes or improvement were needed; and 3) How could these changes and improvements most effectively be made.

We quickly ascertained that the major problems at the existing facility were lack of water and sewage and inadequate housing for Town owned highway equipment.

It was agreed that a larger facility with water and sewage would be what was needed. In order to accomplish this, the Committee discussed adding on to the existing Town Shed and the feasibility of constructing a new facility.

With the assistance of Committee members, two companies were contacted and asked for guidance. Both Murray Construction, Inc. of Portland, ME, and Pro-Con, Inc. of Hooksett, NH, offered to serve as consultants at no cost to the Town, and we, as a Committee, are very grateful for the information and documentation they provided.

After much discussion a conceptual facility design, which we feel meets the current needs of the Town and would continue to meet these needs well into the future, was decided upon.

We then contemplated where this facility should be erected--on the existing site or at another location. A list of all Town-owned property was reviewed and our choices were quickly narrowed to two sites: 1) The existing site on Beauty Hill Rd.; and 2) The Stevens' Property, so-called, on Rte. 126.

The Committee determined that the existing Town shed could not be feasibly added on to nor was there sufficient room to accommodate an expanded facility and still have sufficient area for the necessary outside storage of sand, salt, etc. The Stevens' Property offered us adequate room but raised some environmental questions about the outside storage of materials.

This issue was studied and discussed at great length and the consensus of the Committee was that we could have the best of both at the most economical cost by building a new facility on the Steven's Property and continuing to use the Beauty Hill Rd. site for the outside storage of stockpiled materials.

The results of the Committee's work are the five articles which appear in the Warrant for a bond issue to continue and complete this project.
