## TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Lisbon, in the county of Grafton and state of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, polls to be opened at nine o'clock in the forenoon and will not be closed before five o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects :

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to make appropriations for the same.

Art. 3. To see if the town will fix and determine the compensation to be paid each of the town officers.

Art. 4. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and special committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

Art. 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how the same shall be divided.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to give a discount on all taxes paid on or before such time as they may designate.

Art. 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries in the town of Lisbon.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200 for the Pine Blister Rust control.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to light the streets of Lisbon Village District all night during the entire year; Sugar Hill from the dwelling of H. Jay Field to Hotel Lookoff, from the Baptist Church through Lovers' Lane to the Franconia line, from the former location of the Goodnow school house to the Homestead, and from the Lisbon and Franconia town line to the dwelling of Arthur Hunt; Sugar Hill and vicinity to be lighted the entire year until midnight, and from 5 a. m. until daylight, excepting the lights from the Homestead to the Hotel Lookoff for six months of the year; all the above premises to be lighted with electricity; and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nursing Association.

Art. 12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Art. 13. To see if the town will accept Town Road Aid, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$981.16.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to plow the town roads, and if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to oil such roads in the town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to construct and repair cement and other sidewalks at Sugar Hill, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the purpose of advertising the town of Lisbon.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to aid in the construction and maintenance of a community skating rink for use during the winter season of 1943-1944; the money, if raised, to be expended by a committee of three appointed by the moderator.

Art. 19. To see how much money the town will raise for the support of the poor, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 20. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance, and to appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to paint the face, hands and figures of the Sugar Hill clock, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to apply on General Expenses of Highway Department, not included in Art. 5.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be divided between the Littleton Hospital and the Woodsville Hospital.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

**Report of the Librarian of  
THE LISBON PUBLIC LIBRARY**

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During 1942 the library was used by 486 different people, and the circulation of books was 17,615 for the year. Many names had to be dropped from the list of patrons because of absence from town either for work or for service in the army. Sixty-one new names were added, quite largely those of children who had reached the age of reading, or those who were obliged to do some in connection with their school work.

During the year 98 books of non-fiction and 197 of fiction were added to the adult list and 115 were placed in the junior department, including both fiction and non-fiction. Eighteen books were borrowed from the State Library at Concord and a number from the Library Commission in order to meet requests that could not be filled locally.

The book committee has endeavored to select books about the war that are in most demand, and it has, also, chosen an interesting list of background books dealing with the places that are mentioned daily in the newspapers or over the radio. Books of biography, early American handicraft, gardening, nutrition and sugarless cooking have been added and the fiction has been selected to cover a wide variety of tastes, ranging from a Hauck romance, a Raine western and a Gardner mystery to a historical novel by Le Grand Cannon, The Song of Bernadette by Werfel and The Seventh Cross by Seghers.

Books have been given to the library by Dr. Godfrey, Mr. Hutton and Mrs. Barbour, magazines by Mrs. H. B. Moulton, Mrs. B. S. Webb, Mrs. Chandler Aldrich, Mrs. Raymond Lang, Mrs. Albert Miller, Mrs. S. J. Sharpless, Mr. Stanley Currier, the Grange and the D. A. R.

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## THE RICHARDSON MEMORIAL LIBRARY

TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES :

The library contains approximately 7,057 volumes, not including government reports and bound magazines.

During the past year 157 books have been added by appropriation and gift.

Periodicals for the reading room and for circulation include American, American Home, Good Housekeeping, McCall's, Cosmopolitan, Woman's Home Companion, Reader's Digest, Ladies' Home Journal, Better Homes and Gardens, Your Life, The New York Times Book Review, Life, Time, and Lisbon Courier.

Donors to the library include Mrs. J. Warner Fobes, Henry H. Crapo, Mrs. Alfred I. DuPont, Mrs. Stella A. Summers, C. Prentice Andrews, Mrs. Carl S. Hoskins, Mrs. Arthur S. Walcott, Mrs. Yenni, and Herbert Hoover.

Total number of books and periodicals loaned, 6,213. Fiction, 2,037. Non-fiction, 1,355. Periodicals, 2,821.

While the war has diminished the reading population of Sugar Hill, there has, nevertheless, been a marked increase in circulation due to the summer visitors both in the hotels and colony.

Through the thoughtfulness of C. Prentice Andrews of Chicago and Sugar Hill, who is now in the armed forces, the library receives his unexpired subscriptions to outstanding magazines, some of which will continue through 1943.

Unfortunately the children's room, which is located in the basement, received considerable damage due to a faulty drain, and extensive repairs have been made.

Approximately fifty books have been borrowed from our State library and twenty volumes from the Littleton library. These books have been used for reference material, and through this service it has been possible to fulfill the many requests of the college students during the summer months, and the high school students throughout the school year.

May I take this opportunity to express to my townspeople my gratitude for their loyalty through these many years. I have been privileged to serve as your librarian for thirty-six years. It touched me greatly when last March fifty-five friends gathered at the library to tender me a testimonial tea. And the telegrams, gifts and many messages from our summer residents and out-of-town friends brought me much pleasure.
