## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

BELKNAP SS.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Belmont in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall, in said Belmont, on Tuesday, the 13th of March next, at 9 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To choose one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years, and one Trustee of the Public Library for three years.

3. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally.

4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray all expenditures as listed in the Budget and make appropriations for the same.

5. To see what the Town will vote to do with its Parsonage Fund.

6. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid on or before July 1st, 1934.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

8. To see if the Town will vote to re-open the road by Small's and Babb's house to the D. W. Highway.

9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate Twelve Hundred Dollars, for the purchase of a used truck of suitable nature, and a small motor driven pump to be used in connection with said truck, for fire protection.

10. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors' deeds.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to improve water supply.

12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from Beaulé place to the Gilford line.

13. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

Clinics held for the school children during the year were, Dental, Toxin-Anti-Toxin, and Tuberculosis. May I say at this time that the Red Cross Chapter in Belmont did a

great deal toward making the Dental Clinic a success.

#### IMPROVEMENTS

During the summer the Gale building was repainted. This was the only large outlay for repairs during the year.

The water pipes at the Gale building have been in a long time and should be relaid. In my report last year I stated the need of re-modeling the Plunimer building. The cost of doing a complete job would be considerable but I am hoping and recommending that some action by the school meeting may make this work possible.

#### HIGH SCHOOL

The enrollment of our high school continues to grow slowly but steadily. The problem of room becomes yearly more pressing. The work is progressing well under the direction of Mr. Ernest S. Brown, our new headmaster. A fine school spirit is being developed.

It may be of interest to know that in certain tests given last year to all high school seniors in the state our seniors ranked very high.

#### FINANCES

The apportionment of state aid for Belmont for next year is \$3,565.70. This is about \$700 less than what we received this current year.

The per pupil cost of our elementary schools for the year ending June 30, 1933, was \$57.87. The state median was \$75.89. The per pupil cost of our high school for the same period was \$72.97. The state median was \$102.44.

#### SUPERVISORY UNION

The State Board of Education found it necessary to

---

reduce the number of school superintendents, the change becoming effective July 1, 1933. This necessitated the reorganization and enlargement of many of the supervisory unions. Gilmanton was added to the Tilton-Northfield union. This union now comprises Tilton-Northfield, Belmont, Gilford and Gilmanton.

In conclusion I wish to express my appreciation of the assistance and co-operation which has been given me during the year by the members of the school board, the teachers, and many others.
