TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. (Polls to close at 6 p. m.)

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for interest on same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Northwood Public Libraries.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for care of cemeteries.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to be put in capital reserve for the purchase of new road equipment.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$579.17 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$3,861.11.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 in addition to the \$579.17 for construction of T. R. A.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Merrimack Valley Region Association.

11. * To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for Concord Hospital.

12. To see what action the Town will take relative to closing of the following section of road, beginning at Junction of Mt. Ave. and Mountain Road, southerly direction to the Deerfield Road, and new approach of the New Road.

13. To see if the Town will vote to increase the salary of the Judge of Municipal Court to \$200.00.

14. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

REPORT OF NORTHWOOD VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Northwood Volunteer Fire Department answered 20 alarms in 1957:

- 6 chimney fires
- 1 grass fire in West Nottingham
- 2 fires caused by haying operations — 1 in Northwood and 1 in Barrington on Route 4
- 2 car fires — 1 in West Nottingham and 1 at Northwood Ridge
- 1 brush fire at Northwood Lake
- 1 gasoline pump fire
- 4 trips to town dump during fire ban
- 1 house fire at Northwood Center
- 2 out-of-town calls to assist at forest fires —
1 at Madbury and 1 at Pembroke

There were about 135 permits issued for fires.

Again this year, as in past years, the department has made considerable progress toward giving you better fire protection. We have acquired another tank truck which now gives us two tankers, one 775 gallons and one 600 gallons. This latest tanker was bought from the fire department's own funds to replace the Dodge truck which has always been at the Ridge. We also have another two-way radio, making all trucks, except one, radio controlled.

We have purchased our own base station which is in operation at the new fire house, also a 2500 watt portable generator, purchased through Civil Defense funds for all emergency needs.

The new Fire House and Civil Defense headquarters at Northwood Ridge is a wonderful addition to our department and we, the Volunteer Fire Department, wish to thank you, the people of Northwood, for your support in acquiring this new building. If you have not as yet

visited the new fire house, please feel free to do so. Visitors are always welcome.

Northwood has been very fortunate in having so few fires. Let's try and keep it this way. Be sure and get a permit from your forest fire warden before you kindle a fire out of doors.

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the school district will adopt as its school checklist the Town checklist, as provided in RSA 197:12a as inserted by Laws of 1957, Chapter 57; this provision to be effective for the 1959 and subsequent annual district meetings.

10. To see if the district will elect two representatives to work in an official capacity with others elected by the districts of Strafford, Nottingham, and Barrington for a continuing study of the Cooperative School District. (By Petition, 19 Signatures.)
