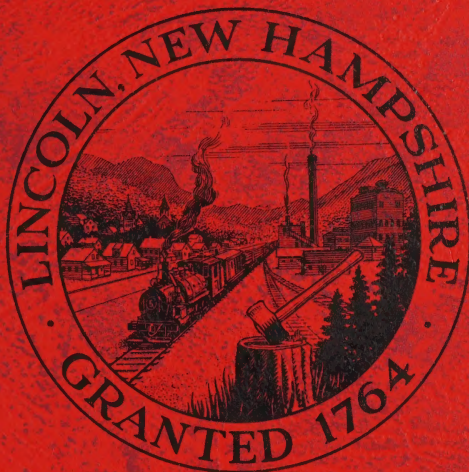

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**MINUTES OF TOWN MEETING**  
**MARCH 2, 1976**

-----

The Town Meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M. by Moderator Frederick Branscombe to take up Article #1: To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. The polls to stay open until 6; P.M. for this purpose.

Leslie Sargent moved that the Town Meeting be recessed until 7:30 P.M. at which time action will be taken at the Business Meeting on Articles #2 through #47. The motion was seconded by Diane Mayhew. The vote was in the affirmative.

For posterity it is noted here that the ballots were counted after the polls closed at 6:00 P.M. in an unusual manner. Moments prior to the closing of the polls the power failed in the area and the gymnasium was in darkness. A reasonable time had elapsed when David Mayhew decided to go to the Lincoln Mart and purchase some candles. On his return the ballots were removed from the ballot box and counted by six candle power light. The power and lights came back on approximately a half hour prior to the business meeting at 7:30 P.M. Incidentally, the R.S.A.'s give no indication that we need fear a call for a recount due to counting by candle light.

At 7:30 P.M. Fred Branscombe reconvened the Town Meeting for the purpose of action on Articles #2 through #47. Roger Stewart moved to dispense with reading of the entire warrant, this was seconded by David Mayhew. Vote on the question was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #2: To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

George McGee Sr. moved and Murray Clark seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$22,706 to defray Town charges. David Mayhew moved to amend Article #2 to increase the appropriation \$1,589.00. (\$1,089.00 for North Country Council and \$500.00 for the Planning Board.) George McGee Sr. seconded the amendment. The vote on the amendment was in the affirmative. The original article as amended with the total now reading \$24,295.00 was voted in the affirmative.



ARTICLE #3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for District Court Expenses.

George McGee Sr. moved that \$8,830.00 be raised and appropriated for District Court expenses. David Mayhew seconded the motion. The vote without discussion was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #4. To see how much money will be raised and appropriated for the operation and maintenance of the Town Building.

Daniel Bourassa moved and Shirley Avery seconded the motion that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,950.00 for the operation and maintenance of the Town Building. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Employee's Retirement and Social Security Taxes.

Earl Rannacher moved and Robert Alger seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,500.00 for Retirement and Social Security Taxes. No discussion. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a Contingency Fund.

It was moved by Barbara Branscombe and seconded by Roland Bourassa to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for a contingency fund. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department.

A general discussion followed the reading of this article, mainly the question of coverage by the department with the budget presented. The budget is for twenty four hour coverage. It was also explained the monies in the budget for patrol on the Kancamagus—Wilderness Trail are refundable by the U.S. Forest Service.

Sherwood Avery moved the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$55,782.00 for the Police Department; the motion was seconded by Roland Bourassa. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #8. To see how much money the Town will vote to

raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

No discussion. Clifton Dauphine moved and Robert Alger seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,543.00 for the Fire Department. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to cover payment for all forms of insurance.

It was moved and seconded by Robert Leclair and Clifton Dauphine to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,577.00 to cover payment of all forms of insurance. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense.

Clifton Dauphine moved and Earl Rannacher seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Civil Defense.

Daniel Bourassa moved to amend the article to increase the appropriation by \$24,000.00 with the \$16,300.00 to be raised by taxes, \$8,000.00 will come from the Burndy Corp.; the purpose of the increase to finance the operation of the communication center at the Lincoln Police Station. Clifton Dauphine seconded the amended motion. The discussion on this article brought out the desire of a majority of the voters to be able to get an immediate response when faced with an emergency requiring police, firemen, ambulance, etc.

Max Welch moved and Murray Clark seconded the motion to vote on the amendment by secret ballot. By show of hands the vote was negative on a secret ballot use for voting on the amendment.

On the amendment to raise \$24,000.00 with \$16,000.00 to be raised by taxes the vote was in the affirmative.

On the original motion to raise and appropriate \$300.00 with the amount now reading \$24,300.00 the vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Health Department.

Earl Mannacher moved and Clifton Dauphine seconded to



raise and appropriate the sum of \$17,312.00 for the Health Department. The breakdown to be \$12,500.00 for Linwood Medical Center—\$1,625.00 White Mt. Community Service—\$2,687.00 North Country Home Health—\$500.00 Littleton Hospital. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to operate and maintain the Sewer System.

The motion was made by Clifton Dauphine and Seconded by Robert Alger to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,594.00 to operate and maintain the Sewer System. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #13. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to operate and maintain the Town Dump.

Discussion on this article pointed out the precarious position of the Town in reference to the present dump site. This land does not belong to the Town and the dump remains at the discretion of the land owner. A dump site and/or solid waste program is one of the pressing problems to be faced up to by the Town.

Robert Leclerc moved and Clifton Dauphine seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to operate and maintain the dump. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance.

The discussion on this article centered on the plowing of private driveways. David Mayhew Explained and read the directive from the Dept. of Revenue Administration as stated in the Summary of Findings and Recommendations which is submitted with the Audit of the Town Accounts. Laurence Gilman asked to go on record as being opposed to the plowing of private driveways. George McGee took exception with the directive, his contention being that if the Town so votes to plow driveways, it is a mandate and supercedes and directive by the Revenue Dept.

Earl Rannacher moved and Shirley Avery seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$48,000.00 for Town Maintenance. The vote was in the affirmative. Those in attendance were assured the Town would proceed with the plowing as in the past and the amount to do so was included in this budget.

ARTICLE #15. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lighting.

Robert Leclerc moved and Edward Clark seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,000.00 for Street Lighting. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$159.45, the State to contribute \$1,062.99 for Town Road Aid.

Daniel Bourassa moved and Robert Leclerc seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$159.45, the State to contribute \$1,062.99 for Town Road Aid. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Public Library.

Roger Stewart moved the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,610.00 for the Town Public Library. Robert Leclerc seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #18. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of Town Poor.

George McGee Sr. moved the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for support of Town Poor. The motion was seconded by David Mayhew. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #19. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

David Mayhew moved and Robert Leclerc seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Old Age Assistance. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #20. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Recreation.

Earl Rannacher moved the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for Recreation. The motion was seconded by Robert Leclerc. The vote was in the affirmative. \$2,000.00 to come from North Woodstock.

ARTICLE #21. To see how much the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to operate and maintain the Water Systems.

David Mayhew moved and George McGee Sr. seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,894.00 to operate and maintain the Water Systems. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #22. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cemeteries.

Roland Bourassa moved the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for Cemeteries. Shirley Avery seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #23. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Advertising and Regional Associations.

William Hogan moved the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,150.00 for Advertising and Regional Associations, Robert Alger seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative. The breakdown to be, Chamber of Commerce \$500.00—White Mt. Regions Asso. \$500.00—N.H. Humane Society \$150.00.

ARTICLE #24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Shirley Avery moved and Edward Clark seconded the motion to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #25. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize the selectmen to expend on the Projects, and /or Debt Retirement Schedules voted in this warrant that may develop from monies paid in the Town by the State or Federal Government.

Robert Leclerc moved and Shirley Avery seconded the motion to appropriate and authorize the selectmen to expend on the projects, and/or Debt Retirement Schedules voted in this warrant that may develop from monies paid in the Town by the State or Federal Government. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to convey any real estate obtained by tax collector's deed and to execute any deed or deeds thereof in the name of the Town.



Alan Rutherford moved the Town authorize the selectmen to convey any real estate obtained by Tax Collector's deed and to execute any deed or deeds thereof in the name of the Town. The motion was seconded by William Hogan. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #27. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of all Debt Retirement Schedules due during the ensuing year. Roger Stewart moved the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$283,032.50 for the payment of all Debt Retirement Schedules due during the ensuing year. The motion was seconded by Robert Leclerc. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #28. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to apply for and expend any monies that may be forthcoming for the Federal Emergency Manpower Program.

Roger Stewart moved to authorize the selectmen to apply for and expend any monies that may be forthcoming for the Federal Emergency Manpower Program. The motion was seconded by Robert Leclerc. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #29. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Legal Expenses.

Earl Rannacher moved and Roland Bourassa seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for Legal Expenses. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #30. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Patriotic Purposes.

Daniel Bourassa moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for Patriotic Purposes. The motion was seconded by Shirley Avery. \$5,000.00 to be used by the Bicentennial Committee and \$1,000.00 to be used for the Fourth of July. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,357.37 for a 4 WD Pickup Truck and Plow.

Clifton Dauphine moved the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,357.37 for a 4 WD Pickup truck and Plow. The motion was seconded by William Hogan. The vote was in the affir-

mative.

ARTICLE #32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for a used Snow Cat for use of Civil Defense and the Ski Slope.

Clifton Dauphine moved the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for a used Snow Cat for use of Civil Defense and the Ski Slope. Alan Rutherford seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative with one nay vote recorded.

ARTICLE #33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,900.00 for a new Police Cruiser.

Roland Bourassa moved and Earl Rannacher seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,900 for a New Police Cruiser. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000.00 for the Research and/or Development of a Solid Waste Disposal System.

Robert Alger moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000.00 for the Research and/or Development of a Solid Waste Disposal System. Clifton Dauphine seconded the motion. Leslie Sargent updated the voters on the findings of the Dump Committee. There are various avenues that may be pursued such as Sanitary Land Fill, Local Incinerator, or a Regional Incinerator. There is no area in Lincoln or Woodstock that will pass the standards set by the State and Federal Government for a Sanitary Land Fill. The expense of an incinerator of one kind or another is an unknown factor but surely is excessive considering that all waste will not be consumed by the incinerator and the State and Federal Government standards will be fluctuating. It is a critical problem, says Mr. Sargent, and must be faced up to. The vote on the question was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70,000.00 for Street Paving.

George McGee Sr. moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$70,000.00 for Street Paving. The motion was seconded by William Hogan. The question was asked if the Town would seek quotes from more than one paving company and the answer was, yes. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and ap-

appropriate the sum of \$24,000.00 for a New Dump Truck (5 ton) and Plow with Wing.

Clifton Dauphine moved and Albert Clogston seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,000.00 for the new dump truck and plow. George McGee Sr. took the floor to inform the voters about a truck the Hazelton Co. in Manchester has on their premises for sale. It is equipped with the plows the Town needs, it has a Sander Body, and is somewhat more sophisticated than the truck the Town would be purchasing from the State Purchasing Agency. The agency which holds the state bid for trucks can not at this time give a delivery date, in fact they are not too anxious to take an order for the truck we would be needing. To purchase the truck which Hazelton has would require an additional \$9,000.00 to the original \$24,000.00 anticipated.

After much discussion, Alan Rutherford moved to amend Article #36 and add \$9,000.00 to the appropriation. This motion was seconded by Albert Clogston. The vote was in the affirmative. At this juncture, Murray Clark moved for a standing vote on the original question. It was explained that a "No" vote would mean no truck; a "Yes" vote would be favoring purchasing a truck. On the vote by a show of hands, the count was 23 yes — 8 no. The original question passing by majority vote.

Roger Stewart moved to reconsider the vote on the amendment; seconded by Daniel Bourassa. On the vote by show of hands to reconsider, the count was 24 yes — 11 opposed. The amendment stands by majority vote. The moderator now asked for a vote on the original article as amended with the amount now to be raised and appropriated for a new truck at \$33,000.00. The vote by show of hands was 29 yeas—opposed-0.

ARTICLE #37. David Mayhew moved to pass over articles #37—#38—#39 and #40. Motion seconded by Robert Leclerc. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #41. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to select either the N.H. Department of Revenue, Division of Municipal Accounting or a private accredited or professionally capable auditing firm to audit the Town of Lincoln's Books.



Roger Stewart moved and Robert Leclerc seconded the motion to authorize the selectmen to select either the N.H. Dept. of Revenue, Division of Municipal Accounting or a private accredited or professionally capable auditing firm to audit the Town of Lincoln's Books. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #42. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and transfer to the General Administration Account, \$20,000.00 to be applied to the maintenance and administration of the Police Department.

Earl Rannacher moved and Robert Leclerc seconded the motion to appropriate from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and transfer to the General Administration Account \$20,000.00 to be applied to the maintenance and administration of the Police Department. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #43. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize the selectmen to apply to budget items the interest received on taxes and deposits.

Roger Stewart moved and Robert Alger seconded the motion to appropriate and authorize the selectmen to apply to budget items the interest received from taxes and deposits. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #44. To see what action the Town will take in accepting as a Town Road the entry road to the Rutherford Property off Pollard Road.

This road is approximately 350' in length and is 47' wide. It is built in compliance with Town specifications. Alan Rutherford moved and Laurence Gilman seconded the motion that the Town accept the entry road to the Rutherford Property off Pollard Road. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #45. To see what action the Town will take in accepting as Town Roads the roads at Loon Mountain Recreation Area, i.e. Beechwood Acres, so-called.

George McGee Sr. moved and David Mayhew seconded the motion to accept as Town Roads the Roads at Loon Mountain Recreation Area, i.e. Beechwood Acres, so-called. The vote was in the affirmative. The roads in question start at present Town Road at the Carroll Reed Shop and continues throughout the Beechwood Area. These roads are all paved but the selectmen

were asked to have the State Engineers check the roads for proper drainage etc. before actually accepting in writing.

ARTICLE #46. To see if the Town will vote to apply such sums of money to this years budget items as may accrue as surplus from past appropriations for repair to the Loon Mountain Bridge, if and when Federal Assistance monies are received.

Robert Alger moved and Earl Rannacher seconded the motion to authorize the selectmen to apply such sums of money to this years budget items as may accrue as surplus from past appropriations for repairs to the Loon Mountain Bridge, if and when Federal Assistance monies are received. The vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLES #37, #38, #39, #40.

The articles which were passed over earlier in the meeting were all concerned with the enlargement and improvement of the water and sewer systems, and authorizations to apply for State and Federal Aid to effect these changes. There is need to have further study before presenting these articles to the voters. The selectmen need specifics on the extent of improvements and enlargements and on the cost of the projects. Therefore the selectmen request the Town Meeting be recessed until September 1976 for the purpose of further study.

A Resolution was presented by the Budget Committee and read to the voters by Committee Member Helen Gilman.

“The Budget Committee asks that the following resolution be entered in the Town Records: To Henry Waldo we would like to express our gratitude and appreciation for his many years of work on the Budget Committee, most of which were in the capacity of Chairman.”

George McGee Sr. moved for adoption of the Resolution as read by Mrs. Helen Gilman and to physically show our appreciation by standing. The move for adoption was seconded by David Mayhew; the vote was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #47. George McGee Sr. moved this meeting stand in recess until September 21, 1976 at 7:30 P.M. at which time Articles #37, #38, #39, #40 will be taken up with proper and concise information for voter consideration. Albert Clogston seconded

the motion. The vote to recess was in the affirmative. The Meeting of March 2, 1976 recessed at eleven-0-five P.M. (11:05 P.M.).

**RECESSED TOWN MEETING OF  
OCTOBER 26, 1976, 7:30 P.M.

The Recessed Town Meeting was called to order by Fred Branscombe, Moderator, at 7:30 P.M., October 26, 1976 to act upon four articles (#37, #38, #39, #40). At the Annual Town Meeting, March 2, 1976 it was voted to recess the meeting to Sept. 21, 1976 at 7:30 P.M. to consider these articles. On Sept. 21, 1976 it was voted to further recess the meeting to Oct. 26, 1976 at 7:30 P.M. The purpose of the recesses was to obtain certain necessary engineering reports.

ARTICLE #37. Laurence Gilman moved and George McGee Sr. seconded the motion to pass over Article #37 at this time. This article will be put in the Warrant for the next Town Meeting in March 1977.

The vote to pass over Article #37 was unanimous.

ARTICLE #38. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen, until directed to the contrary at a subsequent Town Meeting, to apply, negotiate and do all things necessary to obtain Federal, State, or other assistance as may be available for the improvement and enlargement of the Municipal Water Systems, and to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of said assistance as outlined in N.H. R.S.A. 33:7-BET SEQ; as amended, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Earl Rannacher moved the selectmen be given the authorization as outlined in the above Article #38. The motion was seconded by N.N. Bartlett. Put to a vote, the motion carried unanimously.

ARTICLE #39. Laurence Gilman moved and George McGee Sr. seconded the motion to pass over Article #39 at this time. This article with Article #37 is concerned with Sewerage Facilities which the Town is not prepared to consider at this time. Further consideration will be done at the March 1977 Town Meeting on this article.

The vote to pass over Article #39 was unanimous.

ARTICLE #40. To see what sums the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of improvement and enlarge-

ment of the Municipal Water Systems including Pump Stations, Treatment Works, and such other related facilities inclusive of land acquisition, easements, and rights of way as are required, such sums to be raised by the issuance of Serial Bonds under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act. (Chap. 33 of the N.H. Statutes Annotated 1955 and any amendments thereto) and to authorize the selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such action as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale, and delivery of such bonds, as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Lincoln, and to pass any vote thereto.

The moderator explained to the voters present, the purpose of this Article #40. The Town wishes to apply for EDA Funds that have very recently become available under the Public Works Employment Act. The funds available to the State of New Hampshire are minimal and the projects funded will be few. The Board of Selectmen wish to apply for funding for a portion of our overall water study recommendations. The project chosen for funding is the 800,000 gallon water storage tank to be located in the vicinity of Mansion Hill Drive. Necessary items not included in project costs are engineering for project status and site acquisition; consequently, the sum of \$32,000.00 is needed for these costs and is available from the Town Surplus.

George McGee Sr. moved to amend the article as follows; To appropriate the sum of \$32,000.00 for the purpose of improvement and enlargement of the Municipal Water Systems including pump stations, treatment works, and other such related facilities inclusive of land acquisition, easements, and rights of way as are required; such sums to be taken from surplus Town monies. The motion was seconded by Laurence Gilman. The motion carried unanimously.

Roger Stewart moved that the Selectmen under advice of Town Counsel and consent of the Budget Committee, be authorized to perfect the language of Article #40 but not change the intent of the motion or the amount of money to be appropriated. The motion was seconded by Henry Waldo. The vote was in the affirmative.

George McGee Sr. moved and Earl Rannacher seconded the motion to adjourn. The vote was in the affirmative.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:17 P.M.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen, until directed to the contrary at a subsequent Town Meeting, to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal, State, or other assistance as may be available for the improvement and enlargement of the Municipal Water Systems, and to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of said assistance as outlined in N.H. R.S.A. 33:7-B ET SEQ., as amended and to pass any vote relating thereto.
38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 for the purpose of preparing a facilities plan on sewerage and sewage treatment facilities which are requirements contained in the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251 ET SEQ.) and will qualify the Town for Federal Funds, such sum to be raised by the issuance of serial bonds or notes not to exceed \$15,000.00 under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act. (NH R.S.A. 33.1 ET SEQ., as amended) and to authorize the selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds or notes as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Lincoln, and to allow the selectmen to expend such monies as become available from the Federal Government under the Financial Assistance Program of the construction grants section of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251 ET SEQ.) and pass any vote relating thereto.
39. To see what sums the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of improvement and enlargement of the Municipal Water Systems including pump stations, treatment works, and such other related facilities inclusive of land acquisition, easements, and rights of way as are required, such sums to be raised by the issuance of serial bonds under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Chap. 33 of the N.H. Statutes Annotated 1955 and any amendments thereto) and to authorize the selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such action as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale,



and delivery of such bonds, as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Lincoln, and pass any vote thereto.

40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to select either the N.H. Department of Revenue, Division of Municipal Accounting or a private accredited or professionally capable auditing firm to audit the Town of Lincoln books.
41. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize the selectmen to apply to budget items the interest received on taxes and deposits.
42. To see if the Town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the Board of Selectmen to complete the Eligibility Application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration.

#### RESOLUTION A

WHEREAS, certain areas of Lincoln are subject to periodic flooding from streams, rivers, etc., causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, relief is available in the form of Federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Town Meeting to require the recognition and evaluation of flood hazards in all official actions relating to land use in the flood plain areas having special flood hazards; and

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to New Hampshire RSA chapter 31, 36, 156, and 136A.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved, that this Town Meeting hereby:

1. Assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it intends to enact and maintain in force for those areas having defined flood hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the criteria set forth in section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and

2. Vests (the Planning Board or other duly authorized Municipal Officer) with the responsibility, authority, and means to:

(a) Delineate or assist the administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the areas having special flood hazards on available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of building sites.

(b) Provide such information as the administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain.

(c) Cooperate with Federal, State, and Local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify flood plain areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining floodplains in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.

(d) Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility and annual report to the administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and implementation of floodplain management measures.

3. Appoints the Building Permit Officer (Board of Selectmen or Building Inspector) to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request a record of elevations (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures located in the special flood hazard areas. If the lowest floor is below grade on one or more sides, the elevation of the floor immediately above must also be recorded.

4. Intends to take such other official action within its powers as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program.

Article 43. To see if the Town will vote to establish the following building regulation pursuant to RSA 156 as follows:

1. The building Permit Officer (Board of Selectmen or Building Inspector) shall review all building permit applications for new construction or substantial improvements to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a location that has a flood hazard, any proposed new construction or substantial improvement (including prefabricated and mobile homes) must (1) be designed (or modified) and anchored to prevent flotation,

collapse, or lateral movement of the structure, (II) use construction materials and utility equipment that are resistant to flood damage, and (III) use construction methods and practices that will minimize flood damage.

44. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Town Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its discretion new subdivisions and plats thereof as provided New Hampshire RSA Chapter 36: Section 19-29 inclusive and Section 34.
45. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the flooding ordinance:  
 No person, firm or corporation shall erect any new building or structure, or make substantial improvements to an existing building or structure, or cause to be done, within the Town of Lincoln without first obtaining a permit from the Building Permit Officer (Board of Selectmen or Building Inspector).
46. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
