

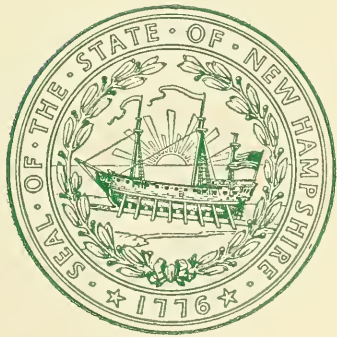

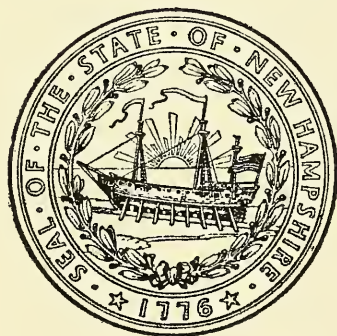

TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Groton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Groton on Tuesday the 8th day of March, next at three o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same in accordance with budget herewith attached.

3. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount for prompt payment of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to continue plowing driveways at the present fee of \$7.00.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow in anticipation of Taxes.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of or administer any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.

7. To see if the Town will vote to use \$1,000 of the Highway appropriations for sealing Town Roads.

8. To see if the Town will vote to pay employees Retirement and Social Security on any town employees.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to install two more Street Lights.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise (\$2000.00) Two Thousand Dollars for the rebuilding and expanding of the tractor house. Making it large enough for Town Truck with plow and wing and Fire Truck.

11. To see if the Town will vote upon the following:

A. To authorize the Selectmen to negotiate for and accept options on suitable real estate for Town House purposes, such real estate to consist of approximately one (1) acre in area and to be located within one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile of the present Town Library:

B. In the event of a favorable vote on Subsection A of the Article to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to be used to defray the expense thereof by establishing a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of erecting a Town House, said Capital Reserve Fund to be Designated "Town House Capital Reserve Fund, Grotton, New Hampshire" under the responsibility of the Trustee of Trust Funds, all within the provisions of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated Chapter 35 and any amendments thereto.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Given under our hands and seal, this 14th day of February, in the year of our Lord, Nineteen hundred and sixty-six.
