WARRANT

To The Inhabitants of Dalton, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dalton on Tuesday, the 5th day of March next, at 12 o'clock noon to act upon the following subjects. The polls will be open at 12 o'clock and will close at 6 o'clock in the afternoon. The business meeting will open at 8 o'clock in the evening.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to issue temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget for 1974 as prepared by the Selectmen and appropriate the amounts therein or to make any changes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to change the road from Daniel Browns to the late Shepard Vogelgesangs from a Class 6 road to a Class 5 road.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to replace the Bridge over John's River on the Forest Lake Road, at a cost of \$176,000, the town's share being ¼ of this amount, or \$44,000. The Town would be bonded for their share over a period of years.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to accept or reject disaster assistance in the future years.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to give the Town Officers a raise in salaries.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the North Country Council.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$330.00 as the Town's Share for operation of the North Country Council for one year, beginning July 1, 1974.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money as a donation to the support of Alpha House, a group Home for Boys in Lancaster.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to let the Conservation Committee and the Fire Department hold any unexpended monies for a Reserve Fund for future years.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to replace the 1968 town truck, to be paid for by part Revenue Sharing Funds and raise money for same.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF POLICE DEPARTMENT

This year, as in the past years, your Police Department has strived to give our best for a better community in which to live, work and play in self-content. Your Police Department attempts to protect the rights of all within its jurisdiction, to be free from criminal attack, secure in their possessions and to live in peace. It is to you people that the Police Department is ultimately responsible. A society free from crime and disorder remains an unachieved goal, but with your guidance and support we will continue to work towards that goal.

The addition of Carroll "Butch" Rexford has been a help in the past year. He has taken a strong interest and is willing and able to help in any way possible. Adelard Pilotte has continued to check the Dalton Ridge area frequently at no cost to the town while Ronald White checks another area. Both of these men are also special officers.

Total paid hours were down from 1972 while mileage increased. This was due to two men. Carroll Rexford and Jon Burbank, attending classes in Lincoln. These were held on different nights making it impossible to travel together. Both men were paid only for mileage. I also attended some classes in Lincoln and several seminars in Berlin covering many different aspects of law enforcement. These and others are again being offered in Berlin in the spring. We are planning to attend as many of these as possible. These courses help us to keep abreast of the new aspects as they become available, and to update our knowledge of law enforcement. These are necssary as we are not financially able to leave work for long periods of time to attend these courses offered at the State Police Academy. The law enforcement officer is still being slowed in his work by the adverse decisions handed down by the Supreme Court. It appears that this is going to continue for some time and we can only work to keep abreast of these decisions and new laws being passed by our governing bodies to keep a free society.

The full-time man approved at last town meeting, contingent on the availability of other funds, was finally voted on in December and turned down as not being feasible at this time. This can be appealed or resubmitted at a later date. They did approve a request to purchase two hand-held radios. These should be available by May.

Again this year there was a drop in the number of court cases. However, we should not be lulled into a false sense of security by this. With the developments of the past few months, the situation is not expected to take any substantial turn for the good right off. It is for this and other reasons that we should try to increase what we are already doing or at least as much. Either way, there will have to be a substantial increase in the budget as I am sure everyone is

aware that costs have gone out of sight in the past months with only a slight chance of halting them in the future. With the cost of gasoline (when available) costing \$0.50 to \$0.65 cents per gallon, can you run your car for \$0.10 per mile?

The following is a sample of the cases worked on during 1973. There were also the usual number of complaints involving dogs, bad checks and others. There were two cars stolen from town, both recovered, as well as finding two cars stolen from other towns.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING DEC. 31, 1973

A total of twenty calls were responded to: eleven in Gilman, Lunenburg and East Concord, Vermont. It should be noted that we (Dalton) have a mutual Aid agreement between the towns of Gilman and Lunenburg, Vermont. On January 3, 1974 we (Dalton) were admitted into Twin State Fireman's Association which includes Whitefield, Littleton, Twin Mt., Franconia and other towns south along the Connecticut River on both New Hampshire and Vermont sides. A new Fire Station was built in 1973 which houses four of our five Fire Trucks. The fifth truck is being housed at the old Fire Station for protection of the southern part of the town and aid to Gilman and Lunenburg.

In May of 1973 the Ladies Auxiliary was formed and in that time have raised money by raffles and serving lunches at Bingo to buy four complete fire suits for the Firemen.

I want to thank the Board of Selectmen and other surrounding Fire Departments, both of New Hampshire and Vermont, the Ladies Auxiliary and all firemen for their support during the past Year.

WHITEFIELD REGIONAL AIRPORT COMMISSIONERS' REPORT — 1973

Having completed another active year, the Whitefield Regional Airport Commissioners submit this short résumé of its activities to the various towns that it serves.

The budget that is published on the following pages will indicate that actual income exceeded anticipated income by \$3,815.22. This was due to an unanticipated increase in state funds, a first-time appropriation from the Town of Northumberland, plus the fact that Diamond International Corporation and Georgia-Pacific Corporation has joined Timberland Machines, Inc. as a contributor to our airport.

The Regional Airport continued to serve the region in many ways. Some of which are listed below:

- 1. Headquarters for the Civilian Air Patrol.
- 2. Provided a base of operations for the Air National Guard search and rescue helicopters.
 - 3. Served as a site for National Guard Maneuvers.
- 4. Provided summer Air Line Service, Air Freight, Air Ambulance Service, Flight Instructions, and Scenic Air Flights.
 - 5. Used by many commercial and industrial interests.

This past year, we completed renovation to our ticket office and waiting room. We have added a septic tank system that permitted us to install new toilet facilities. We extended the apron to serve the private hanger area and ran a new water line from the old to the new hanger area.

The air line service investigation has been completed but, as of this writing, no decision has been made as to whether or not Delta Air Lines will serve the North Country.

We think that to continue serving the North Country, as an airport should serve, we must not only maintain our present good standing but we must gain the reputation of being the best small airport in the northeast. One of the methods chosen by your commissioners to accomplish the aforesaid is to erect a much needed hanger that would house seven to ten planes. A glance at our budget will show a fund established for this purpose. If all goes according to plan, we should be able to erect the hanger without any increased financial burden to the several towns.

The new hanger will also enable the commissioners to find a Fixed Base Operator. It is our opinion that before we find someone who will man the airport for a full working day, we must give him a place to work in. The hanger would provide space for sales and service, as well as rental space to transient planes.

Recently, the governor and council approved the installation of a partial instrument landing system. The equipment called a "Localizer" will be installed this summer at a cost of \$40,000.00, all of which will be paid by State and Federal funds. The new equipment will provide a horizontal guide to aircraft and will increase the number of hours that the airport is usable.

Finally, your commission feels that the airport has truly become regional with all towns having a voice in its operation and participating in its financing. We thank everyone for their cooperation and respectfully request its continuance.
