TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stratham in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Stratham on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate two hundred sixteen dollars and twenty-seven cents (\$216.27) against the State's eight hundred and sixty-five dollars and seven cents (\$865.07) for State Aid Construction.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to allow one per cent discount on such property taxes as are paid within thirty days from the day upon which the Collector receives his warrant, the date to be printed on the tax bill.
- 5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to paint the inside of the Lower Hall, raise and appropriate Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for the same.

- 7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate Two Hundred Dollars, (\$200.00), for the proper maintenance of the dump being used in the lower pit on Bunker Hill Avenue.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to purchase a fire truck, raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 9. To see what action the town will take in regards to the War Memorial Fund and to appoint any necessary committees.
- 10. To see if the Town will accept the following provisions of the will of the late Perry C. Wiggin which relates to the Town of Stratham:

"To the Town of Stratham, New Hampshire, the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), to be held upon perpetual trust and the income in each year applied to the care and maintenance of the Town Cemetery in the said Town of Stratham, in which is located the lot in which my father and mother are buried."

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

FOREST FIRE PREVENTION PAYS DIVIDENDS

Most forest fires are preventable because someone is responsible for them. State records for 1950 show 94% of 632 fires resulted from human perversness and carelessness. Refusal to secure the required warden permit before burning; failure to use good judgment, lack of equipment and assistance while burning; carelessness in smoking and poorly conditioned woods equipment (trucks, tractors, etc.) resulted in a total of 6090.6 burned acres with a loss of \$63,949.10 in valuable property.

Fortunately, these human factors can be dealt with because people can be reached. This the local forest fire warden tries to do by informing his fellow citizens that EVERYONE MUST:

- Secure a written permit to burn in or near woodlands when the ground is not covered with snow.
- Use good judgment in burning and have enough equipment and assistance to keep fire under control at all times.
- 3. Be careful when smoking in or near woodlands and refrain from throwing lighted material from automobiles.
- 4. Make certain that all equipment used in the woods is in good condition.

His success depends entirely upon public reaction to his appeals. He does his part — the rest depends upon YOU and

This far reaching publicity has been instrumental in the creation of more business, the expanded building of taxable property and providing employment. Comparable publicity and effective results would be extremely difficult for any community to accomplish alone and the cost would be prohibitive.

- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
- 8. To see if the District will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the District, as determined by the School Board in its annual report.
- 9. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the

salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to sell all or any of the three surplus school lots and buildings.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to add to the building fund such monies as are received from the sale of all or any of the three surplus school lots.
- 12. To transact any other business as may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Stratham, New Hampshire:

I take pleasure in submitting my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The school year 1950-1951 opened with the following personnel:

Miss Edna Crane—Teacher of Grades 5 and 6.

Mrs. Elizabeth Merrill—Teacher of Grades 3 and 4.

Mrs. Hilda Barker, Teacher of Grades 1 and 2.

Mrs. Eleanor Henry — Teacher of Music.

Miss Nancy Carnegie — School Nurse.

The fact that there have been no changes in the teaching staff results in stability. These teachers by training and experience are capable of providing good instruction to the boys and girls of Stratham in the various phases of the school program.

I wish to congratulate the citizens of Stratham for being willing to accept their responsibility and provide a modern school building for the youth of the town. This is a big step forward and should result in better teaching and an improved educational program. Facilities are available so that the new school can become a community center which is what a school building should be. The members of the building committee deserve a great deal of credit for the time and energy expended as well as for the wise expenditure of the money available. It has been a pleasure to work with the committee on this worthwhile project.

As soon as it is financially possible to do so, there are at least three things which should be done in order to complete the job. The first is the development of the playground facilities and equipment. The site and location of the building make it possible to have a separate playground for the first and second graders at their end of the building. The older children can have their own play-

ground in the rear of the building. This seems to be a very desirable arangement for all concerned.

The second point is the starting of a hot lunch program. This will necessitate the equipping of the kitchen with the needed utensils and units. This program can provide a partial meal to supplement sandwiches which are brought from home or it can consist of a full meal which would be subsidized by the Federal government.

The third item is the beginning of an audo-visual program. The Parent-Teacher Association has gone a long way toward making this possible by purchasing a 16 mm. moving picture projector. The next step would be to take out a club membership in the film library of the University of New Hampshire which would provide a regular schedule of desired films throughout the school year.

I call your attention to the reports and tables which follow and I trust that these will be of interest to you.

Again I wish to thank the citizens of Stratham, the members of the School Board, and the teachers for their fine cooperation and support.

To the Superintendent of Schools:

Following is a report of the school nurse from January 1, 1950 to January 1, 1951.

In the spring the school nurse and the state health department nurse held a joint pre-school clinic in the Town Hall.

This fall the state dental trailer arrived and the children received the fluorine treatment. The report of the dental hygienist impressed us with the need for individual dental care.

The same program of health supervision in the schools has been carried out — examinations of skin, hair, vision, hearing, posture, teeth and tonsils; follow-up of defects with home visits if necessary; brief health discussions in the classroom as time permitted.
