

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Campton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Campton on Tuesday the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the ensuing year for the maintenance of its highways and bridges and make appropriation of the same.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Memorial Day.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the White Mts. Region Association.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Maintenance of Blair Cemetery and other cemeteries in Town.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1.025.00 to reimburse the Campton Village Precinct for hydrant rental. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Pine Blister Rust Control.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the support of the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the support of the Campton Volunteer Fire Dept.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for the use of the Town Historical Committee, which was appointed at the 1959 Town Meeting.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of agents and officers heretofore chosen.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### **REPORT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE**

The following is a report of the activities conducted by the N. H. Department of Health, Bureau Public Health Nursing for your town for the year ending December, 1959.

Home visits were made in the town on mothers, babies and pre-school age children and advice given as necessary. Arrangements have been made for children to attend diagnostic clinics for diagnosis and treatment as needed. Glasses were obtained for children through the N. H. Sight Conservation Program.

Draper Corporation of Beebe River sponsored two Salk Vaccine clinics on June 11, 1959 and July 30, 1959. This was especially for the employees of Draper Corporation but was opened up to the public to benefit the children in the community. The following number of shots were given by Dr. L. A. Middleton assisted by the nurse from the Plant.

#### You Can Help Prevent Forest Fires

Twenty-five per cent of all forest fires in New Hampshire are caused from carelessly burning debris brush, paper, leaves, grass, etc. Most of them are started without the required permit from the local forest fire warden. The cost, annually, of extinguishing these fires runs into large sums of money.

According to law, responsible parties must pay the cost of putting them out. In addition, violators may be subject to court prosecution with fines running as high as (\$200) two hundred dollars.

In the interest of fire prevention why not eliminate burning at home? Use your town dump. It has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place for the disposal of dangerous inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around the home and local stores; brush, etc., cut on your property. Eliminate the hazard of burning, yourself. It will be easier for you, personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises:

1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden — the law requires it.

2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning. Don't leave it.

3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Campton, New Hampshire, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said district on the third day of March, 1960, at eight o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will vote to build and equip an eight class room building with a  $40^{\circ} \times 60^{\circ}$  activity room for school and town use; and a  $14^{\circ} \times 14^{\circ}$  Selectmen's office.

10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one hundred and fortyfive thousand dollars (\$145,000.00) for the construction of a central elementary school with the additional facilities listed in Article 9, including the cost of site and preparation thereof, architect's fees, furnishings and equipment; and in order to provide such funds, to authorize the School Board to borrow the amount voted and to issue serial notes or bonds in the name and on the credit of the district, and to fix the time and place of payment, rate of interest, terms, maturities, and provide for the sale thereof, all in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, known as the "Municipal Finance Act," and any amendments applicable thereto. (Requires two-thirds vote by ballot)

11. To see if the district will vote to build and equip one two room school on the West side of the Pemigewasset River, at a suitable site, in the South part of the Town, and to install running water, modern plumbing and heating in the Livermore Falls School. (By petition)

12. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$30,000.00) thirty thousand dollars for any construction or improvements under the above article and to authorize the School Board to borrow the amount voted and to issue serial notes or bonds in the name and on the credit of the district; and to fix the time and place of payment, rate of interest, terms and maturities and provide for the sale thereof, all in accordance with the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chap. 33, known as the Municipal Finance Act, and any amendments applicable thereto. (By petition)

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

#### TO THE CAMPTON SCHOOL BOARD

Hereby submitted is my annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

Except for an increase in enrollment which we had not anticipated, there has been very little change in the Campton schools in the past year. At this writing, the Campton school enrollment stands at 191 boys and girls in elementary school which to my knowledge is the most pupils there have been for many years. Census reports seem to indicate that next year the school population will drop to about 180. If the upward trend in school population continues, it will be necessary to re-open Central School again which would probably add \$6,000 to your school budget.

The schools, at present, are all equipped with new series of up-to-date textbooks. Last year, with the purchase of a spelling series, we completed new adoptions for all courses and I am sure that there are no schools in the state that are better equipped with textbooks than we are.

I have mentioned this in previous reports but I am still of the opinion that we have an adequate testing program. Metropolitan Readiness tests are administered to all first graders upon their entering school and at the end of their first year are given achievement tests and the test of mental ability. All other grades have Achievement tests twice each year — in the fall to help diagnose children's difficulties and in the spring to see if teaching has overcome them. Mental Ability tests are given to the 3rd, 5th and 7th grades yearly and the results of all tests through the elementary school grades are retained in folders for each child. These folders follow the children into high school where their results are available for counselling and course placement.

As this is written I am sorry to state that for reasons of health, Mrs. Willard has resigned as teacher of the Primary Room at the Village School. She has been replaced by Mrs. Mary Hodgson who graduated from Gorham Teachers College in 1957 and who taught in Connecticut last year.

I have had several meetings with the School Planning Committee and the architect during recent months and I am sure that they have a very feasible school building plan for the town of Campton. This plan as proposed should answer the school needs for the town for some time unless there is an unforeseen and unexpected upward trend in school population. I am very hopeful that something may be done about the school housing problem this year.

Please contact me if I can help in any way concerning your schools and feel free to ask for advice if you think that I can help you.

## EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent of schools as per the following quotation: "REPORTS. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report showing the total salary paid to the superintendent, which report shall show in detail the amount derived from the per capita tax and the amount paid directly by each school district in the union." One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union No. 48 during 1958-59 received a salary of \$7,000 which was made up as follows: \$3,500 paid from the per capita tax and \$3,500 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1100 for travel within the union was also prorated as stated above.

The table below shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.

Total days in Session 181. Under a new law, Teachers Convention Days no longer count as school days and the school year must include at least 180 days in actual school sessions. This calendar takes the new law into consideration and allows ONE day to close schools for storms or other emergencies — if more than one day is lost for these purposes, the time must be made up.

#### THE MUSIC PROGRAM IN CAMPTON

During the past year, children in the first four grades have been working with songs with simple melodies and rhythmic patterns in an effort to improve ability to sing in tune. Use of rhythm instruments and rhythmic activities such as marching, skipping, sliding and galloping have shown improvement in most instances. Listening has been varied and students are becoming more aware of melody, form, change of mood, and rhythmic patterns.

Students in the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades have improved tone quality and enunciation in singing, and at the same time, extended knowledge of theory. Part singing has been weak because of insufficient practice. Rhythmic activities have included use of rhythm instruments for accompaniment to songs, folk and square dancing. Listening has been correlated whenever possible with other subjects, and the children have shown marked improvement in discussion of music and musicians because of increased experiences.
