SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The year 1994 ended with a fund balance for the year of \$30,058.00. In addition, the Town ranked 4th lowest tax rate of the 238 municipalities in the State. Our debt service is decreasing. This year the Town portion of the budget shows a decrease over last year. However the tax rate increases due to the school and county portion of the overall budget. Financially, the Town is in excellent shape, debt is very low and the tax rate position does reflect the Selectmen's conservative approach to fiscal matters.

The Bridgewater Steam Power Co has signed an agreement with the Northeast Utilities (PSNH) for the balance of their contract, thanks to the efforts of our local Representative, Nils Larsen.

This year the Town has agreed to share the cost of the Town line perambulation with the Town of Plymouth. A contract has been awarded to an engineering firm to do the perambulation of the Bridgewater-Plymouth Town line at a cost of \$4500.00. Each Town will pay 50% of the cost, \$2250.00.

Article 4 in the Warrant asks to legalize a vote taken in the 1991 Town Meeting. Even though the amount is less than \$100,000.00, it did require a 2/3 ballot vote instead of a voice vote. The Dept of Revenue Administration in Concord accepted the form of the article and the vote when setting the 1991 Tax Rate for the Town. The DRA is always extremely careful that warrant articles conform to RSA's when establishing Tax Rates for towns.

As most realize, the tax bill is composed of Town, School and County. Since the others constitute 70% of the tax rate, we can only state -ATTEND THEIR ANNUAL MEETINGS ! In the past, we have been able to absorb some of the other increases through the expansion of the tax base and sound management practices. This will not be possible in the future. We are not as sure as to State, County and School impacts.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT ON FINANCIAL PRESENTATION

To the Members of
the Board of Selectmen
Town of Bridgewater
Bridgewater, New Hampshire

We have audited the accompanying general purpose financial statements of the Town of Bridgewater as of and for the year ended December 31, 1994, as listed in the table of contents. These general purpose financial statements are the responsibility of the Town's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these general purpose financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the general purpose financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall general purpose financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1B, the general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the General Fixed Assets Account Group, which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The amount that should be recorded in the General Fixed Assets Account Group is not known.

In our opinion, except for the effect on the financial statements of the omission described in the preceding paragraph, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Town of Bridgewater as of December 31, 1994, and the results of its operations and cash flows of its nonexpendable trust funds for the year then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole. The combining and individual fund financial statements listed in the table of contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Bridgewater. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the general purpose financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly presented in all material respects in relation to the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole.

Home Health care services continue to grow for the nation and NANA. The need for visits from our professionals and paraprofessionals in the home has increased by fourteen percent (14%) during 1994 mirroring national data for the industry. Published statistics project yet another ten percent (10%) increase in 1995. The NANA Finance Committee considered this information to formulate its 1995 budget.

NANA will also have the ability to process some Medicaid applications to enhance access to care for our residents.

The health care system is changing rapidly here in New Hampshire but the need for cost effective services remains a constant. The support of our towns remains extremely important. The NANA Board of Directors joins me in expressing our true appreciation for your generous appropriation.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON RESTORATION
THE OLD TOWN HOUSE

TO: The Selectmen of the Town of Bridgewater

Introduction.

The deterioration in the condition of the Old Town House (1806) on the north-south ridge that separates "our" side of the Town from "their" side of Town, has been apparent for some time. At the Town Meeting of calendar year 1994, a committee was appointed to investigate the needs and to recommend corrective action.

Meetings were held, several at the site of the Old Town House, expert corrective-action recommendations were obtained; and opinions of committee members and visitors solicited and considered.

Submitted herewith are the results of those discussions and deliberations:

Agreed upon points:

- (1) The Old Town House (30 x 40 ft) does, indeed, stand (or lean) in need of repairs, restoration and renovation.
- (2) The building should be preserved.
- (3) Although cosmetics as an overall requirement, is necessary, the first priority problem to be addressed is foundation repairs.
- (4) Interior cosmetics and renovation can wait upon foundation repairs.
- (5) Sills may need to be replaced.
- (6) The restoration must be a restoration not a "fix up", and all new work should be compatible with the historic era of the building.

Points not agreed upon:

- (1) The committee is to report these findings to the citizenry via this report to the Selectmen, and there ends its responsibility.
- (2) The committee was never granted the authority to enter into contracts or otherwise commit Town funds to any restoration projects.
- (3) This report represents the dissolving of the Old Town House Committee.

Because this report does not represent complete concurrence in all its points, those members of the committee, not in agreement, are reminded that they may submit (to the Selectmen) a minority report.

I am writing to submit a potential course of events for the movement forward to address our responsibilities as a town and as townspeople for the restoration and maintenance of the Bridgewater Town House. I speak only for myself, but will attempt to distill the aspirations and concerns of our friends and neighbors as expressed at our recent Old Home Day observance and on other occasions. Please accept the following suggestions in the spirit of good faith in which they are conveyed, if these particulars result in a thoughtful and productive dialogue followed by action and accomplishment than I will have met my goal in offering them for consideration.

1.) The Bridgewater Town House Restoration Committee or a successor committee should be charged with the organization and execution of the effort to restore the 1806 Town House with the advise and consent of the Board of Selectmen.

As expressed consistently at Old Home Day, there is near unanimous sentiment that the responsibility for planning and completing this restoration should be charged to a body which has that restoration as its full and only priority. This is a project which requires a specialists' approach; it needs to be overseen by persons who have or who develop access to specialised historic restoration skills.

2.) This committee should immediately seek opinions and estimates from qualified restoration consultants or contractors to develop an array of options, beginning with the immediate need for repairs to the foundation and sills, and including repairs which will be needed in the foreseeable future for the remainder of the structure. These figures should be obtained before snowfall.


3.) The Town should include as a warrant article in the 1995 budget either an outright expenditure of fifty per cent of the funds needed to complete the foundation and sill restoration, or a bond authorization in an equal amount.

4.) The Restoration Committee should authorize a Fund Development Committee whose responsibility it would be to raise by private subscription the balance of funds needed to complete the historically sound restoration of the foundation

and sills of the Bridgewater Town House within three years (August, 1997) in time for the one-hundredth observation of Old Home Day in 1998.

5.) The Town should provide a separate and distinct account for these purposes, and also establish a Town House Maintenance Endowment Fund to perpetuate the upkeep on this building, utilizing interest alone after provision for management fees and inflation.

Thank you for your consideration of these suggestions; please be assured that I would be happy to volunteer assistance in the fund development effort. I look forward to your response, and those of other interested persons.

**GRAFTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS'
1994 REPORT**

The Grafton County Commissioners are pleased to submit the following report to the citizens of Grafton County. Despite some major personnel changes during the past year, we have enjoyed a smooth transition, thanks in large part to the concerted efforts of our employees, including department heads, our administrative team, and the employee council.

After twenty-five years of service to the county, our Executive Director, Evelyn Smith, retired, effective December 31, 1993. Although she is sorely missed, her position has been ably filled by Ernie Towne, moving from Superintendent of Corrections, after an extensive search. His former post has been taken over by Sidney Bird, who joined us in April of 1994 after extensive corrections experience in Miami, Florida.

The resignation of Nursing Home Administrator John Richwagen necessitated the establishment of yet another search committee and review of résumés. In late November John Will migrated north from Massachusetts to join us as the Administrator of the Grafton County Nursing Home. During the nearly five month interval Office and Personnel Supervisor, Joanne Mann, did an outstanding job as Acting Administrator. Another change at the Nursing Home and Department of Corrections was the addition of Dr. David Fagan as Co-Medical Director, joining our long-time Medical Director, Dr. Harry Rowe.

Another change in personnel will be the succession, in January of 1995, of a new Commissioner from District 3, Steve Panagoulis of Plymouth, taking over Betty Jo Taffe's seat. Betty Jo, after many years' interest in and association with Grafton County, opted not to seek re-election in order to join her husband on his sabbatical. We shall miss her and wish her well, as we welcome Steve to his new responsibilities.

In November of 1993 construction of an expanded Special Needs Unit was completed at the Nursing Home and 20 residents moved into their new quarters. Family Day was held once again for Nursing Home residents and their families, and continues to be a huge success. It is one of the residents' favorite annual events. Also, during the year County Nursing Home employees rejected an attempt to unionize, opting instead to continue with the current employee council.

During FY 1994 Grafton County saw the completion of Phase I of the AHEAD, Inc. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), used to purchase and renovate low and moderate income housing in the Littleton area, and made significant progress on Phase II.

In addition, the Office of State Planning notified the county that it had been awarded a two-year CDBG of one million dollars for the Whole Village Family Resource Center in the Plymouth area. Funds will be used to construct a facility which will house local human service agencies that work with children and families.

During early FY 1994 the County Long Range Planning Committee presented a preliminary plan for addressing County Courthouse space needs. The County hired CMK Architects of Manchester, NH to conduct a feasibility study of the options presented by the committee: renovation and construction of an addition to the courthouse or an annex as soon as funding is available. In the meantime, the Commissioners approved the state's plan for renovating the Grafton County Superior Court Office at state expense.

Once again Grafton County observed April 16-23 as County Government Week. Activities included an information booth with educational materials and county employees on hand at the Powerhouse Mall in West Lebanon, an art exhibit at the County Courthouse, and public tours of county offices. The Commissioners also recognized employees for their years of dedicated service to the county. In May a Conservation Field Day for school children was held at the Grafton County Farm, and in June the farm hosted an open house.

Financially, fiscal year 1994 was successful, in that revenues exceeded budgeted expenditures by \$738,814, due in part to the unanticipated receipt of nearly a half-a-million dollars of Medicaid Proportionate Share funds, to partially offset the cost of serving a disproportionate share of Medicaid recipients at the nursing home. Human Services costs, over which we have essentially no control, continue to rise. Savings effectuated in other departments allow us, in our FY 1995 budget, to keep our increase in revenues to be raised by taxes to 3.1%, with a total budget of \$14,818,299.

A more detailed explanation of FY 1994 is found in our annual report, copies are which are available at our office, which may be reached by calling 787-6941.

The Commissioners hold regular weekly meetings at the County Administration building on Route 10 just north of the County Courthouse in North Haverhill, with periodic tours of the Nursing Home, Department of Corrections, County Farm and Courthouse. The Commissioners also attended monthly meetings of the County Delegation's nine-member Executive Committee.

All meetings are public, with interested citizens and members of the press encouraged to attend. Call our office at the above number to confirm date, time and schedule.

Once again, we are extremely grateful to all who have helped make several successful transitions, who have worked hard for the county, and who have assisted the Commissioners - dedicated staff members, elected officials, other agency personnel, our many wonderful volunteers, and the public - all of whom have made our job easier and rewarding.

The Community Center will see its 49th year of service to the Newfound area and we hope you will help us celebrate by participating in the 1995 agenda of programs and special events.

Pemi-Baker Youth and Family Services Council Annual Report

The Pemi-Baker Youth and Family Services Council, Inc. is an organization dedicated to promoting community-wide approaches to aid the development of healthy families and children. The Council currently coordinates four programs:

- 1) Juvenile Court Diversion-a program for first time juvenile offenders, allowing them to be held accountable for offenses without going to court.
- 2) The Challenge Course-a 15 hour early intervention drug and alcohol program for young people whose use of alcohol and other drugs has come to the attention of a parent, school official, police, court or other person (including themselves).
- 3) Information and Referral-provides residents of 17 town region with access to information about human services in the area. During 1993 the Council received approximately 150 calls and visits through this program.
- 4) TIME/Host Homes- the Council administers program providing short term housing for young people in need of time away from home as an alternative to running away. Program initiated in the Fall of 1993.

Over the past year, the Council has continued publication of "Families First", a column published twice a month in the Record Enterprise, produced a Student Resource Card for distribution to all students at Newfound and Plymouth Regional High Schools, provided administrative support to the third annual Conference for Parents (held in Plymouth each September), coordinated the area celebration of Red Ribbon Week and started a group for mothers of teenage daughters.

Over the next year the Council is looking towards opening and staffing part-time offices in Bristol and Lincoln, collaborating with local schools to expand drug and alcohol prevention programs and expanding the services available to participants in court diversion.

The Bridgewater Conservation Commission
1994 Annual Report

This past year the Commission members continued to give many hours of their time attending the monthly meetings, making site visits with applicants for Wetlands applications and attending workshops.

In an effort to streamline the application process and to facilitate a quicker response for smaller minimum impact projects, the NH Wetlands Board has recently created an "Expedited Permit Application". This Expedited Application can now be used for such projects as small seasonal docks, a driveway culvert installation or repair and limited repairs to retaining walls. Where this Expedited Application has been appropriate, Wetlands Board Approval has been granted within 2 to 3 weeks. This new application and instructions are available at the Town Clerk's office at the River Road Library or directly from the Commission.

As we reported last year, the Commission has started a three-year project to map wetlands in the town. This project is very labor intensive but because of limited membership, we have been unable to make the progress we would have liked. If you are interested in helping with this most important project, please contact any member of the Commission.


On the 5th of June last year, the Commission helped promote a canoe trip on the Pemigewasset River as part of the "Source to the Sea" program. Bridgewater's Sawhegenet Falls Park was a scheduled stop for the canoeists on their journey from Profile Lake to the Atlantic Ocean. Refreshments were generously supplied and served by the Bridgewater Historical Society. The Society also mounted a most interesting exhibit depicting the history of Sawhegenet Falls and the Old Toll Bridge. This generated much interest among the canoeists and spectators and was much appreciated. After a presentation by guest speaker Professor Lawrence Spencer from Plymouth State College, the canoeists continued down river lead by the steamboat "Pemigewasset". This woodfired steam driven craft was most generously provided by Captain Bob and Jean Thompson.

As outlined in the Bridgewater Master Plan, the Commission is designated to be responsible for insuring protection of Bridgewater's historic sites. The Bridgewater Town House built and dedicated in 1806 tops all lists. As Commission Chair, I have been working with Historical Society President Helen Lovett and Society members Phyllis Clement and Nancy Gray to complete the necessary information, maps, photos etc. of this the last historic building owned by the town. Our goal is to submit an application to the NH Division of Historical Resources requesting that it be added to the National Historic Register. Renovation work is planned to start this spring and should be supported by us all.

In closing, I would like to make note of what appears to be an ever increasing occurrence, specifically the illegal dumping of tires on remote private property in the Town. At two locations alone, the number of tires was close to 100! If you see anyone "trashing" someone's property, please call the State Police, Chief James Glicks or the Selectmen. Such activity should not be tolerated by anyone.

The Bridgewater Conservation Commission holds regular meetings on the second Tuesday of each month at 7:30 PM at the Town Hall on Route 3-A. We invite you to attend.
