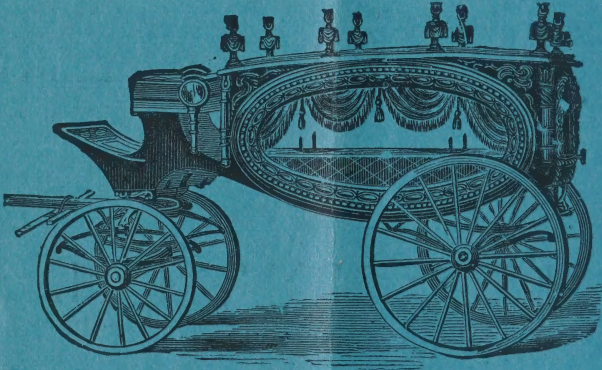

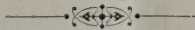

SCHOOL BOARD OF LEBANON
TOWN SCHOOL DISTRICT, FOR THE YEAR 1887-88.

EAST LEBANON.

This school has had three terms of 10 weeks each, the first two under the charge of Miss Hattie S. Davis of Meriden, a teacher of much experience. The school made good progress under her instruction. Winter term taught by Mr. John L. Norris of Lyme. This was his first term, but showed that he has the qualities to make a first-class teacher. Irregular attendance is the great fault of the school. The scholars seem to go and come as they please. This should be corrected. No. of scholars, 25. Wages, \$24, \$26 and \$28.

BAKER DISTRICT.

Three terms of 8, 10 and 12 weeks. The first two taught by Miss Elsie Barden with good success. Winter school in charge of Mr. A. A. Hurlburt, one of our best teachers. The scholars from old No. 11 were brought to this school during the winter, but it made a long, cold ride for some of them, and the Board are of the opinion that it would have been better to have had two schools. No. scholars summer and fall, 9; winter, 16. Wages, \$20 per month for first two terms, and \$28 for third.

MERIDEN ROAD SCHOOL.

Three terms, taught by Mr. Natt Sargent. This school is one of the best schools in town, and the district are fortunate in securing the services of Mr. Sargent, who, as an instructor, has but few equals. No. Scholars, 26. Wages, \$48.

SCYTHEVILLE.

Three terms of 10 weeks each, all taught by Miss Lucie P. Stone of Hartford, Vt., who gave great satisfaction to district. No. scholars, 45. Wages, \$28, \$32, \$40.

OLCOTT FALLS.

One term of 10 weeks, taught by Miss L. B. Spencer, who gave good satisfaction. No. scholars, 8. Wages, \$16.

FREEMAN DISTRICT.

Two terms of 10 weeks each, both taught by Miss Lena B. Cragin, who won the love of her scholars, who made good progress under her instruction. No. scholars, 13. Wages, \$20.

FREETO DISTRICT.

Three terms of 10, 11 and 12 weeks, all taught by Miss Sarah Mason, who has had much experience in this school, and seems to be the right one in the right place. The scholars made as good progress as any in town, and show much interest and enthusiasm. No. scholars, 30. Wages, \$24 and \$28.

MT. SUPPORT.

Summer school of 10 weeks, taught by Miss Hattie

Tracy, who showed much zeal as a teacher. Fall school of 8 weeks by Miss May L. Choate, who labored faithfully. This school is too small to make much progress. No. scholars, 5. Wages, \$16.

WEST LEBANON.

HIGHER DEPARTMENT.—Three terms of ten weeks each, all taught by Mr. Josiah Davis of Meriden, a gentleman who has made teaching his life work, and seems to be the right man in the right place. No. scholars, 36. Wages \$44 per month.

PRIMARY.—Three terms of 10 weeks each, all taught by Miss Agnes Lauder, who seems to be remarkably well qualified for her work in this school. No. scholars, 44. Wages, \$28.

BUTMANVILLE.

Three terms of 10 weeks each, all taught by Miss Acsah Wood, a teacher of experience, who succeeded in arousing much interest in the scholars, and of course good progress was made. No. scholars, 25. Wages, \$20, \$22, \$24.

POVERTY LANE.

Two terms of 8 weeks and one of 10 weeks. Two first taught by Miss Nellie P. Hall, who met with fair success. Winter taught by Miss Ida Chid of Cornish, who was young and inexperienced, but who has qualities of a good teacher. No. scholars, 12. Wages, summer, \$16, winter, \$20 per month.

TO THE INHABITANTS OF LEBANON TOWN SCHOOL DISTRICT:—

The past year has been a successful one with our schools. Teachers and scholars in most instances have labored together, and as a result good progress has been made. The Board have endeavored to secure the best teachers their means would allow, and if they have failed in some instances, it was from lack of judgment, which we hope experience will correct. We, however, think the schools this year will compare favorably with any of the past. It would be of great advantage to our schools if the parents would show more interest in them, and encourage the scholars by at least one visit each term. The district very liberally voted to raise \$1000 for school purposes for the coming year, which will be enough for all extra and incidental expenses. It is, in our opinion, a great mistake that the two districts in town cannot be united, then by all working together Lebanon would soon become one of the first towns in the state in educational advantages. A new school house will soon have to be built at or near Olcott's Falls, and the school house in the Freeto district should be moved nearer the village, as most of the scholars are from the French district, and have too far to walk. The house is also too small to properly accomodate the 30 or 40 scholars, which are in attendance. The houses in most of the other schools are in good repair and room enough.
