TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the sixth day of March, next at eight of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. Polls will be open at 1 P.M. and will remain open until 7 P.M. The business of the Town Meeting will open at 8 P.M.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Snow Removal for the ensuing year.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Forty-Two Dollars and Ninety-Five Cents (\$342.95) for T.R.A. so called.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of public landings.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars to put into a capital reserve fund for a new fire truck.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Police Department for the ensuing year.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$225.00) in support of the operating costs of the Elliot Community Hospital for the year 1973.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Sixty-Eight Dollars (\$468.00) for the support of the Monadnock Region Association.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights for the ensuing year.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Public Library.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Dump.

18. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$3,200.00) to be used by the Bi-Centennial Committee in preparation and presentation of the 1974 celebration. Such money to be returned to the town at the conclusion of the celebration from the money raised by the sale of souvenirs.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budgeted appropriations for the following priority purposes and in amounts indicated or take any other action hereon:

To see if the Town will vote

(a) To affirm the importance to the town and its inhabitants of abating existing pollution and preventing future pollution of the lakes and ponds and their water sources lying within the town.

(b) To support actively the enforcement of applicable statutes and regulations relating to water supply, water quality and pollution control.

(c) To support the selectmen, health officer and other town officials in their respective efforts to abate or prevent pollution of the lakes and ponds and their water sources lying within the town.

(d) To require written notice of intent to build to be furnished and delivered to the selectmen, together with a copy of any required permit or other evidence of approval from the State Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission or other state agency <u>before</u> any construction is begun, if such permit or approval is required by state statute or regulation.

(e) To provide thay any person who violates the foregoing requirement of written notice and accompanying documents shall be fined not more than \$25 for each day of such violation.



21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$97.00 to support the services of the community Health Clinic of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) as its fair share of the operating costs of the North Cheshire County Home Health Service.

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to dig an artesian well, install running water, and refinish the floor in the Town Hall.

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for expenses incurred by the Planning Board for the ensuing year.

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to repair the floor in the Library.

26. To see if the Town will vote to accept a parcel of land donated by Mr. & Mrs. Melvin Bull for the sole purpose of erecting a new Fire House. The property consists of one acre of land bounded on the West side by State Highway Route 123, 255 feet, on the North side 138 feet along Shedd Hill Road to the bridge, then 375 feet Southerly to the point of beginning.

27. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

As we stated in last years selectmens report we doubled the tax valuations in the Town of Stoddard in 1972 bringing the assessment to around 78%. We will not know exactly what the percentage is until we receive the State Tax Commissions report in the spring of 1973.

As you know, the Shedd Hill project which was voted at last years town meeting was completed last fall. The state engineers mistakenly advised us that the project could be extended beyond our original bounds. By the time they had found their error, the project had run over the estimated cost by some \$11,000.00. All but \$105.00 of the extra costs was covered by the following:

The Selectmen feel that this project was very poorly done.

The new snow removal truck has been ordered but as of this date has not been delivered. The cost of the new truck complete with new front plow and hydraulic wing exceeded the appropriation by nearly \$600.00. Because of the lack of use and the cost of needed repairs, the Selectmen with the advice of the Road Agent, felt that it was in the best interest of the Town to sell the '48 FWD highway truck. The sale was handled by the Town lawyer and most of the extra costs of the new truck were covered by this sale.

We wish to thank the rest of the Town Officers for their assistance during the past year.

NORTH CHESHIRE COUNTY HOME HEALTH SERVICE

ANNUAL REPORT TO TOWNS

This Agency has had another successful year serving the towns of Surry, Gilsum, Marlow, Stoddard and Sullivan. We are grateful to all of the towns people who have supported the Agency both with tax dollars and contributions to our membership drive. Also many have helped by serving on the Board, on committees, in membership drives, assisting at the clinics and providing transportation.

The Child Health Conference begun in November 1971 has continued this year and has provided health supervision and immunizations for thirty children in twenty-one families.

This fall a new family health discussion group was started in conjunction with the Child Health Conference. This is open to all parents who wish to participate regardless of economic status. Topics which have been discussed are Recognizing Illness and When to Call a Doctor, Family Nutrition and Infant Feeding, and Care and Safety of Children.

Another new service this year is that of a licenses practical nurse. Mr. Paul Rocheleau of Keene is under contract with the Agency to make home visits for skilled nursing which requires a man.

Miss Adelaide Berdeen is still available for home visits for physical therapy.

REPORT OF CONSERVATION COMMISSION

During the past year the major effort of the Commission has been directed toward the development of a basic soil survey, together with interpretive soil capability maps.

Matching funds voted by the Town of Stoddard in 1972 have been used to obtain a grant of \$1,250.00 from the Ford Foundation for this purpose. These funds have been committed to the Soil Conservation Service of the Department of Agriculture, USA, to do as much of this work as funding will permit.

Because of past efforts of private individuals in having some of this work partly done, together with work completed by the Granite Lake Study, it will be possible to concentrate our funds mostly in those areas of most concern, namely, on land surrounding our lakes and ponds and main roads.

The final results will be a completed soil survey, together with land capability maps of about 60% of Stoddard. These maps should prove of great help to the Conservation Commission and the Planning Board in planning for the long range development of this town.

REPORT OF THE HEALTH OFFICER

Following last year's town meeting, the selectmen of Stoddard, N. H., recommended me as the town health officer. It may be of interest to you to know that there was more protocol involved before I was actually, and officially, your town health officer.

After my recommendation by the selectmen, I was sworn in by Mr. Everett Martin, notary public. The next step was to meet the approval of the N. H. State Board of Health, Concord, N. H. Mary Atchison, M. D., Director, State Board of Health, signed my certificate of appointment as health officer for the town of Stoddard for a term of three years. Finally, I had my appointment, as health officer for the town of Stoddard, N. H., duly recorded by Mrs. Mary Lane, Town Clerk of said town.

From April through September, 1972, I received 30 complaints. Each complaint was investigated and appropriate action was taken. Reports to, and from, other health departments were made, and recorded, whenever necessary.

Of the 30 complaints, 25 were concerned with the question of pollution of Granite Lake, Island Pond, or Highland Lake. There were 4 reported dog bites. One complaint was concerned with a dwelling's safety for occupancy.

Last summer, as a member of the Long-Range Study Committee of the Granite Lake Association, I conducted dye tests for septic tank system efficiency in the Stoddard area of the Granite Lake watershed. Bradley Pratt, Nelson health officer, conducted the same tests in the Nelson area of the lake. Bradley was generous enough to give me the necessary tablets to do this testing in the Stoddard area. It must be noted here that I received full cooperation from all land owners in the Stoddard area regarding these tests. On August 31st, 100 tablets were ordered for further testing, in Stoddard, this coming summer. As there is an increased demand for these tablets throughout the country, there is a long waiting period before receiving them. To date, we have not received our order.

I am concerned about the public landing area at Island Pond. This seems to be used many times as a public beach. I've been informed that on a hot, summer week-end, there are 100, or more, people in that small area. I'm concerned with water pollution possibilities as well as the lack of toilet facilities in the area. I would appreciate any suggestions which may resolve these problems. I would greatly appreciate the citizen's support of the article in the town warrant submitted by the Conservation Committee of Stoddard and which is supported by the Long-Range Study Committee of the Granite Lake Association.

I am pleased with the interest shown this past summer, by so many of the townspeople, regarding the elimination of existing pollution and of preventing any future pollution of our lakes and ponds.

A reminder to the townspeople---time is involved regarding each complaint which is received by me. I believe that each complaint should be investigated, and that fair action, to all concerned, should be taken whenever necessary. However, I also believe, that the townspeople should be aware of the fact that considerable time was spent, in a few instances, where no discriminating evidence could be found regarding the specific complaints.

Last, but not least, I wish to thank the selectmen of Stoddard for their kind assistance during my first year as health officer.

REPORT OF GRANITE LAKE ASSOCIATION

In the summer of 1970 the Granite Lake Association appointed a special committee to study the lake watershed and to recommend a plan to deal with existing or anticipated problems, with special reference to the quality of the water of the lake and the general environment. The committee asked the Office of State Planning (OSP) for assistance.

Because the Granite Lake Watershed was considered typical of many similar watersheds throughout the state, including the fact that it lies within two towns, the OSP agreed to prepare a detailed study and propose a land-use plan for our watershed which could be used as a demonstration model for other voluntary lake associations and/or communities wishing to take similar action. Robert L. Ward of the OSP staff was assigned to the project.

After many months of data gathering and analysis, in which our committee assisted, a 106-page report was prepared by OSP, with 94 pages devoted specifically to the Granite Lake watershed. The report contains a detailed description of natural and man-made conditions within the watershed, identifies present and potential problems which are having, or many have, an adverse effect on the lake and its environment, and recommends a future land-use plan. Also included are a number of recommended short-and long-range actions by individual property owners, the association and the towns of Nelson and Stoddard.

Copies of the report were distributed to all known property owners in the watershed, as well as to selectmen, planning board members and conservation commissioners of Nelson and Stoddard. In its letter transmitting the report, the committee wrote in part:

"The report is, therefore, a professional and impartial evaluation of facts and data pertaining to the watershed. Some of the OSP findings and recommendations challenge traditional concepts and disturb some hitherto comfortable assumptions.

"In effect, the professional planners say, "Slow down, control or even halt such activities as lumbering, road building and house construction because of their effect on the quality, perhaps the life, of the lake.

"The report says that each of the 2500 acres in the watershed is dependent on all others, and this interdependence must be recognized if economic and other values are to be preserved or enhanced. The action, or inaction, of each property owner affects all others, however indirectly. We are thus in a very real sense 'our brother's keeper.'

"No matter how each of us may feel, the findings and recommendations of the report can hardly be shrugged off. Further, what happens in the Granite Lake Watershed affects all the people of Nelson and Stoddard, if only because property in the watershed represents a substantial portion of the tax base of each town."

Now that the OSP report has been distributed, the committee itself is seeking to obtain the opinions and reactions of property owners and the public, and thereafter decide what recommendations it will make for implementation of various proposals in the report.

Some extra copies of the report are available from committee members on request by any resident or property owner of Nelson and Stoddard.

STODDARD SCHOOL DISTRICT SCHOOL WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the School District of Stoddard qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the first day of March 1973 at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by non-partisan ballot the following school district officials:

A. Moderator for the ensuing year.

B. Clerk for the ensuing year.

C. Treasurer for the ensuing year.

D. A member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

E. Auditor for the ensuing year.

2. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and fix the compensation for any other officers or agent of the district.

3. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To choose Agents and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

5. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district.

6. To see if the district will enter into contract with another school district to pay tuition in excess of the state average.

7. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to make application for, and to accept on behalf of the district any and all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire for the school year 1973-74.

8. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four thousand dollars (\$4,000) for installation of aluminum siding and the replacement of the sill on the West side of Stoddard Central School.

9. To see if the school district will accept the provisions of RSA 195-A (as amended) providing for the establishment of an area school in Keene to serve grades seven and eight from the school districts of Harrisville, Marlow, Nelson and Stoddard in accordance with the provisions of the plan on file with the district clerk.

10. STODDARD NURSE'S REPORT

The following is a summary of the school health program during the school year 1971-72.

Physical examinations were done for the sixteen students by Dr. Mildred Chamberlin in addition to the semi-annual height and weight check. The vision and hearing testing program revealed no hearing problems but did indicate that several students were in need of more detailed eye examinations. One student obtained glasses. Parents involved were notified of need for any health referral. Transportation was provided for a student to visit an opthalmologist in Keene and for three visits to Hillsboro-Deering School for a learning disabilities evaluation.

Two sessions on dental care were held including the showing of the films; "What Do We Know About Teeth" and "Double Pay for Danny Dillon". To highlight the need for physical fitness the film "Gymnastics" was shown.

For parents with pre-school children the following pre-requisites as required by the Division of Public Health are necessary for registration:

- Measles Vaccine (live-attenuated) (Having had measles is acceptable, when verified)
- 2. Oral Trivalent Polio Vaccine (Sabin)
- Diphtheria, Pertussis, and Tetanus (DPT) (Adult type DT when over 6 years of age)
- 4. Rubella Vaccine (German Measles)

Routine smallpox vaccination is not recommended.

Other vaccinations are optional.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS MESSAGE

Our youth are educated on the basis of transmitting our culture and society so that they in turn will evaluate the ideas and bring about constructive change. The basic premise of education is to teach children to be critical thinkers, good citizens and to provide base skills for employment. Planning and effecting educational change to secure the desired ends entails internal teacher education, community involvement and support and effecting programing modifications while maintaining evaluation, proper financial support and providing accountability. As society becomes more knowledgeable the perplexities of the educational process increase also.

We have been called upon to establish priorities, elicit objectives and propose procedures to be followed. The cycle of education has revolved again to total emphasis on the individual child with provisions for individual differences and formulation of programs and procedures to meet these differences. The factor of failure is largely eliminated as pupils proceed at their individual rates, interest is high, and relevancy to current society, economics, and politics is apparent. It is difficult for the adult world as interested citizens, parents and certainly educators to revise or abandon "traditionalism" in our frame of reference. Large group instruction, the captive audience lecture approach, and labeling large numbers of children with skill deficiencies as special class or disabled are fast disappearing from the educational scene. The teacher must have a priority commitment to first understanding and teaching children and secondly pursuing and relating his subject area. There are many imperatives in current education and performance goals are of prime significance.

With emphasis on pre-school education, stress on individualization of instruction, removal of the lock step of grade arrangement, wider use of teacher aides, increased technology, and more diversification in the curriculum to meet the needs of all, we find great disparity between school districts with some in an envisable position and others seeking rational answers. The educational process has become increasingly more expensive but not disproportionately as compared to other increasing costs.

My initial orientation to this Supervisory Union has been most eventful with challenges appearing from several directions. The timing was critical from my aspect with the immediacy of researching budget preparation before knowing staff and programs. Salary negotiations have also thrust differing approaches for School Board action. The schools basically operate well and the problems are inherently unique to each district. My educational philosophy urges broadening educational experiences for children and providing diversification and more intensified preparation in vocational areas. Work experience programs are excellent, but would be greatly enhanced through greater depth of preparation. I strongly urge sharing programs in the three high schools to (1) avoid duplication and triplication of capital outlay, (2) providing a sufficient number of students to create program efficiency, and (3) utilizing valuable space in the most productive and economical basis possible.

We will hopefully gain more State and Federal financial assistance for education in the future. Categorical aid has certainly been the catalytic factor in implementing some new programs.

This Supervisory Union is fortunate to have concerted interest in professional in-service education, strong support for the C.A. P.E. program, and now fostering the Instructional Materials Center for central dissemination of audio-visual materials.

Excellence in education is achieved only through professional dedication, strong supportive services and an interested, concerned and supportive public. Research and practice have shown refinements within the capabilities of all school systems as long as flexibility and willingness to modify exist. Learning can be most enjoyable. We have a moral obligation to plan, support, and operate programs adapted to the differing capabilities and needs of all children to ensure the strength and future well-being of our society. By creating a learning atmosphere that is interesting, exciting and challenging we are providing the vehicle for each individual to explore and discover processes and procedures for himself and in end result make it possible for him to grasp changes in taking his place in the working world.

Members of the School Boards have a multiplicity of issues confronting them and your support is essential. The need for public understanding and support has never been more necessary.
