

# TOWN WARRANT

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## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

**To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:**

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing and for election of Delegates at Large, Alternate Delegates at Large, and Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the National Convention.

(No recommendation necessary)

2. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

(No recommendation necessary)

3. To vote on the question, "Shall Sweepstake Tickets be sold in this Town?"

(No recommendation necessary)

4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

(Recommend favorable action)

5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500 for the Town History Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend favorable action)

6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one hundred dollars) \$100 for the Fire Hose Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend favorable action)

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (fifteen hundred dollars) \$1,500 for the Fire Truck Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend favorable action)



8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to order a Fire Truck to be paid for at the time of delivery in 1965 by appropriating the amount of principal and interest in the Fire Truck and Fire Hose Reserve Funds, and the borrowing of an additional sum of money not to exceed (nine thousand dollars) \$9,000, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend favorable action)

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (four hundred dollars) \$400 for Old Home Day, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend favorable action)

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (three hundred and ninety-two dollars and ten cents) \$392.10 for the Monadnock Region Association, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend \$200 be raised and appropriated)

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one hundred dollars) \$100 for White Pine Blister Rust Control, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend favorable action)

12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (two thousand dollars) \$2,000 to construct an underground drainage system with catch basins on Wilder Road, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend unfavorable action)

13. To see if the Town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, the following Town Roads, or take any other action relating thereto:

The Depot Road from its intersection with the old road connecting to Longview Road northerly to the Old Antrim Road.

The old road to Nelson from the Old Jaquith Place to the Town Line.

The Brimstone Corner Road and the Old Antrim Road between the Mulhall residence and the Clingham Place, and the road from Brimstone Corner northerly to the Town Line.

(Recommend favorable action)

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (two hundred and fifty dollars) \$250 for the purpose of paying approximately one half the estimated cost of re-

decorating the interior of the two front rooms of the Town Library, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend favorable action)

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (seven hundred dollars) \$700 to install a fire door and necessary steps and platform on the northeast side of the Town Hall as requested by the Fire Marshall, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend appropriation be increased to provide cover for platform and steps)

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any other action relating thereto.

(No recommendation necessary)

17. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 1% on property taxes if paid within 30 days after date of bill, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend favorable action)

18. To see if the Town will accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend favorable action)

19. To hear the reports of auditors and committees heretofore chosen, or take any other action relating thereto.

(No recommendation necessary)

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

(No recommendation necessary)

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience—a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help.

1. Always have permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump — it's safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Lets all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

**LIBRARY TRUSTEES' REPORT, 1963**

During the year we regretfully accepted three resignations from staff, all because of ill health:—Mrs. Ruth Johnson, Librarian; Mrs. Ethel Richardson, Childrens' Librarian; Mr. Daniel Devens, Building Supt. Mrs. Dorothy Churchill served as volunteer Librarian until Miss Elsie Frank had been appointed to the position. Mrs. Harriet Hampson has been very effectively working as a volunteer in the Childrens' Room. Building maintenance has been let to Mr. John Snedeker on a service contract basis.

Over the past several months Miss Frank has proven an interested and capably efficient Librarian. Her enrollment in the ten weeks Librarian Training Course at Monadnock Community College has given the Library the benefit of added technical experience.

In spite of the losses resulting from the retirements of experienced staff members the circulation and use record for the year has shown an increase of 16% over 1962.

Encouraged by representatives of the State Library we have continued our policy of removing from shelves outdated books and books inactive for ten year periods. Replacements are being made with modern works as our budget permits. The Trustees, Librarian and all users of the Library are greatly indebted to a group of volunteers for past and continuing assistance in this work.

We thank those who have presented books to the Library and especially Mrs. Arthur Chickering for her generous gift of \$100. for purchase of childrens' books as a memorial to Mr. George K. Babbitt.

The Suggestion Box has already yielded some good ideas. We urge all who use the Library to add their ideas for its improvement.

## HANCOCK HISTORY

For the benefit of readers decades hence it is customary to identify the year by mentioning events of wide significance. On November 22nd President Kennedy was shot and killed in Dallas, Texas. The great flag of the Town flew at half mast. Like people everywhere in our country, and to some extent abroad by Telstar satellite, those in Hancock who could were glued to their TV screen, particularly during the funeral procession.

Stunned shock and apprehension gave way to renewed confidence as President Johnson created this confidence as he took over in the White House. High national prosperity continued unabated.

Hancock has benefited from this series of prosperous years and looks better and better, more typically a fine old New England village as Les or Mildred Phelps might say. John Stanley King of Manchester bought the Inn and created something new in the way of atmosphere on our Main Street. Outside there is little change except to freshen things up; inside an old New England decor is a back drop for modern sophistication. Hancock people approve and wish Enoch and Mary Lou Fuller, Jr., the managers, well feeling they have already in a short month or so done something for our Town.

Although we have been successfully making the transition from cow-dotted pastures to a sub-suburban residential Town we still have rural thoughts. Maybe it is only the Evas who still boil sap and a few like John Haas who keep cows but many like to wander along the old woods roads, in winter on snowshoes. We're happy when Willis Johnson repairs our band stand, a symbol of the bygone age his wife Ruth researches. Incidentally he and others put chains between the posts down at the cemetery. We like to see steeplejacks brightening the Meeting House spire. We're unhappy when the snow collapses the Cragin's barn roof right on our main street or when a quirk of weather causes many a roof to leak from ice building up on the edges.

We live close to weather and, I guess, like it. On February 8th, Millard Somes reminds us, biting -10 degree winds tested our fortitude. On Nubanusit for the first time in 20 years there was ice fishing. Another parching summer and fall, wells went dry, hunting was suspended and there was fear of the tragedy of fire in the woodlands.

But it gave us many of those wonderful days we revel in. Speaking of these, there is Old Home Day when the weather is always fair. This year on the following day we had open house and visiting members of the United Nations came by. One of our citizens – Beverly Fogg Heegard, exchanged greetings with the Nepalese Ambassador in his native tongue thanks to Peace Corps experience and we have another, Larry Daloz, who could have done the same thing had he been around.

Hancock's property is now assessed at 100% valuation according to law. It makes negligible difference except to make comparisons between properties in town easier. For a more adequate discussion see page 52 of last year's Town Report. Our tax rate drop to 14.4 from 45.0 sounds like a saving, well it isn't. We remain as before – a town blessed with one of the lowest tax rates in the State.

Of course we all know the Town has other revenue besides real estate taxes – namely some \$25 M from the Interest and Dividends tax, \$6 M or so from the automobile tax, \$5 M from the Water Department and others. It's the \$25 M from our greatest industry (people who own stocks and bonds) that beautifies our financial picture. But our schools benefit from a trust fund put aside by those who went before us which yields about \$4½ M annually.

Hancock citizens as they understood it regretted the Supreme Court ruling against prayers in the Public Schools. Mrs. John Peabody, Louise Garand, Isabel Baldwin were among those who arranged for prayers to be said at the Grange Hall before school started. With so many Town activities claiming our attention there is still an absence of hustle and bustle.

There is the relaxing and friendly atmosphere of the Sportsman's Club where Jack Roderick (an airline pilot like Irving Joseph), Jim Hitchcock as just possibly new Selectman Harrison Kimball and others gather to talk about nature's creatures and where like as not Ethel Dufraigne and Dorothy Avery will see that there are things to nibble on. The Men's Club produces interesting speakers – not soporific but in the main soothing like those chosen by the Historical Society. Each to his own taste – and there are those who like Herman Dodge welcome a quiet evening at home with a good book possibly from the Library where Elsie Frank now presides.

D. REPORT OF DISTRICT CLERK  
HANCOCK SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

March 9, 1963

On March 9, 1963, the annual School District Meeting was opened at 4 p.m. by Robert English, Moderator. The polls were declared open by voting on the first four Articles of the Warrant — to choose a Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and Member of the School Board for three years.

After the Moderator read the first four articles, Mr. Hitchings moved "that the polls be now opened and remain open until 8:00 p.m. to consider Articles 1 through 4 and that Articles 5 through 9 be taken up at 8:00 p.m." The Motion passed and voting began.

Mrs. Alice Brown and Mrs. Gladys H. Bullard were ballot clerks.

At 8 p.m. the Moderator declared the polls closed and read Articles 5 through 9 of the Warrant, also the certification. Voting was as follows:

Article 5. Motion by Mrs. Mary Garland, member of the School Board:

I move that the salaries of the district officers for the ensuing year be as follows: Chairman of the School Board, \$75.00; each other Member, \$50.00; Treasurer, \$50.00; Clerk, \$15.00; Moderator, \$10.00; Ballot Clerks, \$1.50 per hour each; Auditors, \$1.50 per hour each.

There was no discussion and the motion passed.

Article 6: Motion by Arthur Tremblay of the School Board:

I move that the reports as printed be accepted and placed on file with the clerk.

The motion passed.

Article 7: Nelson Gay and Valentine W. Gerrish were re-elected as School District auditors.

Article 8: Arthur Tremblay moved:

That the school district raise and appropriate \$61,296.17 and to authorize and direct the school board to apply against said appropriation such income as is estimated by the school board exclusive of state aid, and upon the determination of the amount of state aid to be received by the school district during the next fiscal year, to authorize and direct the school board to apply against such appropriation the sum to be received from state aid and with the school district clerk certify to the selectmen the balance as an assessment to be raised by the town for school purposes.

In answer to a question about the increase of "Salaries," Mr. Tremblay stated that it is an automatic salary increase. Mr. Foote cleared up the bit about State Aid. While we do not now receive State Aid, this motion would permit us to accept it if it were offered at any time during the year.

The motion passed.

Article 9: George Hampson of the School Board, made this motion:

I move that the school board be authorized to make application for and accept on behalf of the district, any or all grants forthcoming under Title III, V, or VIII, or any combination thereof, of the National Defense Education Act, Public Law 85-864 or any or all grants of other funds which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire under the provisions of the National Defense Education Act.

Mr. English asked Mr. Foote, Superintendent of Schools, and Mr. Barnes, Teacher Consultant, for some clarification of this motion, which was given as follows: School purchases have to be approved by the State Department of Education, and if approved 50% of the purchase cost will be paid to the school. This year new Math and Science material and books were purchased under this Act.

This motion passed.

At 8:30 p.m. on a motion by Albert Garand, the meeting was recessed to permit the counting of ballots. At 8:45 p.m. the results were announced as follows.

There were 53 ballots cast.

Moderator Robert English, 46 votes.

Clerk: Adella C. Eva, 16 votes

Treasurer: Mary E. Wilder, 50 votes

School Board Member for 3 years: George Hampson, 51 votes.

The Moderator administered oaths of office.

At 8:50 p.m. the meeting was adjourned.

## SCHOOL WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Hancock qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 7th day of March 1964, at 4:00 o'clock in the afternoon, (Polls close at 8:00 P.M., unless otherwise voted) to act on Articles 1-4 and you are further notified to meet at the same place on the same day at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon Articles 5-12 hereof:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subjects embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants forthcoming under Titles III, V, or VIII, or any combination thereof, of the National Defense Education Act, Public Law 85-864 or any or all grants of other funds which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire under the provisions of the National Defense Education Act.

10. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate in addition to the original appropriation for 1963-64, to be made available to the school district prior to July 1, 1964, in order to meet district expenses for the current year.

11. To see if the district will authorize the school board to enter into a long-term tuition contract with the Peterborough School District for the education of its pupils in the Peterborough Junior-Senior High School, such contract(s) no to exceed a term of 20 years from the date of the contract.

12. To see what action the School District will take in regards to permitting voluntary prayer in the school building. (By petition).

There were several changes made in the teaching staff this year. Mrs. Jeanne Deschenes replaced Mrs. Martha Desrochers in grades 1 and 2. Mrs. Dorothy Whippie returned for grades 3 and 4, replacing Mrs. Nancy Ryan. Mrs. Carol Clark replaced Mr. C. Kendrick Capon in grades 5 and 6, while Mr. Capon replaced Mr. Ernest Gendron as principal and in grades 7 and 8. Mr. Gendron left Hancock to work for a doctorate degree at Bridgeport University, Bridgeport, Connecticut.

## B. School Program

Our last year's school report was one of optimism and reflected healthy progress in our local school. It noted a busy staff of teachers, busy not only within the school but equally busy in group meetings, seeking the answers to creating a meaningful program for children.

Several years ago we developed the Spalding Phonics method in reading and the related language arts; a year ago we gave particular attention to the application of the so-called "new mathematics" to our curriculum. This year we have continued along these lines, thanks to the co-operative activity within our staff.

To those of you who are curious as to the content of the "new mathematics," a brief word might be in order. The primary difference between the "traditional" and "modern" approach is in the method by which the fundamental processes are taught. The former method tends to stress the mechanics of mathematics in contrast to the development of an understanding as to the "why" of mathematics, an approach which gives a more effective understanding of the more abstract concepts so necessary for a full understanding of the mathematical and scientific experiences ahead.

Prior to the opening of school two series of Union-wide meetings were held for teachers. Hancock along with others in the Union met for a period of six days, concerning themselves with the third grade arithmetic program and orientation of new teachers. Our teachers also took advantage of the Teachers' Institute in



Mathematics, sponsored by our Supervisory Union and others engaged in independent study at Keene State College.

As a continuation of the above-mentioned mathematics program, we anticipate a series of staff meetings to be held prior to the close of the current school year to prepare for the further development of our arithmetic instruction in the upper grades.

As for our young people, they too have been busy. The development of our music program has been of interest to many, as evidenced by the Christmas program sponsored by the Hancock Grange, with the able assistance of Mr. Edgerly, our music supervisor. In May, our fifth and sixth grades will participate in the annual field study program in science at Sargent Camp.

We are appreciative of the continued interest of the parents of our pupils, the support of the P.T.A. in the many activities of the school, including its support of the dental and vitamin programs, and of our town librarian for her share in making our program more effective.
