

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Lisbon, in the county of Grafton and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, polls to be opened at nine o'clock in the forenoon and will not be closed before five o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to make appropriations for the same.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will fix and determine the compensation to be paid each of the town officers.
- Art. 4. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and special committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
- Art. 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

- Art. 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how the same shall be divided.
- Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to give a discount on all taxes paid on or before such time as they may designate.
- Art. 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries in the town of Lisbon.
- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200 for the Pine Blister Rust control.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to light the streets of Lisbon Village District all night during the entire year; Sugar Hill from the dwelling of H. Jay Field to Hotel Lookoff, from the Baptist Church through Lovers' Lane to the Franconia line, from the former location of the Goodnow school house to the Homestead, and from the Lisbon and Franconia town line to the dwelling of Arthur Hunt; Sugar Hill and vicinity to be lighted the entire year until midnight, and from 5 a. m. until daylight, excepting the lights from the Homestead to the Hotel Lookoff for six months of the year; all the above premises to be lighted with electricity; and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.
- Art. 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nursing Association.

- Art. 12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper observance of Memorial Day.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will accept Town Road Aid, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$491.05
- Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to plow the town roads, and if so to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.
- Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to oil such roads in the town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.
- Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to construct and repair cement and other sidewalks at Sugar Hill, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.
- Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the purpose of advertising the town of Lisbon.
- Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to aid in the construction and maintenance of a community skating rink for use during the winter season of 1944-1945; the money, if raised, to be expended by a committee of three appointed by the moderator.
- Art. 19. To see how much money the town will raise for the support of the poor, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

- Art. 20. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance, and to appropriate the necessary money for the same.
- Art. 21 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of snow removal equipment.
- Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to apply on General Expenses of Highway Department, not included in Article 5.
- Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be divided between the Littleton Hospital and the Woodsville Hospital.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Report of the Librarian of

THE LISBON PUBLIC LIBRARY

The functions of the library have been carried on as usual during the year, but because of the number of people who have left town, or are too busy to read, the circulation was below that of a few years ago.

The book committee has met every other month and has endeavored, in so far as the allotment of money for books would allow, to select those that would meet the most demands both for reference and for reading. Books have, also, been borrowed from the State library and the Bookmobile. Three hundred and fifteen books were bought and received as gifts during the year. Of these 81 were non-fiction and 89 were for the junior department. Lists of these books have been posted in the library and the covers displayed therc. The local paper, however, is no longer willing to print these lists because of a lack of help, but arrangements have been made to have them again in the town report, thanks to the Selectmen.

The novel having the largest circulation during the year was "The Robe." The non-fiction was quite equally circulated, "The Raft," "We Took to the Woods," and "See Here, Private Hargrove" running a little ahead of the others.

Books have been given by Mrs. Barbour, Mrs. Carpenter and Mr. Hutton, magazines by Mrs. Moulton, Mrs. Webb, Mrs. Aldrich, Mr. Currier, Mr. Foley, the Grange and the D. A. R., all of whom I wish to thank.

TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

The library contains approximately 7,281 volumes, not including government reports and magazines.

During the past year 224 books have been added by appropriation and gift. Periodicals for the reading room and circulation include: American, American Home, Good Housekeeping, McCalls, Cosmopolitan, Woman's Home Companion, Readers Digest, Ladies' Home Journal, Better Homes and Gardens, Your Life, New York Times Book Reviews, Life, Flight, Army Life, Clear Horizons.

Donors to the library include Mrs. J. Warner Fobes, Mrs. Arthur S. Walcott, Mrs. Carl S. Hoskins, Mrs. Grace W. Atwood, Mrs. Annie H. Bowles, Mrs. Deborah P. Coffin, Mrs. Lawrence Gilman, Otto T. Mallery.

Total number of books and periodicals loaned, 4,261; fiction, 1,019; non-fiction, 1,061; periodicals, 2,181.

The fact that the war has changed all phases of life is borne out clearly in the general trend of the demand for reading material.

The decrease in this year's circulation is due in part to the fact that the managements of the hotels extended the privilege of their respective libraries to their employees. Also I noted that the college men and women who usually depend wholly on our library for source material were absent from the colony this year due to exhilerated college courses and war work.

As in other years we constantly strive to serve our youth. A large part of the attendance is made up of the high school and grade school students. The teachers have shown much interest in securing from the library supplementary material for their work.

Realizing the great service the library is to the community, it is my hope that the selection of books and the activities connected with it will prepare the library to take its place as an indispensable part in the post war plan.

And at the close of another pleasant year may I extend my gratitude to the members of the Board of Trustees for their cooperation and to my townspeople, with whom I have many pleasant associations centered around the library work.
