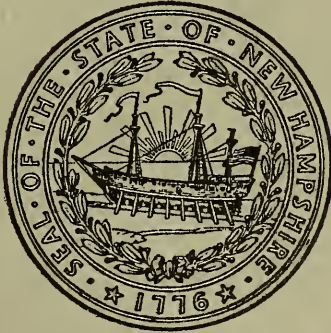

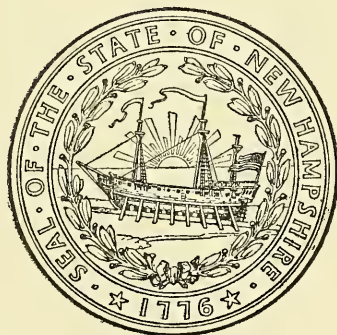

TOWN WARRANT
State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Groton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Groton on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next at three o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same in accordance with budget herewith attached.
3. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount for prompt payment of taxes.
4. To see if the Town will vote to continue plowing driveways with the present fee of \$7.00.
5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow in anticipation of taxes.
6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of or administer any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.
7. To see if the Town will vote to use \$1,000 of the Total Highway Appropriations for the sealing of roads. The completion of the North Groton Road and other sections to be decided upon at this meeting.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 for police patrolling of Town roads in the summer months on weekends. Hours and time to be set by the Selectmen or at this meeting.
9. To see what action the Town will take on the following:
 - a. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to relocate the entrance to the Town Dump or construct a three-sided fence around said Dump.

- b. To see if the Town will vote to hire a custodian for the maintenance of the Town Dump. Hours and rate to be determined by the Selectmen or at this meeting.
10. To see what action the Town will take on the following:
- a. To raise Town Officer's hourly rate from \$1.33 to \$1.50.
 - b. To determine the Tax Collector's salary on the basis of 1% of the total Property Tax Warrant.
11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to install 2 street lights. (One in front of the Library and Selectmen's Office, and one at the corner of the Sculptured Rocks, Hebron and Groton road.)
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed (\$500.00) five hundred dollars, to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of acquiring land and/or buildings, or for building a new Town Hall at a future date.
13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy—both industrial and recreational—is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area—4,350.00 acres—is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers.

Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.

Chapter 15, Laws of 1959 amends RSA 76 by inserting after section 11 the following new section: 76:11-a *Information Required*. The tax bill which is sent to every person taxed, or his agent, if known, as provided in section 11, shall show the rate for municipal, school and county taxes separately. Any town, through its selectmen, may request that the tax commission compute the rates which will appear on the tax bills as provided hereunder and upon said request the tax commission shall furnish the required information.

A combined or total rate is shown above for those towns with a single school district and with no precincts or village districts. It is recommended that the combined rate be shown on each tax bill in addition to the separate rates. Precinct and multiple school district towns and cities should also arrange their tax bills so that each taxpayer will know his total tax rate as well as the rate breakdown.
