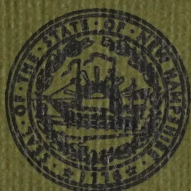

## TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Tuftonboro in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town House in said Tuftonboro on Tuesday, the seventh day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon until six of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. One hundred twenty-nine thousand, five hundred eleven dollars (\$129,511.00) as approved by the Budget Committee.
3. To see what action the Town will take on the Zoning Ordinance prepared by the Planning Board. The proposal on the Zoning Ordinance will appear in the form of a question on the Official Town Ballot. Copies of the complete text of the Ordinance are on file and available for inspection at the office of the Town Clerk, and will be available for inspection at the place of the meeting on the day thereof.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred thirty-four dollars and ninety-one cents (\$734.91) for Town Road Aid as approved by the Budget Committee. The State to contribute the sum of four thousand, eight hundred ninety-nine dollars and thirty-seven cents (\$4,899.37).
5. To see if the Town will vote the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) to be appropriated for the improvement of the Tuftonboro Neck Road during the year 1972. By petition.
6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year, and issue notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year.
7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell Lot Number 11 Bear Island.
8. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

### LEST WE FORGET – IT CAN HAPPEN HERE

Disasterous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar-holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947. Nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand—a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them dead out when leaving.
4. Most Important—Instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year—1971—was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.

## REPORT OF THE TUFTONBORO CONSERVATION COMMISSION

During 1971 the Commission decided that as a practical matter we should direct our efforts to preserving the quality of the lakes that surround us. The commission has joined with the other commissions around the lake to form the Winnepesaukee Conservation Commission to discuss and take action on mutual problems. Gordon Thayer, of our commission, is the chairman of the group. We have helped the 4-H group clean up the Nineteen Mile Bay and Mirror Lake picnic areas.

For several years we have been trying to stop further dumping at the Nineteen Mile Bay and this year by finding alternative dumping sites, we were able to get this dumping stopped. Work on the park is proceeding in cooperation with the newly appointed Parks and Playground Commission and should be a valuable addition to the Town. One of the most urgent needs for this area is toilet facilities but at the moment this project is still in the planning stage.

We have also been collecting water samples at strategic locations to determine the quality of the water at present and to see if the Town is adding significantly to the deterioration of the lake. These results are available to any interested person but are too lengthy to include in this report. In general the quality is reasonably good but not good enough to be used as drinking water without chlorination. We intend to purchase a kit from the Millipore Co. so that we can check water samples without having to send them to the state lab.

The Commission will also be submitting to the Town for their approval a request to have Town roads declared as scenic roads so that it will be possible to get Town road aid without meeting the state's specifications. Under this law RSA 253:17 and RSA 253:18 any cutting of trees or removing of stone walls will have to be first approved by the planning board or the selectmen.

To ease the problem of burning leaves and other organic trash and in conjunction with the dumping of solid fill at Nineteen Mile Bay we have also undertaken a small land reclamation project on Tuftonboro Neck. Dr. Robert Hennessey has consented to let us fill in the hole in the middle of the old field on the Chick farm. Between the fill and the rakings that Norm French accumulates we expect to see this hole fill in fast. We would like to convince more people that leaves make excellent compost and definitely do not belong in the Town dump.

We are continuing our right-of-way research and hope to complete this project this year. To date our research has saved the Town in the vicinity of \$500. What seems like a simple job of tracing a few deeds sometimes means long hours in the Registry of Deeds.

Another project which we hope to continue is to provide Ranger Rick magazine from the National Wildlife Federation to the Tuftonboro Fourth graders. It is our belief that if the young are concerned about conservation the future of the Town will be brighter.



We will be seeking a \$500 appropriation this year in addition to our operating expenses so that we may apply to the Ford Foundation for a matching grant. This money will be used to survey Town property and obtain easements on wetlands. We would like to remind you that funds appropriated for the Commission's use do not revert to the general fund but can accumulate for future needs. These needs could very logically be the purchasing of wetlands or obtaining easements for wetlands. As the available land is used up wetlands become very important in preserving the quality of the lake. Protecting our environment is the responsibility of everyone, we welcome any suggestions you might have that will help us towards this end.

N. and her assistants, Mrs. Nathalie Leavitt, R. N. and Mrs. Davena DeWolf, R. N. We also have available an Occupational Therapist, Mrs. Joan Decelle, and a part time Physio Therapist, Mrs. Betty Freeman with a contract with Huggins Hospital when Mrs. Freeman is not available.

The total number of visits made during 1971 is 2040 in comparison to 1881 visits in 1970.

Notices were on the radio and in the newspaper of the clinic, with transportation provided when needed. They were very poorly attended.

Our services now cover Alton, Brookfield, Tuftonboro, Wakefield, and Wolfeboro area. No patient is refused care because of financial stress. Therefore our drive for funds each year is very important as well as the funds voted for at Town Meetings, as like everyone, we have felt the pinch of economy.

The Nursing Committee wishes to thank everyone whose contributions financial and otherwise, assured the success of this program.
