Center Harbor Town Meeting

March 9, 1971

The Town Meeting was called to order by the Moderator L. Keith Matheson. A motion was made by Lyndol Pocock and seconded by Beatrice Obert to restrict the voting to Article 1 relating to choosing all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. The balloting started immediately and the results follows:

Selectman for three years:

John J. Bankosh, Jr.	had 73 votes
Aaron C. Smith	had 67 votes

John P. Merrill	had 134 votes

Ronald Addison	had 1 vote

Library Trustee for 3 years:

E. Lucile Matheson	had 131 votes
Charleen Bartlett	had 1 vote

“Are you in favor of the adoption of the amendment to the existing Town Zoning Ordinance, covering mobile homes, mobile home parks, camping areas, as proposed by the planning board?” 99 voted yes— 34 voted no. On motion of Lyndol Pocock and seconded by Aaron Smith the voting ceased at 7:00 P.M. and the ballots counted with the above results.

A delicious supper was served to the Town Officers by the P.T.A. under the direction of Beverly Pocock and Patricia Murphy.

At 7:15 P.M. the meeting reconvened in the Fire Station area of the

Municipal Building. The remaining articles in the Town Warrant was read by the Moderator and the meeting declared open for voting.

ARTICLE 2 — On motion of Aaron Smith and seconded by David Royea the town voted to raise the sum of \$31,015.00 to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 3 — On motion of Lyndol Pocock and seconded by W. Irving Brown it was voted to raise the sum of \$22,450.00 for the Highway Department.

ARTICLE 4 — On motion of Eugene Manville and seconded by Dennis Parshley it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,400.00 for maintenance of the Center Harbor Fire Department. This sum to be expended by the Volunteer Firemen's Association, Inc. for maintenance and operation of the department.

ARTICLE 5 — A motion was made by Aaron Smith and seconded by Lyndol Pocock to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for Welfare and Town Poor. An amendment was made by W. Irving Brown to include the sum of \$600.00 for aid to the Lakes Region General Hospital and seconded by Lester Swinerton. After some discussion the amendment was voted on. The vote was 31 yes and 33 no and the amendment was defeated. The original motion was then voted in the affirmative.

ARTICLE 6 — On motion of Lyndol Pocock and seconded by Aaron Smith it was voted to raise the sum of \$2,500.00 for parks, playgrounds, band concerts and hiring a qualified life guard at the Town Beach, also care and maintenance of the Wharf Area and Fountain.

ARTICLE 7 — On motion of Aaron Smith and seconded by Lewis Hanson it was voted to raise the sum of \$350.59 for Class V Roads. The State to contribute \$2,337.24.

ARTICLE 8 — On motion of Lyndol Pocock and seconded by Aaron Smith, it was voted to raise the sum of \$100.00 for aid to the Family Service Association.

ARTICLE 9 — On motion of Lyndol Pocock and seconded by Clifford Le Roy, it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$132.36 to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town.

ARTICLE 10 — On motion of Lyndol Pocock and seconded by W. Irving Brown, it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Civil Defense.

ARTICLE 11 — On motion of Gladys Bickford and seconded by Dorothy Gannett, the Town voted to allow 2 per-cent discount on taxes paid

in full within 15 days after the issue of tax bills by the Collector.

ARTICLE 12 — On motion of Aaron Smith and seconded by Richard Caldwell it was voted to accept a parcel of land from Edward Dane adjacent to the Center Harbor Memorial Park to be reserved for enlargement and other related use of the Park.

ARTICLE 13 — On motion of Aaron Smith and seconded by Marie Burke, the Town voted to require that only phosphate free laundry detergents be offered for sale in the Town after June 1, 1971, provided that other Towns bordering on Lakes Winnepesaukee, Squam and Waukegan restrict in like manner.

ARTICLE 14 — On motion of Lewis Hanson and seconded by Lyndol Pocock, it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for furnishings for the Selectmen's Office, Town Clerk's Office, Police Department Office, The Cary Mead Public Meeting Room and the Firemen's Meeting Room; this money to be used in conjunction with existing funds and a \$5,000.00 donation offered by Mrs. Mead for this purpose.

ARTICLE 15 — A motion was made by Phillip Bartlett and seconded by Martha Le Roy, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,700.00 toward construction and maintenance of the Center Harbor Memorial Park. It was so voted.

ARTICLE 16 — On motion of Sally Chase and seconded by Martha Le Roy, it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the construction and maintenance of a pavillion shelter at the Town Beach.

ARTICLE 17 — On motion of Lewis Hanson and seconded by Martha Le Roy, it was voted to raise the sum of \$20.00 to enroll the Center Harbor Conservation Commission as a member of the N. H. Association of The Conservation Commission.

ARTICLE 18 — A motion was made by John Merrill and seconded by Dennis Parshley, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$28,000.00 for the purchase of a new fire truck, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed this amount in the name of the Town for this purpose and to execute and issue evidence of such indebtedness, notes or bonds of the Town of Center Harbor. The need for this truck was explained by John Merrill the present truck having been in use for twenty years. There was a great deal of discussion on this article. A motion was made by Gladys Bickford and seconded by Dennis Parshley to stop the debate and vote on the article. The check list was used and the vote was by paper ballot. Of the 72 votes cast 59 voted yes and 13 voted no, and the motion was carried.

ARTICLE 19 — On motion of Lewis Woodaman and seconded by Herbert Martin, it was voted to authorize the Fire Chief to appoint a

committee of firemen to negotiate for the purchase of a new fire truck, the sum not to exceed \$28,000.00.

ARTICLE 20 — On motion of Dennis Parshley and seconded by Lewis Woodaman, it was voted to authorize the Fire Chief to sell the 1953 Dodge fire truck and pump, the amount received to be used for the purchase of new equipment for the fire department.

ARTICLE 21 — On motion of Mary Macgreggor and seconded by Dr. Royal Frye it was voted to appropriate the sum of \$628.00 for studies and operation of the Lakes Region Planning Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds.

ARTICLE 22 — On motion of Lewis Hanson and seconded by Lyndol Pocock, it was voted to raise the sum of \$75.00 for the Humane Society.

ARTICLE 23 — On motion of Dennis Parshley and seconded by Herbert Martin, the Town voted to raise the sum of \$2,400.00 for the purchase of a 15 Kilowatt generator for the Fire Station and Municipal Building.

ARTICLE 24 — On motion of Lyndol Pocock and seconded by Orion Bickford, it was voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by the Tax Collector's Deed.

ARTICLE 25 — A motion was made by Aaron Smith and seconded by Lyndol Pocock to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,650.00 for ambulance service to the Town. After much discussion by a Forest Park representative and Mr. Crumb, an amendment was made by James Hughes and seconded by Minnie Nichols to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 for this service and award the contract to Mr. Donald Crumb who stated there would be no extra charge to the residents of Center Harbor for ambulance service. This motion was voted in the affirmative and the contract awarded to Mr. Crumb.

ARTICLE 26 — On motion of Lyndol Pocock and seconded by Aaron Smith it was voted to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of Taxes.

ARTICLE 27 — No action was taken on this article.

ARTICLE 28 — As there was no other business to come before the meeting on motion of Martha Le Roy the meeting was adjourned at 10:25 P.M.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of town highways and bridges including town sidewalks.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,200.00 for the maintenance of the Centre Harbor Fire Department and authorize the Centre Harbor Volunteer Firemen's Association to expend said sum for the operation and maintenance of the Centre Harbor Fire Department.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for Welfare and Town Poor.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,400.00 for Parks and Playgrounds including Band Concerts, hiring of a Life Guard at the Winnepesaukee Town Beach, care and maintenance of Wharf and Beach Area, Fountain, and Holiday Celebrations.
7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Assistance for Class V Roads and, if so, to raise the sum of \$305.81. (The State will contribute the sum of \$2,038.77 provided this article is voted in the affirmative.)
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of Child and Family Services of New Hampshire. (By Request)
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$133.22 for the support of The Lakes Region Association. (By Request)

10. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2 per-cent on taxes paid in full within 15 days of issue of the tax bills by the Collector.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the improvement, care and maintenance of the Centre Harbor Memorial Park Cemetery.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$628.00 for support of the Lakes Region Planning Commission. (By Request)
13. To see if the Town will authorize the expenditure of a sum not to exceed \$200.00 for defraying expenses of commemorating the 175th Anniversary of the Town's Charter and, if so, to raise and appropriate said sum.
14. To see if the Town will vote to designate the following Class V roads as "Scenic Roads" in accordance with N.H.RSA 253:17 and 18:
 - Old Meredith Road - From Main St. to Meredith Town Line
 - Follett Road - From 25-B to Meredith Town Line
 - Center Harbor Neck Road
 - Waukegan Road - From Rt 3 to New Hampton Line(By Request)
15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 as support for the New Hampshire Humane Society. (By Request)
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to furnish Ambulance Service to the Town.
17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 as a contribution to support the Lakes Region General Hospital. (By request)
18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$3,000.00 to provide a replacement boiler for the Nichols Memorial Library.
19. To see if the Town will vote to approve an ordinance regulating the use of Town Beaches and Docks and, if so, authorize the Selectmen to enact and enforce said ordinance and stipulate appropriate penalties for violations thereof. (By Request)
20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.
21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation to Taxes.
22. To choose agents or committees in relation to any article of the

warrant and hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Short History Of The Nichols Memorial Library

Center Harbor, New Hampshire

Mr. James E. Nichols was born in Center Harbor on April 25, 1845. His parents Robert Nichols and Jane Nichols came to Center Harbor around 1840 and lived on what was then known as the Nichols Farm. I believe that the Malm's now own the farm. The Nichols family lived on the farm until 1870 when they sold the farm and purchased a home in Meredith. Three children were born to this couple Sarah Jane, George Franklin and James Edwin.

James Nichols spent his boyhood on the farm and attended school in Center Harbor, one report stated that he worked hard during his boyhood and at one time at least he worked picking up potatoes for about ten cents a day. He went to Boston when about 18 years of age and was employed as a clerk by Jordan Marsh.

In 1868 he went to New York as agent and representative of the Sawyer and Franklin Woolen Mills. In 1878 with others he organized the firm of Austin, Nichols and Company, wholesale grocers, and continued as a senior partner until 1909 when he retired. Their firm was the largest of its kind in the world and for many years outfitted nearly every polar and exploring expeditions from this country with proper food supplies. Some of these expeditions included the Perry, Greely, Fiala and Roosevelt expeditions. He was very fond of horses and owned a number of saddle and trotting horses.

In 1909 there was much talk of erecting a Library Building, nearly \$500.00 had been subscribed for this purpose and a probable gift of land. Plans had been obtained from architects and a building committee appointed. Mr. Nichols heard of this plan and offered to present the Library to the Town of Center Harbor as a memorial to his father and mother. The Library to be named "The Nichols Memorial Library".

The Library was completed and dedicated on June 18, 1910. It is interesting to note that Lavinia Lovett Dole now living in Campton, and Mina Towle Berry of Moultonboro, took part in the dedication, Lavinia presenting a framed picture of the Center Harbor schools and Mina presenting a bouquet of roses. The Center Harbor Band escorted the school children to the dedication.

In 1878 he married Elizabeth Greggs of New York and they made many trips to Europe. Mr. Nichols died of a heart attack while in Austria in 1914. There was some difficulty in bringing his body back to New York because of the war.

Besides the bequests to the library, he also bequeathed \$5000.00 to the

Center Harbor Congregational Church and a like amount to three churches in Meredith. The sum of \$5000.00 was also bequeathed to the Laconia Hospital to be used toward building the Nurses Home.

On September 8, 1915 his widow Mrs. Elizabeth Nichols was murdered in her New York apartment for her jewels. Newspaper reports stated that she spent her money lavishly on jewels. The jewels stolen from her person were valued at approximately \$10,000.00. However, in a safe deposit box were jewels valued at nearly half a million dollars. Most of the servants were away at the time of the murder and only a maid and house boy were there at the time. These servants said that three masked men entered the back door, bound and gagged them and proceeded to their mistress room. They freed themselves and found Mrs. Nichols body on the floor of the library stripped of her jewels. In 1916 the houseboy was charged with the murder after he confessed to having played a part in the crime by leaving the back door open. He was sentenced to death but the sentence was commuted to life imprisonment when the actual murderer was arrested.

We have approximately seven thousand books in the library and our circulation for 1971 was 10,848. We have had a great many books presented to our library which are greatly appreciated. Seven memorial books have been given in memory of Mr. Wilbur Dearborn and two in memory of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Blackey. The winter library hours are Monday 7-9 p.m.,- Wednesday 2-5 and 7-9 p.m. Saturday 10-12 and 2-5 p.m. Summer hours Monday 2-5 and 7-9 p.m. Wednesday 2-5 and 7-9 p.m. Friday 2-5 and 7-9 p.m.

Report of the Planning Board

Town of Centre Harbor

Members:

In 1971 several changes took place in the membership of Centre Harbor's seven-man Planning Board. Philip Bartlett's term expired, and his reappointment was requested and made. Colonel Lewis C. Hanson became the Selectman member of the Board, replacing Mr. Aaron Smith. On August 29, Mr. Lewis E. Woodaman tendered his resignation due to the new demands on his time made by his enrollment in graduate courses at Dartmouth College. Mr. Wilson N. Earl was appointed by the Selectmen in his stead.

Since September, 1971, Board membership has been: as shown on page 4.

Meetings..

The Board met 26 times during 1971, or approximately every other week. In February, two hearings were held relative to amendment of the Town's Zoning Ordinance (See "Zoning.") About ten meetings were devoted to work on the Town's Long-Range Comprehensive Plan. Planning consultants attended eight of these meetings, and a representative from the State Planning Office four. Many townspeople attended the meetings at which the Planning Consultant discussed a plan for the Town Center. The Chairman of the Meredith Planning Board, Mr. Harry Page, was the guest at one meeting. Mr. David Scott, Executive Director of the Lakes Region Planning Commission, spoke to a joint meeting of the Centre Harbor Selectmen and the Planning Board and other interested citizens.

1971 Activities:

The major activities of the Board during 1971 consisted of work on the Long-Range Comprehensive Plan, an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance, and consideration of subdivisions. These are covered below in detail under their respective headings.

The Board cooperated with the Lakes Region Planning Commission. Meetings of the Lakes Region Clean Water Association and several state-sponsored conferences in Concord were also attended by Board members. Periodicals and reports on Planning from various agencies and organizations were received and studied. The Board commenced a study leading to the designation of certain Town roads as "scenic."

Comprehensive Planning:

The Board continued work begun in 1970 on the Long-Range Com-

prehensive Plan (701) with Community Planning Services, of Boston, Massachusetts, a division of Alonzo B. Reed, Inc., planning consultants. Messrs. John Atwood and David Wluka represented C.P.S. and presented a series of twelve reports (seven at meetings in 1971 and five in 1970—see “Report of the Planning Board” in the 1970 Town Report). There were long hours of study, discussion, and review by the Board and also interested townspeople. Mr. Robert L. Ward, from the State Planning Office, attended four of these meetings and contributed valuable suggestions. In early July the planning consultants submitted to the Town their 92-page report, “Centre Harbor Comprehensive Plan.” Also submitted was a 51-page “Proposed Zoning Ordinance.”

The Board was disappointed in the final result because of the general nature of the reports, the duplication of information already available elsewhere, the lack of factual data, and many minor errors, but voted to accept it in principle, reserving the right to implement it in ways that seemed best for the Town. Copies of the Plan are available in the office of the Town Clerk. Parts of it will undoubtedly be of valuable assistance to the Town in the future.

Also submitted was a 21-page “Initial Housing Element, Centre Harbor, N. H.” Compiled by Mr. William F. Malcolm of the Environmental Consulting Group, Inc., Hanover, New Hampshire. It was accepted by the Board on June 28. Copies are also available at the Town Clerk’s office.

The major advantage of the “701” Plan, in addition to the fact that it provides a basis or point of departure for future planning, is that it fulfills a federal requirement for the Town to be able to get allocation of federal funds for public works projects.

Zoning:

In January, 1970, the Board proposed an amendment to the Town’s Zoning Ordinance which would regulate the use of mobile homes and set standards for the operation of mobile home parks, camps, and camping areas. The amendment was essentially the same, but not as restrictive, as an ordinance enacted earlier in the neighboring town of Centre Sandwich. Two public hearings were held in February (1st and 19th), and it was approved by the voters on March ninth.

The Board spent the last seven meetings in 1971 working on a Zoning Map for Centre Harbor and a new amendment which would implement this map. After two public hearings, this will be presented for Town vote in 1972. As presently mapped, some 80 per-cent of the Town area would be zoned Agricultural and Rural, 10 per-cent Commercial-Industrial, and 10 per-cent Residential. If it is passed, the Town will have a practically complete Zoning Ordinance, giving the residents control over future development.

Subdivision:

Several subdivisions and transfers of property were approved by

waiver, as they did not involve extension of roads, installation of public utilities, or construction. No major subdivisions were requested during the year.

Planning in 1972

Despite some progress, many problems remain to be solved in the years ahead. Some of them are: better regulation of existing recreation facilities, and the addition of new recreation areas for town use; concrete start on the acquisition of land for parks and open space; improvement of the condition of town roads; replacement of shade trees lost because of Dutch elm disease and salt; and better landscaping along town streets. A capital improvement program to cover the cost of solving these problems is something the voters should be immediately concerned with. Chapter 8 of the Town's Comprehensive Plan presents a good detailed analysis of these problems and fiscal measures for their solution.

Despite increased demands on everyone's time, activity of the Planning Board has been greater this year than in any prior year. For this reason, the high level of attendance at meetings is especially appreciated. The loss of Mr. Lewis E. Woodaman, who served nine years, will be very keenly felt. His long experience and broad participation in Town affairs have been of inestimable value. He rarely ever missed a meeting except when he was ill. All members of the Board, and the Town, are in his debt.

As in former years, the Board continues to meet alternate Sunday evenings at 7:30 P.M. in the Municipal Building. All residents are again invited to attend the meetings, and participate freely.

Report of the Fire Department

During 1971 we answered 56 calls for assistance. Forty-one of these were fire calls and fifteen were rescue calls. These calls involved approximately 626 man-hours. Additionally we have answered a few special service calls. Our training program has had in excess of 700 man-hours of participation in addition to regular meetings and time spent in maintaining equipment, flooding skating rink or watering lawns etc.

One of the highlights for the fire service this year was the start of operation of the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Association's Central Dispatch Center. This center is located in the Belknap County Court House in Laconia. It is manned 24 hours a day to answer your calls and dispatch fire and rescue equipment for all towns in our mutual aid system. If you need fire or rescue equipment the number to call is 524-1545. This center is recognized as a highly efficient method of handling emergency calls and has resulted in a lower fire insurance premium rate for about 130 property owners in Center harbor, effective January 1, 1972.

We have placed the order for the new fire truck, which was authorized at the 1971 Town Meeting, with Farrar Company of Woodville, Mass. Delivery is expected in the summer of 1972. Farrar Company has built our last two previous trucks and was low bidder among nine bids received this time. The Dodge truck and navy pump were sold, as authorized at the 1971 Town Meeting. The pump was sold to the Winnepesaukee Steamship Company and the truck to David Royea.

The generator for the Fire Station and Municipal Building was installed early last summer and has already operated a few times during power outages.

Please remember the new number to call is 524-1545. If you have the old number posted by your phone please take time now to change it. We have stickers available to put on your phone or use the back page of the Town Report to post near your phone. This page also contains other emergency numbers you may need quickly sometime.

If you need fire equipment, or think you need it, don't delay in calling for it. Prevention is still the best cure. Every fire prevented can be considered a 100 per-cent save.

Report of the Forest Fire Warden and District Chief

Lest We Forget - It Can Happen Here

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar-holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947 nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand — a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.

2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.

3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them dead out when leaving.

4. Most important — instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year - 1971 - was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.
