To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ossipee qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are notified to meet at the hall of the Ossipee Central School, in said Town of Ossipee on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon of the said day, to act upon the following articles, the Polls to remain open until six o'clock in the afternoon.

ARTICLE 1. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the ensuing year the following sums of money for the following purposes:

ARTICLE 7. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## **FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT**

### **DANGER FROM FIRES IN WOODLANDS**

WOODLAND LITTER, WHEN DRY, IS HIGHLY INFLAMMABLE AND FIRES CAN QUICKLY GET OUT OF CONTROL. WE REQUEST YOUR COOPERATION TO CONTROL ALL FIRES SO THAT LIVES AND PROPERTY MAY NOT BE ENDANGERED OR DESTROYED, AND FORESTS BE KEPT GREEN TO FURNISH THE NATURAL BEAUTY WE ALL ENJOY AND TO GROW TIMBER WE WILL NEED.

### **WHAT IS "WOODLAND"?**

The term "woodland" is defined by law to include, "cut-over land, slash and such other land as bears a sufficient amount of wood growth, wood, weeds, grass, or other growth as to be likely to be burned over."

WHEN IN THE WOODS, YOU ARE EXPECTED TO EXERCISE CAUTION IN THE USE OF FIRE AND TO REMEMBER THAT

### **IT IS UNLAWFUL TO**

Throw down lighted matches, cigarettes, or other burning substances from vehicles or otherwise.

Burn brush, rubbish, grass or other materials when the ground is not covered with snow, without written permission from the Forest Fire Warden.

Kindle a camp or cooking fire on land of another without permission from the owner or his agent.

Leave an open fire burning unattended.

Fail to report a forest or brush fire that is out of control.

### **VIOLATORS ARE SUBJECT TO THESE PENALTIES**

Anyone letting a fire escape from control, whether or not he has a permit to kindle the fire, is liable for the costs of extinguishing the fire.

Anyone found guilty of dropping inflammable ma-

terial in or near woodland shall be fined not more than \$25.00.

A person failing to report an uncontrolled brush or forest fire is liable to a fine of not more than \$10.00.

For kindling a fire in woodland of another without permission of the owner, or for kindling any fire without a permit when a permit is required, a person may be fined not more than \$200.00, or imprisoned 60 days.

### DAMAGES

Every person who shall set fire on any land, that shall run upon the land of another, shall pay to the owner all damages done by such fire.

### BE SURE—GET A PERMIT

Incinerators should be tight, with a close mesh screen, and be on clean ground.

Open fireplaces used to burn rubbish are classed as incinerators.

Always clean a space about any open fire to prevent its spread.

Never burn in dry, windy weather.

Have incinerators inspected by the Forest Fire Warden and get his written permit.

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The most important achievement of the Ossipee Nursing Service for the year has been in prevention of disease in the community through inoculations.

When whooping cough broke in the school last fall only about one-tenth of the pupils had ever had it. Notices were sent to parents, telling them that inoculations against the disease would either lessen or prevent the effects of the disease. Inoculations were given to all those who wished it.

Through cooperation of the State Board of Health Polio Salk vaccine has been offered to all children, 1-15 years of age. Four Salk clinics have been held during the year through the cooperation of the doctors. The response of the parents to this program has been most pleasing.

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Ossipee qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Y. M. C. A. Building in said district on the 24th day of March 1956, at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district,



and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will vote to buy a new school bus; and whether the district will vote to raise and appropriate not more than \$6,200.00 for purchase of said bus and authorize the school board to expend the sum of \$4,200.00 plus such interest as shall accrued from the capital reserve fund and raise by taxation a sum not to exceed \$2,000.00.

10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to provide transportation of high school pupils to Brewster Academy.

11. If Article 10 is adopted to see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the cost of such transportation.

12. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for additional insurance on the building and contents of the Ossipee Central School.

13. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and accept in the name of the school district for educational purposes such funds or grants-in-aid as may be obtainable from the State or Federal government or any department or agency thereof, or any other source.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE  
SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Ossipee :

During the school year 1954-55 the teachers in the Ossipee Central School were :

Grade 5 — Mrs. Frances Pinkham  
Grade 4 — Mrs. Leda Knapp  
Grade 3 — Mrs. Florence Eldridge  
Grade 2 — Mrs. Lucinda Gilman  
Grade 1 — Mrs. Alice Loud

The staff for the current year remains the same except that Mrs. Kane was succeeded by Mr. Vincent Howley of Roxbury, Mass. Mr. Howley is a graduate of Boston University. He teaches the eighth grade, directs the boys' Physical Education and coaches the boys' sports. The girls' sports program is under the direction of Mrs. Pearson.

Total registration for the Ossipee Central School was 215 with an average daily membership of 209 which is a slight increase over the previous year. In September, 1955 the school opened with 203 pupils, and a few have enrolled since then. The census returns indicate that the enrollment should show a tendency to remain about constant during the next four years.

There were 61 Ossipee pupils enrolled in high school with 51 at Kennett High School, 4 at Spaulding High School, and 6 at Brewster Academy. Of these 15 were seniors. For the current year there are 61 pupils

enrolled in high school. Of these 10 are seniors. There are 24 pupils in the present eighth grade to enter the Freshman class in September, 1956 which will bring the high school enrollment to about 70. Current tuition rates are: — Kennett High School, \$295.00; Brewster Academy, \$275.00; Spaulding High School, \$256.50. The announced rates for the same schools for 1956-57 are, respectively: — \$305.00, \$295.00, and \$275.00. Total expenditures for high school education for 1954-55 was \$20,748.40, which is an average of \$368.52 per pupil. The state average cost per pupil for all purposes is not yet available.

Operation of the high school busses cost \$7,156.34. From this should be deducted income of \$2,354.26 for transportation of Madison pupils, and gas tax refund, to show a net cost to Ossipee of \$4,802.08. The cost of operation per mile was \$0.2214, which makes a per pupil per mile cost slightly over one-fourth of a cent.

The tax rate for school purposes per \$1,000.00 adjusted valuation for the year 1954-55 was \$22.08. The median tax rate for the state per \$1,000.00 adjusted valuation was \$22.99. The percent of total property tax assessment designated as the school assessment was \$55.97 compared to the state median of \$60.13.

Mrs. Marion Davis continued the supervision of the school health program in her usual efficient way. Under her direction, in cooperation with the State Department of Health, was the organization and administration of the Salk Polio Vaccine inoculation for the primary grades near the end of the year. Mrs. Davis also arranged with Dr. Furfey for regular dental services in the dental office at the school. This afforded an opportunity for many of the pupils to receive much needed dental treatment.

At the last Annual District Meeting the School Board was authorized by vote to place in a capital reserve fund not over \$3,000.00 from an anticipated surplus at the close of the year. This fund is to be applied to the purchase of a new bus for high school transportation. At the close of the current year each of these busses will have been driven nearly 100,000 miles. In addition to the \$3,000.00 mentioned above there is also in the capital reserve fund \$1,200.00 plus accumulated interest, received from sale of the Ossipee Corner building. This may also be used toward purchase of a new bus if the district so votes.

No state aid was received, and none will be received this year. Under the present formula for distribution and amount of money appropriated by the state, Ossipee is not eligible to receive state aid.

In this annual report for several years the critical shortage of teachers has been noted. This situation still exists. Dr. Nathan Pusey, President of Harvard University, in a recent speech, stated that this country needs 20,000 additional teachers annually. Many retired former teachers are now in service in our schools. Without them it is probable that many classrooms would be closed. This, however, is a source that is nearly exhausted. Competent young men and women should be urged to prepare to enter the teaching profession.

The very earnest cooperation of the School Board, teachers, citizens and pupils, is gratefully acknowledged.
