To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the West Milan Town Hall in West Milan on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To choose delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
3. To vote on the question, "shall sweepstakes tickets be sold in this town?"
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' expenses.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for summer and winter road and bridge maintenance.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$344.95 and State will give \$2,299.64 for Town Road Aid.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 and the State will give \$10,000.00 for State Aid Construction on the East Side River Road.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town poor.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for aid to soldiers and their families.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for public libraries.
12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the care of cemeteries.
13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the White Mountains Regions Association.
14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Civil Defense.
15. To see if the town will vote to reclassify the Bruce Holt Road, so called, to a Class V Highway and to furnish maintenance for same.
16. To see if the town will vote to accept the balance of the budget as prepared by the Selectmen, and to raise such sums of money as may be necessary.
17. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen the authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
18. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## Report Of Superintendent

---

To the School Board and Citizens of the Milan School District:

### FOREWORD

The present school year has witnessed many instructional and building maintenance problems for your School Board and Superintendent. As frustrating as this year has been, the Board and I are far more concerned with the future direction of our educational system. Citizens of the District will need to take a long, hard look at our present structure and give the Board and Superintendent a clear picture of our future course of operation. Of concern to your School Board is a desire for excellent educational opportunities for our youth, within financial reason.

### INSTRUCTION

Although our total enrollment has remained fairly constant, our pupil distribution in classrooms is and will work an instructional hardship on some of our pupils. Grades 1 and 2 have an enrollment that makes good instruction difficult to achieve. We have remedied this situation to some degree by hiring a part-time teacher. We consider this only a temporary measure until a more realistic solution is instituted.

### BUDGET

The proposed budget for this year totals \$59,699.64. This represents an increase of \$2,096.62 over our present budget of \$57,603.02. Included is the sum of \$725.00 for federal school lunch reimbursement required by new budget and accounting procedures for School Districts. In our Financial Report we will show \$725.00 of anticipated receipts to reduce the school tax.

Budget will be increasing regardless of what course of action the District desires to pursue.

The School Board and I feel that it will be a needless waste of money to make extensive repairs on the buildings if the voters intend to close one or both schools within a few years.

It would appear that five courses of action can be taken by the voters over the next several years.

These would be:

1. To keep going at our present level.
2. To make major repairs on a yearly basis or authorize a bond issue for all major improvements to be made in one year.
3. To close West Milan School and concentrate on adding a room to Milan Village School and make extensive repairs to that building.
4. To close West Milan School, tuition Grade 7 and 8 to Berlin.
5. To close all schools and tuition all pupils to Berlin.

Our recommended budget provides for no major maintenance or instructional improvements. It provides for an educational program that presently exists within the District.

### WARRANT

After expressing concern over our educational and maintenance problems at a recent P.T.A. meeting the School Board is submitting two special articles in the Warrant for consideration by the voters. These articles are submitted in light of the following problems presently existing:

1. Major repairs at both buildings. These repairs to include a heating system, lighting, floors, window frames, blackboards, and outside building repairs.
2. Unbalanced pupil distribution by grade levels.
3. Major instructional equipment purchases.

4. Implementation of cultural instruction in the curriculum.
5. Budgets that will necessitate a much larger tax appropriation.

#### TUITION LAW

Whenever a District gives thought to a tuitioning program for education their pupils, an understanding of the operation of the tuition statutes is important. Statute 193:4, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated is quoted below:

##### 193:4 District Liability for Elementary or Junior High

**School Tuition.** "Any district shall be liable for the tuition of any child who as a resident of the district has been assigned to attend a public school in another district; provided, however, that except under contract the liability of any school district hereunder for the tuition of any pupil shall be limited to the state average cost per pupil of the current expenses of operation of all public elementary schools or junior high schools as defined in RSA 189:25 as amended, as estimated by the state board of education for the preceding school year, or the current expenses of operation of the receiving district for its elementary or junior high schools, as estimated by the state board of education for the preceding school year, whichever is less. This current expense of operation shall include all costs except those made for capital outlay, debt obligations and transportation, provided that to the above may be added a rental charge of two percent of the capital cost of such elementary or junior high school facilities as may be defined by the state board of education.

This statute means that the Milan School District would pay the state average costs or Berlin's actual operating costs, whichever is **less**. Transportation and Capital Outlay are never figured in operating costs.

Your School Board and Superintendent are in unanimous agreement that the West Milan School should be closed. These pupils would gain a far better education in Berlin, than the District can give them at West Milan. In some years it would cost less on a tuition basis than by educating them in their present school.

Educationally, we also believe that pupils in grades 1-6 should be in Berlin. This proposal, if adopted, would result in an initial budget increase over our proposed budget. A financial summary

of these two proposals is given later in this report. our **immediate primary concern** is whether or not the District wishes to keep the West Milan School in operation.

If the District wishes to close both schools a budget of \$68,-662.64 is recommended. Probably some students would attend Parochial Schools, but initial budget planning we are assuming all pupils would be going to public schools. Each elementary pupil attending Parochial schools would reduce expenditures by \$311.00.

**TRANSPORTATION**

Due to the special articles in the Warrant we have postponed until after the March meeting the bidding on school transportation. If we continue our present system or send the Junior High to Berlin, th sum of \$10,000.00 would appear to be adequate. As our three year contract expires in June, 1964 a new contract will be offered a successful bidder.

No provision has been made to reduce this amounts by any pupils attending parochial schools. Under this tuition arrangement for all pupils, the Supervisory Union item would be reduced by about one-half in the 1965-66 budget.

### COMPARATIVE BUDGETS

In comparing the possible three budgets, we are at the following conclusion :

1. If we keep in operation our present system we should adopt a budget of \$59,699.64.
2. If we close only the West Milan School, we should adopt a budget of \$57,830.64.
3. If we close both schools, we should adopt a budget of \$68,662.64.

**CONCLUSION**

As mentioned previously in my report this is a critical year in Milan's educational program. Your School Board and Superintendent are requesting from the voters a long range educational pattern to our school operations. A yes vote on closing the West Milan School would indicate a tuitioning arrangement for Grades 7-12. A yes vote, although educationally sound, on Grades 1-6 is not imperative immediately. A no vote on both articles would appear to be an indication to repair both buildings and continue our present system of operation.

In the final analysis, the School Board and Superintendent can only give to Milan pupils an education that the voters want to give to the youth of the District. Although we are convinced that only by a tuition arrangement can we properly educate our youth, we will accept your judgement and continue to do our best to serve you.
