## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the thirteenth (13th.) day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects, (Polls to close at 6 P. M.):

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for interest on the same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Northwood Public Libraries.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the care of cemeteries.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,410.00 for Street Lighting.

7. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the construction of Class 2 roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 therefor.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for town highways.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$476.71 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State's share to be \$3,178.07.

The following Article 10 is in the form of a petition originated by the Town Road Committee and requests the expenditure of \$4000 for Town Roads to be used on Jenness Pond road in connection with 1956 TRA work. It is included in Budget and approved by Budget Committee.



10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Aid in addition to the amount specified in Article 9.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$100.00 to Merrimack Valley Regional Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural resources and advantages of the Town.

13. To see what action the Town will take relative to amounts paid as salary to the Town Treasurer and to Clerk of Trustees of Trust Funds.

14. To see if the Town will vote to request the Moderator to appoint a Committee of three property owners to investigate the necessary size, location and type of Building adequately to house all Town road equipment, and make recommendation, including estimated cost of such a building, to the Town, at Town meeting, March 1957.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$515.00 for use of the Concord Hospitals. ✦

16. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

\*Considered and entered by Budget Committee without recommendation.

The Albion Knowlton library at the Ridge has been cleaned and redecorated. This library is used for the most part by the school children and for this reason when the redecorating was done the books which have been unread for many years were put in cartons and placed in the basement of the Chesley Memorial Library where, with the help of Miss Pratt, state librarian, the trustees may examine them and then place them on the shelves of the Bryant and Chesley Memorial libraries where they may more easily be reached.

Now that the Chesley Memorial Library has been open for a year a few statistics on its use might be interesting to you. There have been 4,044 books loaned. 1,219 of these have been non-fiction and 781 of them children's books.

The library has been open at least 280 hours during 1955.

Many interesting exhibits have been placed in the library throughout the year and it is hoped that others will take this opportunity to share their hobbies and interests with the folks who use the library.

There have been 584 new books put in circulation in the Northwood libraries in 1955.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Legion Hall in said district on the thirteenth day of March, 1956, at seven o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

In my first annual report to the citizens of Northwood, I should like to pay tribute to my predecessor, Chester W. Doe, for the excellent condition in which he left Supervisory Union No. 44 and for his assistance in the transition which occurred August 1, 1955.

The Northwood pupils and teachers also paid tribute to Mr. Doe's many years of service last June with a gift of money in token of their appreciation.



Northwood is fortunate in having Mr. Frederick A. Johnson as director of music. Besides his supervision of vocal instruction, he has developed an instrumental program which does credit to the community.

While I am in a complimentary mood, I should like to mention the P.T.A. for their support and donations, particularly the microscope to the Ridge School, the people who are devoting much time to the school lunch program, and the cooperation of the school board and the citizens of Northwood.

There are two major problems facing the public schools today. They can be resolved with the cooperation of the citizens, teachers, school board members, and administrators. These problems are: (1) Teacher Procurement; (2) Cooperative School Districts. Therefore, you are urged to study the two problems as they are presented below:

Teacher personnel procurement is becoming more and more difficult. There are few, if any, former teachers living locally who can be called into service. This makes it necessary to compete with other supervisory unions for the few that are coming out of the colleges, and these young teachers are taking advantage of the law of supply and demand — consequently, salaries are increasing. It seems to me that we should retain the qualified teachers that we now have by meeting this competition. Too often we lose an experienced teacher and find ourselves paying more to an inexperienced teacher in making the replacement. Another factor which makes the problem more complicated are the teachers who are not far from retirement and wish to improve their retirement benefits by seeking higher salaries. The pupils in rural areas are entitled to as good teaching as those in urban areas.

The Cooperative School District is a trend of the future. You are urged to review my predecessor's

annual report of 1954, and to invite Professor Austin L. Olney to present the material and data which he and his committee have assembled. I shall be glad to make the arrangements.

The combined bonding capacity of the several former school districts constituting a cooperative school organization provides, ordinarily, a sufficient total assessed valuation to meet the costs of needed new building construction.

The enrollments of cooperative school districts are large enough to keep the unit costs per pupil, or per classroom, reasonable, economical, and justifiable to the taxpayer.

The tax rates on property to retire necessary bonded indebtedness are not excessive because they are spread over a large district assessment.

The costs of new building construction are equalized among the several districts because the tax levy is made according to the ability to pay. The State will pay 40% of annual payments on principal of all outstanding district indebtedness.

It would be gratifying if local citizens would indicate their interest in considering the possibilities offered in belonging to a cooperative school district.
