SCHOOL REPORT.

In again presenting our annual report as required by law, it gives us pleasure to report that the schools in town, notwithstanding there has been much sickness among teachers and scholars (which has been a disadvantage) yet, taken together the results have been very satisfactory.

Female teachers have been employed in all schools with the exception of No. 5. We have been obliged to change teachers in two of the schools. The teachers have been earnest and faithful in their work; and their aim has been to give the scholars the best practical knowledge of their studies possible, and it is very satisfactory to the board to be able to say that they have succeeded remarkably well, and as a result the schools are in better condition than ever before, and we are glad to report an increasing interest manifested by the parents for the improvement of the children.

We call careful attention to the cost per scholar for each school during the year. If some of the schools could be consolidated it would result beneficially both to scholars and district. We believe that much better results can be obtained in a school of not less than thirty scholars than otherwise. We are now obliged to mix the primary with the grammar scholars, but the interests of education would be advanced by their separation; and we recommend that at least two grammar schools be established in the town

that our people may be relieved from the expense of sending their children out of town to receive their education.

The school board desire that the schools of Londonderry should rank with the best in the state, and while we deprecate increasing our expenditures, yet we believe that the time has come when it is absolutely necessary that we take some action in this matter.

The brick schoolhouse in No. 7 is unsafe, and a new building is necessary. All other school buildings are in good condition; there have been twenty-nine weeks schooling during the year in all schools, excepting No. 8, which has had 32 weeks because of the Adams fund.

The cost per scholar in each school for the year has been, No. 1, \$14.00; No. 2, \$16.37; No. 3, \$22.50; No. 4, \$14.70; No. 5, \$22.50; No. 6, \$38.50; No. 7, \$8.33; No. 8, \$10.63; No. 9, \$30.80. Number of children reported by the selectmen April 1, 1894, 218; boys, 129; girls, 89; whole number of scholars not less than five years of age who have attended school not less than two weeks, 177; number of visits by school board, 51; number of visitors, 466. The following are the textbooks in use: Bible, New Normal Reader, Warren's Geography, Raub's Grammar, Raub's Arithmetic, practical and mental, Worcester Speller, Campbel's U. S. History, Brand's Lessons on the Human Body, Meservy's Bookkeeping, Business Standard Copy Books.
