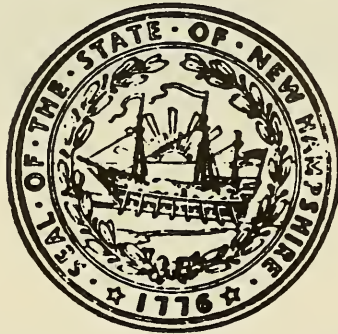

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, in Grafton County, in the State of New Hampshire, you who are qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Hall in Hebron on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at five o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. The polls will be open at 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and the business meeting will commence at 7:00 p.m.
The Village Cooperative Kindergarten will prepare and serve a roast beef dinner from 5:00 to 6:15 p.m. The cost will be \$4.75 for adults and \$2.75 for children five to twelve years of age, and no charge for those under five.
2. To hear the reports of any committee.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize a two percent cash discount on property taxes paid within thirty days of the date of the tax bill.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for the animal control agreement with the N.H. Humane Society.
6. To see if the Town will vote to accept two roads, Sarah Lane and James Lane, as shown on the Lochmont Subdivision as approved by the Planning Board.
7. To see if the Town will accept from Norman W. Sanborn one road, Country Lane, as shown in the Sanborn Subdivision as approved by the Planning Board.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate six thousand nine hundred dollars (\$6,900.00) to install vinyl siding on the Selectmen's Office and the Library and authorize the withdrawal of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for this purpose with the balance to be raised by taxation.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate two thousand six hundred seventy dollars (\$2,670.00) to pay for the vinyl siding installed on the older portion of the fire station to match the finish of the new addition, and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund.
10. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue, as a function of the Town, the plowing of private roads and driveways.
11. To see what action the Town will take to repair, replace, or other options, the 1952 GMC Tanker of the Fire Department, and to raise and appropriate money for same.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) to replace the lamps and rewire the lights on the Town Common.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.
14. To see if the Hebron-Bridgewater Disposal District will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the District the benefits of Title II of the Federal Social Security Act as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated amended by Chapters 302 and 322 of the Laws of 1955, and to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand one dollars (\$1,001.00) to defray the district's share of the cost thereof.
15. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the Hebron-Bridgewater Disposal District will authorize the Commission to execute on behalf of the District the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan, and to see if the District will designate the Chairman of the Commission as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
16. To see what the Town wants to do about the uses and abuses of and at the Town Beach.
17. To transact any other business that may legally come before the Meeting.

HEBRON FIRE DEPARTMENT Annual Report for 1986

During 1986 the Hebron Fire Department responded to 71 calls. Of that number 43 were fire calls, 14 were for medical emergencies (resulting from illness) and 14 were for rescue (injury resulting from accidents). This total is down slightly from the 1985 all time high of 84. Dollar loss this year was estimated at \$10,000. 1986 was the first year in quite a while that we had no major fires.

The big story, of course, was the construction of a substantial addition to the fire station and the acquisition of a rescue truck. The capacity of the fire station in Hebron was increased from two vehicles to five vehicles. At present it is full. Besides Engine 2 and Tank 1, which were already housed in the station, Engine 1 has been brought over from the East Hebron sub-station and a 1946 Mack, designated Engine 3, which was stored in the barn of one of the firefighters is now housed in the station. This Engine is going to be fitted out as the forestry truck and will be in service this spring. The fifth vehicle is the rescue, a 1973 Ford which was the original ambulance that served the Newfound area. This vehicle carries all of our medical and rescue equipment and if called upon will respond anywhere in the Newfound area. We have equipment and capabilities in cold water rescue and heights rescue that are not possessed by other services in this area. Having such a vehicle is much better than driving to the station in our private vehicles and loading them with what we think we might need for the emergency only to get there and discover that something is needed that was left back at the station. Now everything goes on every call. Note, however, that we do not transport patients in this vehicle. It does not meet the standards for an ambulance nor does it have the appropriate on-board equipment. Newfound Ambulance continues to provide the patient transport.

Of all the issues we faced in 1986 and will continue to face in the coming years, personnel heads the list. The nicest station and the fanciest equipment are of little value if there are no trained people to use them.

Last year four firefighters took the N.H. Certified Firefighter Course, and passed the practical and written tests to become Level I certified. Two of our former Level I firefighters passed the Career Level course. At present we have three people on the department who are enrolled in a course leading to a more advanced emergency medical certification. These programs run two nights a week and use several Saturdays a month over a four month period. All this is done on the individual's own time and expense for travel. My hat is off to these

people for their dedication.

That is the good news. On the negative side we lost two of our best people this year, Charlie and Debbie Tatham. Charlie was a captain on the department, Career Level Certified, emergency medical certified. Debbie was emergency medical certified. Our loss is the Stratham Fire Department's gain. Best of luck.

At present our roster stands at 24 officers and firefighters (including emergency medical personnel). As we look at the list, however, we note that there are some members whom we have not seen in over a year. This is not unique to our department. Finding individuals who are willing to make the commitment of time and energy to the fire department is increasingly difficult. It takes a special person to put in the hours required to maintain an effective department when the only reward is the sense of a job well done. The challenge for the volunteer emergency service organizations in the coming years will be to find committed people who are willing to give of that most valuable commodity—their time.

**REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN
and
STATE FOREST RANGER**

Between July 1985 and June 1986, we experienced fewer fires than normal. The two leading causes of forest fires were again children and fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden. Both causes are preventable, but only with YOUR help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden.

If you own forest land, you became responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.

NEWFOUND AMBULANCE RESCUE

1986 Report

The second year of Newfound Ambulance Rescue's service to Bristol and the surrounding Newfound Area including the Towns of Alexandria, Bridgewater, Danbury, Hebron and New Hampton, saw an increase of 32 in number of calls from the previous year for a 1986 total of 365. A breakdown of number of calls per town is shown below.

It was also a busy year in several other significant ways. The fund drive, started the year before, was brought to a successful conclusion, having raised over \$36,000.00 for the purchase and equipping of a new ambulance. In the early months of the year an order was placed for a Wheeled Coach Type II Ambulance. The new Ford vehicle arrived in Bristol in the spring and was phased into service during the summer. The Town's original 1973 ambulance went to the Hebron Fire Department where it is being converted to Rescue/Utility use and hopefully will continue to serve the Newfound Lake area several more years in that capacity.

The ambulances moved into a "new" station in April. With the move of Bristol's Water and Sewer Departments to new quarters, the lower garage area of Bristol's old Fire Station became available. The two ambulances now share these quarters with the Bristol Police Department. Repair and improvements to the garage doors, especially the addition of an electric opener on the ambulance door has improved response time. The ambulances had previously been housed in private garage and barn space.

A major step in continuing efforts to upgrade the level of pre-hospital care, made available to residents of the service area, was the delivery of a Defibrillator in late December. Ambulance attendants will be receiving training and certification in the use of this very valuable life saving machine in early months of 1987.

With the cooperation of the State E.M.S. Office, arrangements were concluded to hold an Emergency Medical Technician (E.M.T.) course in Bristol during the first quarter of 1987.
