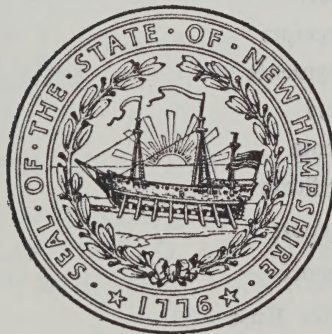

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at 10:00 A.M. in the forenoon, the Polls to close not earlier than 6:00 P.M., to act upon the following subjects:

Business meeting at 8:00 P.M.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of Highways and Bridges.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$934.64 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute the sum of \$6,230.93.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance and tarring of Class V roads.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,216.42 for principal and interest payment on Hough Payloader Note.
7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Cemeteries.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the care of the Village Cemetery.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of hospitals.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$50.00 for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.

15. (Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the Community Center.

16. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new truck, applying an old truck towards the cost of the new one, and raise and appropriate money for same.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove, in its discretion, plats showing streets, or the widening thereof, or parks; and make it the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Registry of Deeds of Belknap County a certificate or notice showing that the said Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of such authorization, as provided in Section 19 - 29, inclusive, of Chapter 36, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated.

18. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for use of the Planning Board to determine a site and get preliminary sketches and cost of Municipal Buildings.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the removal of junk motor vehicles which are in violation of State Law RSA Chapter 267-A.

REPORT OF THE NEW HAMPTON PLANNING BOARD

The New Hampton Planning Board met ten times during 1966. The Board was hampered in making early progress by the red tape and delay in getting the Urban Planning Assistance Grant approved at the Federal and State levels. This, and the signing of the contracts with Klunder Associates were effected May 31, 1966.

In February Miss Hope Swain was elected to fill the unexpired term of Mrs. Mary Moody.

In March the Board suffered a great loss by the death of John Cabot White. Mr. Ellis Frank was appointed by the Selectmen to fill Mr. White's unexpired term of five years.

At the July meeting, Mr. C. Waring Blackburn of Klunder Associates presented the results of the Survey Findings performed in the summer of 1965. The September meeting began the study and examination of Base maps and discussion of the Economic Base Study. Mr. David Scott, Principal Planner for the State attended this meeting.

In October various Board Members began attending the Community Planning Seminar under the joint sponsorship of the Office of Planning and Research - Department of Resources and Economic Development - University of New Hampshire. There were ten sessions running from October 5 through December 7, 1966. The Planning Board was presented a certificate for its participation in this seminar.

At the October and November meetings the Board dealt with interim reports and maps of Population, Land Use and Environmental Conditions, Sewage and Water Works. The Board went on record as being favorable to a Class B Clas-

sification of the entire Pemigewasset River, in accordance with the wishes of the voters. In addition it was voted to insert an article in the Warrant relative to Subdivision Regulations.

A special Public Meeting of the Planning Board was held at the Town House on November 22, 1966. Forty-one townspeople attended.

After the Board had given many thoughtful hours considering the Town's need for a Fire House, Town Garage and Municipal Offices, it was voted to insert an appropriate article in the Warrant. Much consideration has been given of the desirability of acquiring a Public Beach site for further development of the Recreational Assets of the Town. The Board is mindful of the need to preserve the historical aspects and natural resources of the Town of New Hampton.

It is hoped that the Board will complete its comprehensive plan so that it will be available to the voters during the fall of 1967 and so that additional recommendations can be made for Town action by the voters at the next Town Meeting.
