TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Marlow, in the County of Cheshire, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Jones Hall, in said Marlow, on Tuesday, the Fourteenth day of March, next at seven of the clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the Town Poor.

4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the Town Library.

5. To see if the Town will apply for Class V money, known as TRA, and raise the sum of \$462.65 matched with \$3,084.34 contributed by the State.

6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of Highways and Bridges.

7. To see if the Town will raise \$105.00 as may be necessary for the observance of Memorial Day.

8. To see if the Town will raise such sums of money as may be necessary to improve Town cemeteries.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$65.88, to the Monadnock Region Association, an agency to advertise, promote, and preserve the natural advantages and resources of the town in co-operation with the other 37 towns of the Monadnock Region. 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to be matched by the State, for brush removal on back roads.

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust Program.

12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$197.00 for the year 1967 in support of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital for the year 1967.

13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell and administer all real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector deeds.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the tax collector to give two per cent cash discount on all property and personal taxes, for the payment made within thirty days after date of bill and empower the collector to appoint a deputy collector.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for temporary loans, in anticipation of taxes.

16. To see if the Town will vote to order the Selectmen to place a restraining order on dogs in the municipal limits of the Town Pursuant to RSA Chapter 466, Sec. 29,30.

17. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$3,000.00 for the purpose of making repairs on the Symondsville Bridge, so-called, such sums to be raised through the issuance of serial notes, and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such notes, and determine the time and place of payment thereof under such terms and conditions as they deem to be the best interest of the Town.

18. To see if the Town will vote to sell obsolete fire equipment. (Old Fire Truck).

19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the purchase of a new adding machine and a new chain saw.

20. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the purchase and installation of three new

Dry Fire Hydrants. And, also the construction of an access road to the Town well. (school playground).

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the operation of Beano Games.

22. To see if the Town of Marlow will vote to change the status of the West Shore Drive at Sand Pond in Marlow to a Class V Highway (year round) subject to an agreement with the Town of Lempster.

23. To see what action the Town will take in regard to those items in the budget not covered in the preceding articles.

24. To see if the Town will vote to accept any trust funds left to it during the ensuing year.

25. To hear reports of officers, agents and committees, theretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto, and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.

6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or other officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose agents, auditors, committees, or other officers in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see if the district will vote to accept the provisions of Title I, II and III, Public Law 89-10 (Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965), and to appropriate such sums as may be available to the district under said Federal Act for such particular projects as may be determined by the school board. Further, to see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.

9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to enter into an exclusive tuition contract with the Keene

School District as provided in RSA 194:2a for the education of its junior high school pupils for a period not to exceed three years, beginning in September, 1967, or to take any action relating thereto.

10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to enter into an exclusive tuition contract with the Fall Mountain Regional School District as provided in RSA 194:2a for the education of its junior high school pupils for a period not to exceed three years, beginning in September, 1967, or take any action relating thereto.

11. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to enter into an exclusive tuition contract with the Fall Mountain Regional School District as provided in RSA 194:2a for the education of its high school pupils for a period not to exceed three years, beginning in September, 1967, or take any action relating thereto.

12. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to enter into an exclusive tuition contract with the Keene School District as provided in RSA 194:2a for the education of its high school pupils for a period not to exceed three years, beginning in September, 1967, or take any action relating thereto.

13. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate Five Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$5,980.00) per year for a period of three years to transport its junior and senior high school pupils to Keene.

14. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate Six Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$6,700.00) per year for a period of three years to transport its junior and senior high school pupils to the Fall Mountain Regional School District.

15. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to continue a duo-tuition program to the Keene School District and the Fall Mountain Regional School District for its junior and senior high school students.

16. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school

board to negotiate a tuition contract with the Keene School District.

17. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government, the State of New Hampshire, or any federal, state, or private agency.

18. To see if the district will vote to instruct the school board to tuition grade VII and VIII to the assigned school district, the total cost of the project to be paid in part or in whole from Public Law 89-10 federal funds.

19. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the district.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Marlow:

Under a tuition program planned and initiated by your school board and Mr. Elliott W. Keach, your former Superintendent of School, the 7th and 8th grade students from Marlow entered either the Keene Junior High School or the Vilas Elementary School. This was done under Title I funds made available under Public Law 89-10 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965.

The project was submitted after your district meeting and approved shortly before the opening of school in early September. Following the approval, a public meeting was held to discuss where the children would be tuitioned for the coming school year. District voters present were informed that the original intent of the project was to tuition the children to Keene. The end result was that six children went to Keene and three to the Vilas Elementary School. This number represented one more student than anticipated.

As you review the 1967-68 budget requests, you will notice a substantial increase over the previous year. The increase is reflected in two areas, the total cost to send some thirty-three students outside the school district to either Keene High and Junior High Schools or the Fall Mountain Regional High School and the Vilas Elementary School and to transport the 7th and 8th grade students to whichever school the voters decide. With the lower grade enrollments being larger, you may expect additional increases in these areas over the years.

UNION REORGANIZATION

Early in the year Mr. Newell Paire, Deputy Commissioner of Education, informed the board and the administration of the new union reorganization planned for the 1967-68 school year. As part of the reorganization Westmoreland and Chesterfield, present members of Supervisory #60, along with Nelson, Harrisville, and Marlborough will be added to the Keene School District to form the new Supervisory Union #29 under Mr. John Day, Superintendent of Schools. The Marlow School District will remain as part of the Supervisory Union #60. This change will become effective on July 1, 1967.

DISTRICT MEETING

The district meeting to be held in March, 1967, will probably be the most important meeting in recent years. With Union #60 breaking up, with Union #29 incorporating five outlying school districts and having become the receiving district for the A.R.E.A. Plan, with the transportation of our students becoming a greater problem each year, and with climbing tuition rates, it becomes all the more obvious and necessary to give serious consideration to sending all our tuition students to either Keene or the Fall Mountain School District. We can no longer afford a divided community in this regard.

The School Warrant affecting the 1967-68 school year has articles covering all eventualities. The final decision is one to be rendered by you, the voters of the Marlow School District.

REPORT OF THE MONADNOCK CHILDREN'S SPECIAL SERVICES CENTER TITLE III

This is a Center where school children may go to receive special help with school problems. It should be made clear at once that this Center is operated by your school district. Actually five supervisory unions in this part of New Hampshire worked together in planning the project and the plan was approved, and is financed by the United States Office of Education Act of 1965, or PACE program. It will serve as a model of what can be done to help school children with their problems, be they physical handicaps, learning problems or the difficulties which arise when young people are upset and confused.

All in all, then the Center provides the type of help which local school districts could not afford on their own. Through the Center, it is possible to pool information on a pupil; his physical endition, his abilities and weak points. Having acquired a rather complete picture of the pupil, all concerned can sit down together to see that there is understanding and co-operation which is necessary to help the child.

The Center has received 150 referrals for help from the five school systems involved (Fall Mountain, Keene, Monadnock Regional, Peterborough and Winchester) since our opening October 19, 1966. Some cases are completed, and others are in various stages of procedure.

While there are many ways of referring a child to the Center, we will list the major ones: the school principal, school nurse, guidance counselor, the classroom teacher, the family doctor, or parents who feel children need help. There is no charge for any of the services provided at the Center, but parents are encouraged to co-operate in many ways, such as transportation to the Center when the child may be scheduled for any one of many evaluations.

As stated above, this is a pilot project, or a new idea, and is the only Center of its kind in the Eastern United States, and will require the support and interest of all involved, in order to do the very best possible job of helping children, which is the sole reason the Center has been established.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE FOR MARLOW

 - 8 Pupils were checked for Smallpox vaccination and necessary follow-up done
 - 9 Pupils participated in Urine Screening Program

Health talks given in classroom by School Nures.

The school nurse continues to serve each community as their yearly needs present themselves. With continued co-operation from the school personnel and parents we are able to discover health problems and correct them. The building of healthful attitudes is ever present and the prevention of health problems continues to be one of our aims.

The Health Service program is always varying and challenging. I wish to thank all who helped make this school health year a successful one.

FIRE RECORD

Fire records are made by people — those who cause fires and those who control them. Your forest fire warden, deputy wardens, fire chief and firemen have, in spite of a prolonged drought, made one of the best fire control records in recent years. Despite a very dry spring, we in New Hampshire working together, have substantially reduced our fire incidence (885 in 1965 to 595 in 1966.)

This enviable record is largely due to two factors:

- A closely coordinated and integrated state-town organization jointly carrying out programs of forest fire prevention, training and suppression with dedicated personnel.
- 2. Your appreciation of our forest fire control program and your individual effort in practicing fire prevention.

Statistics show, however, there is room for improvement. Major problems are still with us; (1) the careless disposal of cigarettes; (2) the householder's carelessness in burning rubbish; (3) the failure of woodlot owners and contractors to completely extinguish their brush burning fires; (4) failure to extinguish camp fires; (5) unsupervised children playing with matches.

New Hampshire has 4,339,000 acres of woodland to be protected. In 1966 we experienced 595 forest fires on this area and restricted acreage burned to 395 acres — a fine testimonial to the efficiency and dedication of the men who make up our firest fire control organization.

- 1. If you must burn you will need a permit. Permits are not issued between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. except on rainy days. Permits are not needed when the ground is covered with snow. To minimize risk the best way to dispose of rubbish is at your authorized town or municipal dumping area.
- 2. Be sure all discarded smoking material is out.
- 3. Don't leave a live camp or cooking fire.
- Most important Instruct your children that matches are not play things.
