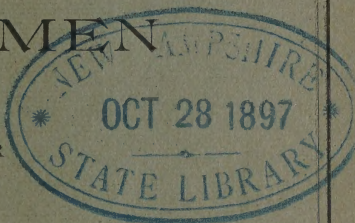

WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.—

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall, in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.

2d. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

3d. To choose three Selectmen, and all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

4th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways, and direct how the same shall be paid.

5th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

6th. To hear the report of the Auditors, and of the School Board of the town district.

7th. To determine the division of the school money.

8th. To see what action the town will take in relation to the balance of the dog tax of 1888 not ordered to be paid for damage by dogs.

9th. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the alterations and amendments of the Constitution proposed by the constitutional convention shall be approved.

Amendment 1. Do you approve of changing the time for the meeting of the Legislature from June to January, and of changing the time when the terms of office of the executive and legislative departments shall commence, and the other amendments in conformity therewith, as proposed in the amended Constitution?

2. Do you approve of compensating the members of both houses of the Legislature by a fixed salary, as proposed in the amended Constitution?

3. Do you approve of filling vacancies in the Senate by a new election, as proposed in the amended Constitution?

4. Do you approve of having the Speaker of the House act as Governor in case of vacancies in the offices of Governor and President of the Senate, as proposed in the amended Constitution?

5. Do you approve of inserting in the Constitution an article prohibiting the manufacture or sale, or keeping for sale, of alcoholic or intoxicating liquor as a beverage, as proposed in the amended Constitution?

6. Do you approve of amending Article six of the Bill of Rights, making the same non-sectarian, as proposed in the amended Constitution?

7. Do you approve of amending the Constitution with reference to representation in classed towns, as proposed in the amended Constitution?

10th. To see if the town will appropriate a sum not exceeding fifty dollars for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

11th. To see what disposition the town will make of the proceeds of the Eldridge fund, or act thereon.

12th. To see if the town will raise the sum of five hundred and eighty dollars to pay the balance of indebtedness on the memorial hall building.

13th. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the

south easterly part of Church street, lying east of its intersection with Park street.

14th. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for concrete walks.

No. scholars 40; wages \$32 and \$40. Primary, 2 terms of 10 weeks and 1 of 5, all taught by Agnes Lauder. No. scholars 40; wages \$28.

BUTMANVILLE.

Two terms of 10 weeks and 1 of 6, all taught by Miss Acsah Wood. No. scholars 25; wages \$24.

POVERTY LANE.

One term of 10 weeks taught by Mrs. Frances Taylor. One term of 10 weeks taught by Miss Julia Kenyon. One term of 6 weeks taught by Mr. Bert Smalley. No. of scholars 12; wages \$16 and \$20.

SCYTHEVILLE.
