#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Campton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Campton on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the ensuing year for the maintenance of its highways and bridges and make appropriation of the same.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Memorial Day.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the White Mountain Region Association.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for Campton Cemetery, also to clean up and fence other cemeteries in Town.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$975.00 to reimburse the Campton Village Precinct for rent of use of hydrants in Campton Village.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control.

- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital.
- 11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Campton Volunteer Fire Dept.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to install a drainage system in the Main Street of Campton Village under State supervision. The State to pay the balance of the cost.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Livermore Bridge.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from the Winter Brook road to the William Guay back field.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of agents and officers heretofore chosen.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

The following is a report of activities conducted for the town of Campton, by the N. H. Department of Health, Bureau Public Health Nursing, for the year 1957.

Salk vaccine clinics for the protection against poliomyelitis were held on February 14, 1957 in Campton, in March and May in Plymouth when the Campton children attended. A total attendance of Campton children at these clinics was 275.

A series of three Triple Toxoid Clinics (for protection against Diphtheria, Tetanus and Whooping Cough) was held at the Campton Church Vestry in March, April and May. The total attendance at these clinics was 132.

## FOREST FIRE PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem — 97 per cent of all our forest fires being man-caused and preventable — a serious indictment of interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens and deputy wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Careless and perverseness, however, continue to be the big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles, by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning of debris during hazardous periods in dangerous locations; illegal burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires — all result in serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughtful and cooperative effort — The rules are simple.

- 1. Don't burn at home use your town dump and avoid all fire problems.
- 2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fire places and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.

- 3. Be sure that all lighted material cigars, cigarettes and matches are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles.
- 4. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
- 5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
- 6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

REMEMBER — the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn YOUR property.

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Campton, New Hampshire qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said district on the sixth day of March, 1958, at eight o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the district will vote to install a telephone in one or more of the six (6) school houses in said district at a cost of \$110.80 per phone for installation and a year's service.

- 10. To see if the district will vote to employ a Helping Teacher as part of Supervisory Union No. 48 in accordance with New Hampshire School Laws, Chap. 186, Section 24; and to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed five hundred (\$500.00) dollars for Campton's share.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to elect at this meeting a special committee consisting of two members of the School Board, one member of the Board of Selectmen, and four other voters of the Campton School District to study the advisability of constructing a central elementary school to replace the existing schools; to recommend a suitable site or sites and to acquire an option or options thereon, to select an architect for preliminary studies; to have sketches drawn of such proposed building; to report back to an adjourned meeting making such recommendations with respect to the above matters as the committee may determine; and to see if the district will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed five hundred dollars for the use of the committee in meeting its expenses and for the purchase of an option or options.
- 12. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one hundred and five thousand dollars (\$105,000.00) for the construction of a central elementary school, including the cost of site and preparation thereof, architect's fees, and furniture, furnishings and equipment, and in order to provide such funds, to authorize the School Board to borrow the amount voted and to issue serial notes or bonds in the name and on the credit of the district, and to fix the time and place of payment, rate of interest, terms, maturities, and provide for the sale thereof, all in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, known as the "Municipal Finance Act," and any amendments applicable thereto." (Requires two-thirds vote by ballot).
- 13. If the district votes to construct a central elementary school, to see if the district will elect a building committee consisting of five voters of the Campton School District authorized to select a site for the construction of a central elementary school, and to assist

the school board in the planning and construction of such school, provided that the selection of the site for the new school and plans and specifications therefor shall finally be approved by the school board acting alone as required by law, and to formally authorize the school board to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary in connection with the construction and equipping of such school.

- 14. To see if the district will vote to build and equip (2) two two-room schools, at suitable sites; one on each side of the Pemigewasset River in the south part of town.
- 15. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum, not exceeding fifty-one thousand (\$51,000.00) dollars and to carry out any vote taken under Article 14, and authorize the School Board to borrow the amount voted and to issue serial notes or bonds in the name and on the credit of the district; and to fix the time and place of payment, rate of interest, terms and maturities, and provide for the sale thereof, all in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chap. 33; known as the Municipal Finance Act and any amendments applicable thereto.
- 16. To see if the district will vote to build and equip a four room school at a suitable site in the south part of the town to centralize the now existing four one-room schools.
- 17. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding forty-nine thousand (\$49,000.00) dollars to carry out any vote taken under Article 16, and authorize the School Board to borrow the amount voted and to issue serial notes or bonds in the name and on the credit of the district, and to fix the time and place of payment, rate of interest, terms and maturities, and provide for the sale thereof, all in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chap. 33, known as the Municipal Finance Act and any amendments applicable thereto.

- 18. To see if the district will vote to elect or appoint an advisory committee consisting of four voters of the Campton School District to assist the School Board in carrying out any vote which may be taken under either Article 14 or 16.
- 19. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding twenty thousand (\$20,000.00) dollars for the purpose of installing running water, modern plumbing and heating in the present four one-room school buildings and provide for necessary structural changes and adequate insulation.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT TO THE CAMPTON SCHOOL BOARD

Hereby submitted is my annual report as your superintendent of schools:

The educational situation in Campton has changed very little since my last report with the exception of staff changes. Mrs. Craig, who was at Blair School, transferred to Centre School as teacher of Grades 5-8. Miss Elmira Baston, a 1957 graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, assumed the position as teacher at Blair School. We were fortunate in obtaining Mrs. Leona Edgell, who had been teaching in Lincoln and Mrs. Marjorie Uhlman, who had been teaching in Woodstock to assume the duties at Beebe River School. I consider all of your teachers to be of high caliber.

As has always been the case, Campton is still generous with supplies and equipment. There are not many things that the schools actually need that they do not have except proper housing facilities in some instances. About the only curriculum area where there is a weakness in my opinion is science and I hope that this will be corrected by next year with the introduction of a correlated science series for all grades.

At this time I know there are several proposals to be introduced at your School District Meeting concerning further housing facilities and needs in Campton. My best professional advice to you would be to first consider if at all possible your proposed eightroom plan. If this, you feel, is impossible, I would next recommend a four-room unit somewhere on a selected site in the southern section of the town to take care of your four one-room schools. In my opinion the other proposals are not educationally wise. It would cost quite a good deal to build a two-room building in the southern part of town on each side of the river and very little would be gained in improving the education of your children. Further, as much as I hate to see oneroom schools without proper sanitary facilities, I feel the expenditure to put water and heat in these buildings is a poor investment.

Undoubtedly you are interested in the article in your school warrant regarding a Helping teacher. Several years ago the New Hampshire Legislature made it legal for some New Hampshire school districts to secure the services of a Helping Teacher. It was agreed that if such an individual of whom the school districts approved were employed, the state would pay \$2500 toward the salary of this person. The remainder of the salary would be prorated among the several towns in the Supervisory Union on the same basis as other union expenses. Supervisory Union No. 48 has now become eligible for this service if it is desired. The law relating to this matter states that certain designated unions may employ a Helping Teacher socalled in accordance with Chapter 186, Section 24 of the New Hampshire School Laws when the majority of districts in said union vote for it in their annual meeting and towns so voting include at least 85% of the pupils in said union. If this article is voted in the affirmative, it merely gives the Supervisory Union Board power to act and money to act with if they desire and the district approves. The definition of a Helping Teacher is as follows: Helping Teacher, as referred to in paragraph XXIII, is defined as a teacher with specific training and experience which will enable her, or him, to give helpful service, counsel, and assistance to teachers, pupils, and parents of a school system as a constructive means of improving the educational growth and development of children, solving pupil problems of retardation and maladjustment, adopting the program of studies to meet the needs of the children and the community, bringing resources outside of the school to classroom teachers, pupils, parents, and community, and in general acting as consultant to the entire staff and community in recognition of the educational needs.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the school board and the teachers for their cooperation during the past year.

# EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent as per the following quotation:

"REPORTS. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report showing the total salary paid to the superintendent, which report shall show in detail the amount derived from the per capita tax and the amount paid directly by each school district in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union No. 48 during 1956-1957 received a salary of \$6150 which was made up as follows: \$2500 paid from the per capita tax and \$3650 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$900 for travel within the union was also prorated as stated above.

The table below shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.

Superintendent's salary for 1956-1957 based on the above figure is reconciled as follows: \$3650 paid by the various districts, plus \$2500 received from State per capita tax, equals \$6150 superintendent's basic salary. This, plus \$900 travel allowance as indicated above totals \$7050 — amount received from State Treasurer for salary and travel of the Superintendent of Schools.

Therefore 178 plus 3 days (convention and institute) equals 181 school days. One day may be lost because of storms or other factors before any time has to be made up.

#### REPORT OF MUSIC SUPERVISOR

The music program is progressing well and at this writing we are anticipating the addition of two new record players and new records.

Most of the children have made great improvement in singing and rhythmic activities and seem to be developing a finer appreciation of good music. We have learned folk and art songs and songs for special days such as patriotic holidays, Thanksgiving, Christmas, etc. Rhythm instruments have been used in all grades with songs and recorded music. Lower grade children are developing a better sense of rhythm through marching, skipping, running, etc., and through singing games. Upper grades have learned a number of folk dances including some American square dances.

Center School has new music books and additional copies of existing texts were purchased for several other classrooms. We are grateful to the Board of Education and the Parent-Teacher Association for their help in obtaining better equipment.
