## SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The year 2007 was another eventful year for the Selectmen and the Town of Pittsburg. High points include having one of our Selectmen resign, and the Town receiving a FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant for \$237,500 for the purchase of a new tanker for our fire department.

Due to higher sale prices than our assessed values, our assessment ratio continued to decrease. After much discussion, we decided to conduct a 100% revaluation in the second year of our contract with Avitar Associates instead of the fourth year. While the overall tax rate dropped, the actual taxes paid for most taxpayers increased.

The Selectmen continue to be concerned about the amount of taxes paid to the County versus the benefits received. Pittsburg is the third highest taxpayer in the County. This year the Pittsburg taxpayers paid the County \$966,953 based on our 2006 valuation. Keep in mind the entire town operating budget is a little over a million dollars. The Town's assessed valuation continues to be the point of contention and some taxpayers believe the land is the key issue. Eighty-nine percent (89%) of our taxable land is under current use assessment which means no buildings and no people, and the Town's tax rate is set using those current use values. Eighteen percent (18%) of our total land area is tax exempt. The amount we are required to send to the County is calculated by using the "full equalized" value of all our land & buildings, including some State and Federal land, and that equalization added almost \$73 million over and above our 2006 town valuation.

For another tax issue, the following Monday after last year's Town Meeting was when TransCanada declared they were putting 2,214 acres of their land in current use which cost the Town over \$54,000 in tax dollars in 2007. In the last nine years, the USGen/TransCanada property value has been reduced by over \$16 million and they are no longer our highest taxpayer.

The Town tax rate was up from \$1.43 in 2006 to \$1.62 in 2007. This was primarily due to reduced revenue. In 2006 we received an extra \$50,100 from the sale of the Bacon lot, and in 2007, the timber tax was cut in half with a decrease of \$68,709. Also for the second year in a row, income from motor vehicle registrations has declined. Although the decrease was only \$12,533 over the two-year period, it is still a concern.

We had a major problem at the transfer station with the compactor experiencing a serious mechanical problem. We had to either purchase a new one for approximately \$24,000 or fix our current 16-year old compactor. We decided to overhaul the old one for a cost of \$5,350. Also, the transfer station faced new requirements for recycling televisions and computers and a new building needed to be built to store those items. All the buildings received a new paint job at the same time.

In June, Selectman Scottie Owen verbally notified the Board Chairman that he was resigning immediately because he had moved out of the area. After much discussion, the decision was made to appoint Merrill Dalton to fill the rest of Selectman Owen's term.

After taxpayers defeated a motion to purchase a new fire truck at last year's Town Meeting, the fire department applied for a FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant to purchase a new tanker. The grant for \$237,500 was approved, the truck chassis has been purchased, and the body is being built. The Pittsburg Firemen's Association is kicking in another \$12,500 toward that purchase from the funds they earn at their annual auctions and from other donations.

The Town also received almost \$22,000 from a FEMA Disaster Grant as a result of the April Nor'easter which damaged culverts and several roads. This grant allowed the Town to add gravel to Halls Stream Rd, Indian Stream Rd, and Tabor Rd. In addition, we were able to replace two culverts on Back Lake Rd.


After considerable debate and much "advice", we decided to dig up the damaged portion of Day Road and replace it with gravel. The cost to provide the proper foundation and asphalt on the selected section was considered to be cost prohibitive.


Several other issues merit brief comments. First, we didn't have major water problems this year as we have had for the past two years. Second, we did have some problem with sewer pumps but were able to either fix or purchase the appropriate pumps. We also appointed a new Fire Ward, Arnold Gray, after the resignation of Wayne Howe. The final touches were placed on a new town web site, funded through the New Hampshire Charitable Trust from the Tillotson fund. We received 75 building permits during 2007 and sent out fourteen \$50 penalty letters for those we didn't receive. The highway department received its new F-450 plow truck in mid-summer.


The most time consuming and controversial activity was the Town's participation in creating a regional paid ambulance group. This has meant Selectmen participation in meetings about every two weeks in an effort to create a non-profit ambulance service that would reduce response times to all towns participating. This included creating a non-profit corporation, creating by-laws, determining staff requirements, creating a budget, and determining a town funding formula, among other things.

We have committed ourselves to keeping the town's operating budget down. However, the escalating fuel prices will be consuming a lot more of that budget and putting a harder crunch on all departments.

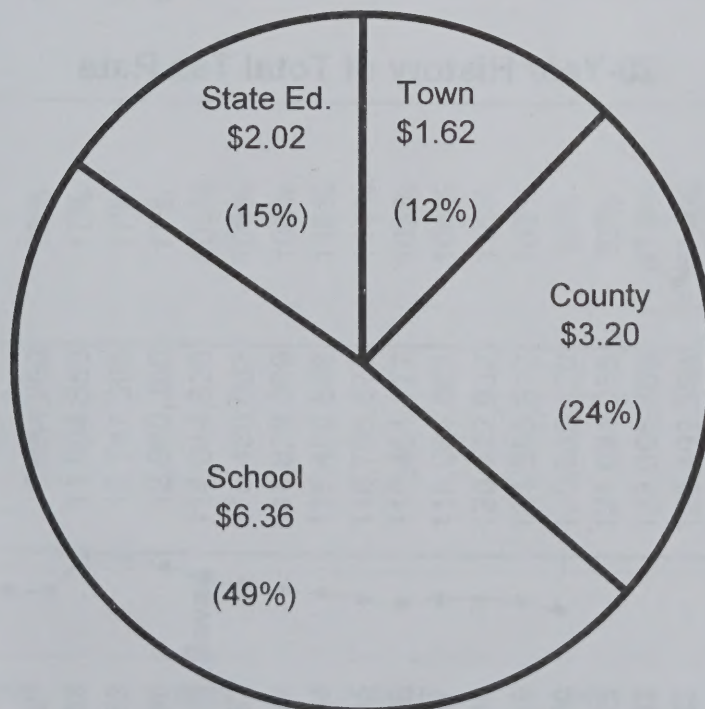

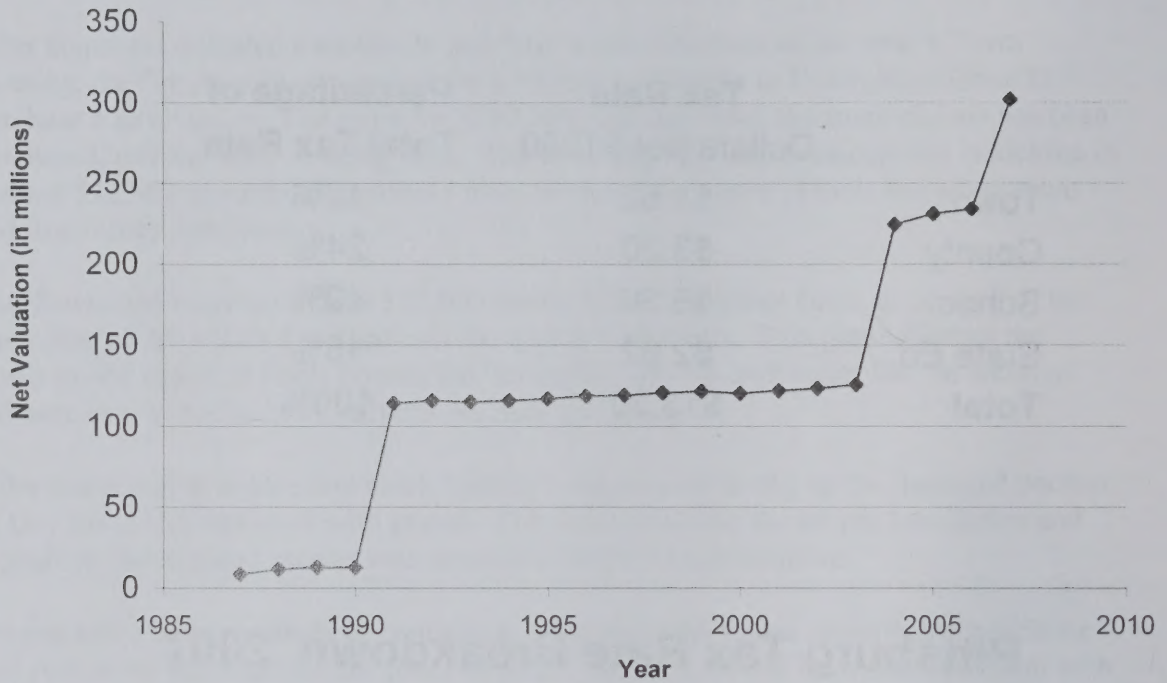

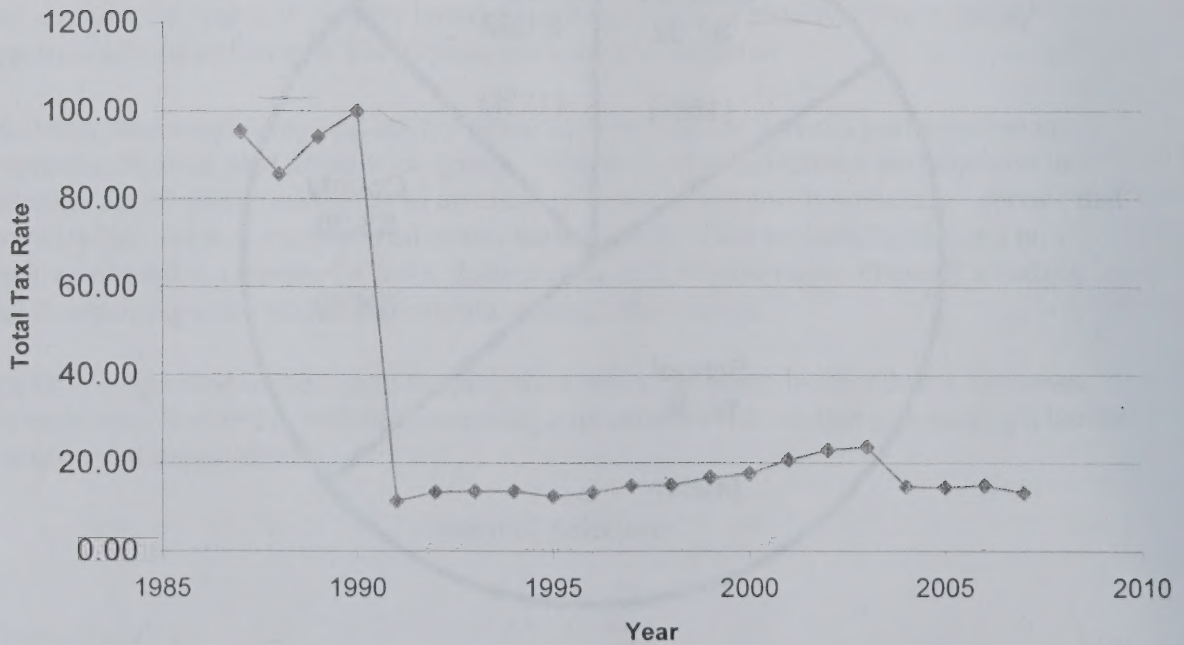
## Pittsburg Tax Rate Breakdown 2007

**THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 6:00 P.M.**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Bremer Pond Auditorium in said Town of Pittsburg on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March 2008, at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of one Moderator for two years; one Selectman for three years; one Road agent for one year; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Supervisor of the Checklist for six years, one Library Trustee for three years; one Overseer of Welfare for one year.

Also on your ballot, to vote on the following question:

“Are you in favor of increasing the term of the Town Road Agent from one to three years beginning with the term of the Road Agent to be elected at next year’s regular town meeting?”      Yes [ ]      No [ ]

2. To see if the Town will vote to trade in the 2005 police cruiser for a 2008 police cruiser and to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-eight thousand four hundred fifty dollars (\$28,450) for this purchase and the changeover costs, and authorize the withdrawal of eighteen thousand six hundred dollars (\$18,600) from the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund created for that purpose. The balance of nine thousand eight hundred fifty dollars (\$9,850) is to come from general taxation. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ninety-five thousand dollars (\$95,000) to purchase a six-wheel plow truck with associated equipment and authorize the withdrawal of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) from the Highway Heavy Equipment Capital Reserve Fund created for that purpose. The balance of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) is to come from general taxation. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
4. If the previous article does not pass, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to be added to the Highway Heavy Equipment Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)




5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) for the purchase of approximately eight-tenths of an acre of land abutting the Town Park and the tennis court. The sum of \$47,800 is to be raised by taxation and the balance of \$22,200 to be raised through grants, gifts, or donations. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred forty-five thousand dollars (\$345,000) to purchase a new fire truck and associated equipment and authorize the withdrawal of two hundred seventy-two thousand dollars (\$272,000) from the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund created for that purpose. The balance of seventy-three thousand dollars (\$73,000) is to come from general taxation. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
7. If the previous article does not pass, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to be added to the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
8. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Town Revaluation Capital Reserve Fund created in 2001. Said funds, with accumulated interest to date of withdrawal, are to be transferred to the Town's general fund. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nineteen thousand eight hundred sixty-two dollars (\$19,862) for the support of the new 45<sup>th</sup> Parallel Emergency Medical Services and to permit the Selectmen to enter into a contract with this Service for such purpose. The initial contract will be for a six-month period beginning July 1, 2008 and ending December 31, 2008. The intent in the following years is for the Town to include this expenditure directly in the operating budget. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
10. If the previous article passes and the regional concept of this non-profit organization is established, will the Town vote to sell our 2003 ambulance to the 45<sup>th</sup> Parallel Emergency Medical Services at fair market value. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to enter into a contract with the Town of Clarksville for police coverage in that town. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
12. To see if the Town is in favor of adopting an ordinance allowing the possession and sale of "permissible fireworks" as defined in RSA 160-C:1 V in the Town of Pittsburg, NH. If passed, this ordinance would supersede the ordinance dated May 7, 1992. Said ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage. (Recommended by the Selectmen)

13. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board for the sole and limited purpose of administering a municipal flood plain ordinance to be subsequently enacted in the municipality to qualify the Town of Pittsburg and its inhabitants for participation in the National Flood Insurance Program. The Board shall consist of five [5] members and two [2] alternate members to be appointed by the Board of Selectmen in accordance with RSA 673, Local Land Use Boards. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
14. Be It Resolved: We the citizens of Pittsburg, New Hampshire believe in a New Hampshire that is just and fair. The property tax has become unjust and unfair. State leaders who take a pledge for no new taxes perpetuate higher and higher property taxes. We call on our State Representatives, our State Senators, and our Governor to reject the "Pledge": have an open discussion covering all options, and adopt a revenue system that lowers property taxes. (The Selectmen take no position on this article.)
15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one million forty-one thousand eight hundred sixty-eight dollars (\$1,041,868) which represents the operating budget. Said sum DOES NOT include special or individual articles addressed. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.





## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Board of Selectmen,  
Pittsburg, New Hampshire:

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, the aggregate remaining fund information, and fiduciary fund information of Town of Pittsburg as of and for the year ended December 31, 2006, which collectively compose the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of Town of Pittsburg's management. Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinions.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, the aggregate remaining fund information, and fiduciary fund information of Town of Pittsburg as of December 31, 2006, and the respective changes in financial position and cash flows, where applicable, thereof, and the budgetary comparison for the general fund for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Management's discussion and analysis on pages two through seven is not a required part of the basic financial statements but is supplementary information required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We have applied certain limited procedures, which consisted principally of inquiries of management regarding the methods of measurement and presentation of the required supplementary information. However, we did not audit the information and express no opinion on it.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively compose Town of Pittsburg's basic financial statements. The combining non-major fund financial statements presented in Schedules 1 and 2 are supplemental information required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United State of America. Schedules 3 and 4 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. The information in Schedules 1 through 4 has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The year 2007 was once gain a busy year for the Pittsburg Police Department. In addition to the mandatory training in firearms, we focused our attention on making the Pittsburg School as safe as possible for our students. Through a grant from the New Hampshire Office of Emergency Management/Homeland Security we were able to receive training in the "Active Shooter". This was followed up by an actual hands on drill at the school in October. Chief Young and I previously met with the Pittsburg School Board and had relayed the outcome of the HLS-CAM ( Homeland Security Comprehensive Assessment Model) study that was done last year through a grant. I feel that the suggestions made to them were well received and look forward to working with them in the future. School violence has increased across our nation and it is important that we plan for it. The first ever "Lock Down" drill was done at the school and it went very well. I want to thank the Pittsburg Fire & Ambulance, US Border Patrol, NH State Police, NH Fish & Game, Colebrook Police & Dispatch, the local CERT Team and the members of my department for making the exercise a success.


We also received a grant from the New Hampshire Fish & Game Department to continue the ATV Patrols and a Speed Enforcement Grant from the NH Highway Safety Agency to allow for extra patrol time to run radar. These grants cost the Town nothing and I hope that the Selectmen allow us to continue them this year. We will continue to seek ways to purchase equipment, gain extra training, and expand our coverage without placing an undue burden on the taxpayers.

We were able to send Officer Marquis to the two week prosecutor school thus enabling her to become the prosecutor for the department. Corporal Lord was hired by the Colebrook Police Department as a full time Officer and is currently attending the NH Police Academy in Concord. I hope that he will still be available for part-time work with us, but if not, we wish him well in his position in Colebrook.

Cases 2007: Accidents investigated -145, Criminal Cases- 149, MV Court- 53, OHRV- 48, Juvenile Cases -18. In addition, we issued several hundred warnings, did numerous vehicle lockouts, and performed hundreds of property checks.

In closing I want to thank each of my officers and their families for their continued support and dedication to the department. I also want to thank the Selectmen and the area Fire, Ambulance, and the Local, State & Federal Law Enforcement Agencies for their assistance they provided to us throughout the year. It is a privilege to work with each of you. I invite each of you to stop and talk with me if you have any concerns, suggestions, or ideas that will help us better serve you.

Projects on-going throughout the year have been:

One of the priority projects has been working on and obtaining a Fire Fighters Assistance Grant to replace the current Tanker 1 that is in service. The current tanker will be replaced by August of 2008 about 4 years ahead of schedule. The cost of this new VTEC Vacuum Tanker is \$0.00 to the Town, except for changeovers of some equipment. The \$12,500 cost share of this \$250,000 grant is being funded by the Pittsburg NH Fire Fighters Association. The Tanker coming before schedule allows the Department to look at the needs and present to the voters the truck that will fit the Town's needs in the years to come. Check out the progress display at Town Meeting.

Another project for the Department has been how to retain members (current average age is 46) and bring on new members. There is a lot of training, schooling, and time away from home, not allowing everyone to volunteer as much as small towns have been accustomed to. There will be a committee set up to look into incentive programs to help in the areas of retention and recruitment. The public will be asked to participate in public sessions for input. When called upon, please step forward as this is your Community and Department.

Mark your calendars!!! JULY 26<sup>th</sup>, 2008 will be the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the building of Spirit Station. We are planning an Open House. Come back and see old friends and make new ones. If you only knew how the building of the Pittsburg Fire & Rescue has sparked projects and the building of community "SPIRIT" throughout New England. It is our obligation to continue to keep this on-going and change how people feel and act, so join us this summer for some fun and fellowship.

In the last year we have been busy trying to make the services to the patient better. We have been going to meetings with other EMS people, Selectmen, firemen, and hospital board members and staff since May and we feel that we have come up with the best and fastest means to help the patient. This full-time 24/7 staffed ambulance service will be able to cover the whole area with better response time than before. Hopefully all the taxpayers in the area will feel the same and vote 'yes' for the new system.

In the last year, we have had 136 runs with the Pittsburg ambulance. Out of those, 95 were in Pittsburg which is not quite 2 per week. To cover these runs, there were 4 EMT-B's and 3 First Responders along with fire fighters and EMT-I's from other areas. This has put a burden on all attendants.

We had election of officers and David Parker stayed in as president, Jill Young accepted the vice-president position, Jhody Judd accepted the secretary's job, and Marjorie Straw stayed in as treasurer.
