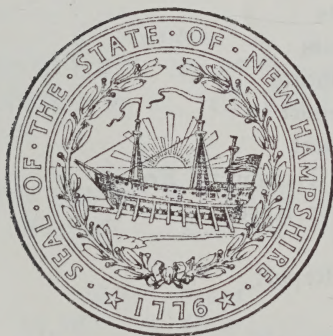

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at 10:00 A.M. in the forenoon, the Polls to close not earlier than 6:00 P.M., to act upon the following subjects:

Business meeting at 8:00 P.M.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of Highways and Bridges.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,041.01 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute the sum of \$6,940.09.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance and tarring of Class V roads.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,111.21 for principal and interest payment on Hough Pay-loader Note.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Cemeteries.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the care of the Village Cemetery.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of hospitals.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$50.00 for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.

15. (Petition) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Bristol Community Center.

16. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new truck equipped with snowplow, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate with the New Hampton Village Precinct for land for a new fire station.

18. To see if the Town will vote to confirm the vote taken at the Special Town Meeting held in September 1967 in regard to the sale of the Lougee Property.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,617.39 to be added to money previously appropriated to defray the costs of the 1967 reassessment.

20. ## REPORT OF THE NEW HAMPTON PLANNING BOARD

The New Hampton Planning Board met fifteen times during 1967. In April Mr. Leonard Huckins was elected to fill the vacancy created by Mr. Savard's resignation.

At the January, February and March meetings the Board spent much time in preparation for Town Meeting and dealt with interim reports and maps on Roads and Highways, Land Capability and Land Use. The Board voted to adopt Subdivision Regulations and secondly to request an appropriation for site valuation, preliminary sketches and cost of municipal building. There was much discussion of junk cars, trailers, mobile homes and suitable areas for Town recreational purposes.

At the April, May and June meetings C. Waring Blackburn of Klunder Associates presented interim reports on proposed Land Use, Capital Improvements Program and Budgeting and Community Facilities. Advice was sought from the Fire Department relative to the preference of a site for a new fire house. In conjunction with the Selectmen the Board discussed the necessity of finding a new dump site. The final plans for the publication of the Comprehensive Plan were made.

The July and August meetings were devoted to the preparation and revision of the Subdivision Regulations to be considered at the September adjourned Town Meeting. A public hearing on Subdivision Regulations was held at the Town House on August 9th. Copies of the proposed Regu-



lations were mailed to all Box Holders of the Town.

The Comprehensive Plan was printed and ready for distribution in October. Copies were distributed to all Town and Precinct Officers and all such officers were invited to the November 1st meeting of the Planning Board where the Comprehensive Plan was discussed. It was decided to have numbered copies of the Comprehensive Plan available at the Gordon-Nash Library.

At the November 29th meeting further discussion and revision of the Subdivision Regulations took place to incorporate changes as suggested at the special meeting in September and at the meeting with the precinct and town officials on November 1st.

It is hoped that many voters have studied the Comprehensive Plan which is available at the Gordon-Nash Library. It only has value if it is carefully studied.

3. Maintain a clean, safe dump.
4. Keep matches away from young children.
5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.
