#### PITTSBURG TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 6:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Bremer Pond Auditorium in said Town of Pittsburg on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of one Moderator for one year; one Selectman for three years; one Town Clerk for three years; one Road agent for one year; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Library Trustee for three years; one Overseer of Welfare for one year.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred sixty-six thousand dollars (\$366,000) to purchase a new Tanker/Pumper Fire Truck and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the sum of one hundred thirty-six thousand dollars (\$136,000) plus interest, in the name of the Town, by issuance of a three-year note in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA Chapter 33); furthermore, to authorize the withdrawal of one hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$180,000) from the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund created for that purpose; the balance of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to be raised by general taxation. (2/3 Ballot Vote Required)
- 3. If the previous article does not pass, to see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to be added to the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to be added to the Highway Heavy Equipment Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nine thousand dollars (\$9,000) to be added to the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of thirty-eight thousand dollars (\$38,000) for the purchase of a replacement for our current 2001 Ford highway truck and its associated equipment. (Recommended by the Selectmen)

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) to pay for the salary, equipment, supplies, and associated expenses of a temporary Recreation Director from this Town Meeting until Town Meeting in March 2008. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) to purchase approximately one acre of land abutting the north end of the Town Park; and furthermore to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a twoyear purchase and sale agreement to pay \$35,000 out of 2007 taxes and \$35,000 out of 2008 taxes. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one million fortyone thousand nine hundred nine dollars (\$1,041,909) which represents the operating budget. Said sum does not include special articles addressed. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Polls will not close before 6:00 P.M.

### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The year 2006 was a very eventful year for the Selectmen and the Town of Pittsburg. From settling a lawsuit with TransCanada to initiating work on a Town web page, 2006 was a very positive year for the Town. Conversely, we have seen our property assessment ratio fall to 83.3%; the Department of Recreation and Development recommend no use of all terrain vehicles on State land; and a virtually snowless December.

After months of negotiating, we were able to reach an agreement with TransCanada regarding the assessment of their properties around the lakes. The controversy resulted from an alleged agreement several years ago regarding their property values. The controversy could have resulted in the Town paying over \$200,000 in a tax abatement. The agreement resulted in no tax obligation for the Town and a fixed value for the property until the next full assessment.

We also concluded our task of dividing the old "Chappell property" returning a portion of the land to Ronald & Susan Chappell. The Town was able to retain about half the property and ensure that the Chappell's constructed a State-approved septic system.

In July, the Town received our new grader. We look forward to a long and useful life for the grader.

As a result of meetings with our recreation committee, we applied for a \$15,000 grant from the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation to conduct a needs assessment for our recreation program and to create a Town web page. Pittsburg and Clarksville are now working with the New Hampshire Parks and Recreation Association to prepare that assessment. Our Web Page Committee is also working with the N.H. Community Technical College to create a Town web page.

We have also made major efforts at improving the safety of townspeople and our employees. The creation of a Joint Loss Management Team, the inspection of all town facilities, and the removal of identified safety hazards not only makes the townspeople safer but reduces the Town's liability.

After gravelling large sections of Halls Stream Road, Danforth Road, and River Road in 2006, we used most of our State Highway Block Grant to "shim" several damaged sections of Back Lake Road. We also "shimmed" a short section of Day Road to see how well the shimming would hold. This will help us gain a better understanding of how we address the condition of Day Road.

After lengthy delays, considerable expense, and frustration at several levels, we continued to make progress on making the Town emergency generator operable. Although the Town generator was not officially started and accepted until January 2007, it is now up and running. It is connected to the highway garage, the fuel pumps, and the fire station.

We continue to experience increasing land values particularly around the lakes. Sales prices continue to far exceed values. Our sales-assessment ratio, which is suppose to be between 95 - 105%, fell from 86% in 2005 to 83% in 2006. Because of this, the Selectmen have adjusted our contract with Avitar to switch a statistical update scheduled in the second year of our contract with the full update scheduled for the fourth year. It may be necessary to conduct a 100% revaluation every two years until prices stabilize.

The Selectmen continue to support the expansion of all-terrain vehicle use as a means to diversify the local economy. We certainly realize there are issues with ATV use, but believe with proper planning and enforcement, ATVs can play a large roll in our local economy. The Selectmen have gone on record with Commissioner Bald as strongly recommending that ATVs be allowed to use parts of State land on a selected basis. Our meeting with Commissioner Bald has also lead to a preliminary discussion with the Department of Tourism who has agreed to help provide ideas on how to market Pittsburg as a recreational area.

We had a second major water leak in two years on the Town water system. Fixing this leak and the leak last year significantly reduced the electricity required to run Town pumps and has lead to a full reservoir most of the year. We generally encounter four or five minor leaks each year.

Our sewer department has also been very active. We have replaced four manholes on Route 3 making the road safer. We have also made major strides in work on our septic lagoon on Indian Stream Road. We have also purchased safety equipment to help protect Town employees.

The Selectmen have also started working on a long-term plan for the Town. In November, we had an initial meeting with Town employees and in January 2007, we had a preliminary meeting where the entire Town was invited. We had 37 people attend that meeting and future meetings are scheduled. This plan is NOT a "Master Plan" as defined in statues but will be used to guide our planning efforts.

We will continue to try our best to work for the townspeople and make the right decisions that will be in the best interest for the Town. Please feel free to talk to us about any of your ideas or concerns.

### POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

This year, in addition to our regular duties, the Pittsburg Police were especially pro-active in the area of Homeland Security. We co-sponsored a HLS-CAM (Homeland Security Comprehensive Assessment Model) 3-day training session. We met several other times with the group and were able to identify and assess nearly 300 facilities, events, and structures in and around our community. Each one was given a rating and at the end, we chose Murphy Dam as being the top priority. When it came to doing an actual hands-on assessment, the Pittsburg School was used as an example. The final report should be done before Town Meeting and will allow those of us in Law Enforcement, EMS, and Fire to have a better understanding of how to make our school and the community as safe as possible.

The Mobile Command Post Trailer arrived in January and we are currently working on getting Memoranda of Understandings written between the Police and all other agencies in the area in order to allow the sharing of this piece of equipment. This was purchased through a grant from Homeland Security, along with the six-wheel ATV and some radio equipment. Thanks to the generosity of some individuals, we were able to equip the command post with two complete computer systems, a canopy for the outside, and some furniture for the meeting

The year 2006 saw us investigating a string of camp breaks in Pittsburg and Clarksville. It is our feeling that due to an increase in illegal drugs, we have and will continue to see a rise in property crimes. I urge everyone to keep their ears and eyes open for any suspicious vehicles or people when they are out and about. Alarm systems are increasingly being installed and are an effective tool in helping prevent thefts.

I want to thank each of my officers and their families for their continued hard work and dedication. I want to thank the area Fire, Ambulance, and Law Enforcement agencies who are always there when needed. Thank you to Cathy and Judy for answering the phone and to Cindy

for volunteering her secretarial skills when needed.

We applied for and received grants from the New Hampshire Fish & Game and the New Hampshire Highway Safety Agency which allowed us to work extra patrols at no cost to the Town. We hope to continue to seek grants that will help supplement our budget and enable us to do more to make our town as safe as possible.

We lost a great friend and fellow officer in the passing of Lovell "Bunzo" French. Bunzo

always supported the police department and will be greatly missed by each of us.

In closing, I want to thank the Selectmen and each of you for your continued support of the Police Department. Each of you are more than welcome to stop by the Police Department and ask questions, offer suggestions, or simply to see what we are about.

Cases 2006: Accidents investigated-85; Criminal Cases-138; Incidents requiring reports-90; MV Court-53; OHRV Court-28; Juvenile Cases rose to an all-time high of 46 (most of which originated at the school); Animal Complaints-14. In addition, several hundred warnings were given out. We did numerous vehicle lockouts and hundreds of property checks. We continued to keep our training current and each officer is encouraged to participate in training over and above the required minimum.

### PITTSBURG AMBULANCE CORPS REPORT

Another year has gone by and it's time to write up a report. We've had to put many hours of training in to keep up in the EMS field.

In 2006, we were involved in 102 runs. Out of those, 67 were medical, 30 were accidental, and 4 we didn't transport.

Thanks to grants in New Hampshire, we have managed to put 10 Automated External Defibrillators in the Pittsburg area. These AED's may be used by the public. They have been placed at Tall Timber Lodge, Timberland Lodge and Cabins, Pittsburg School, Young's Store, the Police Cruiser, Amey's Log Yard, Lopstick Lodge and Cabins, Pittsburg Fire Dept., Deer Mountain Campground, and Lake Francis State Park. In these places, people have been trained to use them.

Thanks to some hard work by some individuals and your town officials, we were able to purchase some new radios and change the radio system.

We were able to pick up two new attendants and I thank them for putting in the time to become an EMT.

The Ambulance Corps has put a mail box at the Fire Station and wishes that all mail for the Ambulance Corps be sent to:

On behalf of the community, I would like to THANK the Ambulance, Fire, and Police personnel and their families for another year of hard work, dedication, and support. I would like to thank the local area Corps and Departments for their assistance whenever called upon. The department also wants to thank the citizens for the continued finances and supporting the projects needed to make the department function.

Projects ongoing throughout the year have been:

The Risk Watch Program was able to purchase 3 robotic educations devices, Freddie the Fire Truck, Andy the Ambulance and Buzz's Safety House. The Robots will help teach the young and old Fire Prevention and Life Safety Education. Come and meet Freddie on Town Meeting Day.

The local Dispatch Center has gone under some changes with frequencies to allow all agencies (Police, Fire, & EMS) in the area to be all on one common channel making for better response. This being a new system to the area, the bugs are being worked out and progress is taking place. For those of you in scanner land, the new frequency number is 153.755. With the new changeover, new pagers have been purchased and some new digital radios were given to the Fire and EMS through the Homeland Security Interoperability Grant.

The dry hydrant at Powder Horn Lodge and Cabins has been repaired through a USDA Grant. The water source committee continues to work on hydrants within the community. Next summer, the line and valves will be repaired on the Dalton Road hydrant.
