
Gentlemen:




CITY OF PORTSMOUTH N.H. ORGANIZATION CHART

STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

Completed State Street widening and resurfacing project in cooperation with the State and Federal Governments.

Placed permanent hot top surface on the following streets:

Cutts Street from Interstate Highway to Maplewood Avenue

Maplewood Avenue from Cutts Street to North Mill Bridge

Islington Street from A. & P. Super Market to Melbourne Street






