NOTICE OF SELECTMEN'S MEETINGS

The Selectmen will meet at the Town Hall, Meriden, on the second Saturday of each month at 10:00 a.m.

The books and records of the Town are public property and may be seen at the home of the chairman of the Board of Selectmen or at the Town Clerk's office at any reasonable time.

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WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Plainfield in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Plainfield Town Hall in said Plainfield on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, a Treasurer, a Tax Collector, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, two Auditors and any other necessary Town Officers.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, to be paid on or before one year's time, pursuant to the New Hampshire Laws of 1917.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,537.69 and to instruct the Selectmen to borrow \$3,000.00, payable \$1,500.00 per year beginning in 1956, to apply on the construction of the so-called Will French bridge. The money to replace the \$4,500.00 voted last year under Article 3 of last year's Warrant, as that money was not actually borrowed in 1954.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to trade the Chevrolet truck for a new truck of similar size and capacity, and to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate therefore, not to exceed \$2,000.00.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to buy a four-wheel-drive unit to use with the New Chevrolet truck, not to exceed \$1,735.00.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to buy a new tractor and shovel and to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate therefore.

Article 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same:

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to allow a two per cent discount on 1955 property taxes paid within 30 days following the day the Tax Warrant is delivered to the Tax Collector.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Meriden Community Club to replace the War memorial outside the Meriden Town Hall with a scroll and plaque inside the Town Hall.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to declare its willingness to accept a state sales tax, with food exempted, in order to relieve the burden on the property tax payer, and to aid education. (By request)

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to lease the Plainfield Plain Town Shed to the Plainfield Volunteer Fire Department for a period of 99 (ninety-nine) years for the sum of \$1.00 (one dollar). (By request)

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to move the Plainfield Town Dump from its present location and relocate it, on Town property or in some other area, where fewer residential properties will be deteriorated by its nuisances, paper, etc., blowing onto private property, rat infestations, foul-smelling smoke and threat of fire — where it will not deface a highway leading into Meriden Village as it does at present. (By request)

Article 13. To see what action the Town will take with regard to the reports of Town Officers.

Article 14. /To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The polls will remain open until 6 (six) p.m.

Article	6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and other officers heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.
Article	7. To see if the District will vote:(a) to build a two room addition to the White School in Meriden Village.
	(b) To make alterations or additions to the Brown School (Junior High) in Meriden Village.
	(c) To raise and appropriate the necessary sum or sums therefor.
	(d) To determine how much appropriation shall be raised, whether by transfer of available funds, borrowing or otherwise and if borrowing to authorize the execution, issue and sale of serial notes and bonds under and pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 258 of the Laws of 1953) and any amendments thereto.

- Article 8. To see if the District will vote to authorize the exchange of a school bus and provide money through notes or other means for the same.
- Article
 9. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of School District officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of said District and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equaliza tion fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxation by the district.
- Article 10. To see if the District will vote to have the School Board keep their books within the town, and that the bookkeep ing be done by the School Board themselves.
- Article 11. To see if the District will vote to elect its officers by an official ballot and to adopt the non-partisan ballot system as provided in Sections 112 and 120, Chapter 34 of the Revised Laws.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Plainfield:

The increased number of school pupils throughout New Hampshire made more school districts entitled to state aid, consequently there was less state money available to Plainfield for the current year. I hope that state aid for 1955-56 will be increased through a larger appropriation by the State Legislature.

The pupils in high school totaled 52 in 1953; 54 in 1954; and there may be 75 in 1955. The legislature may require districts to provide transportation to high school at least until the pupil is 16 years of age.

It is important that Meriden improve its building facilities. The so-called Junior High building leaves much to be desired in sanitation and health facilities. I definitely recommend that an addition be built to the White School.

The Helping Teacher has been beneficial to the boys and girls. She has tested and guided many pupils. This has enabled them to make better advancement in school.

The problem of securing teachers for the schools is becoming increasingly more critical. The reasons are many and include:

- (a) To few graduates from teacher training colleges.
- (b) a great increase in the number of pupils all over the country and consequently the need for many more teachers
- (c) higher wages paid in industry and to teachers in Massachusetts, Connecticut, etc.,
- (d) Many teachers prefer to teach only a single grade
- (e) Many will not teach under rural conditions.

Plainfield is fortunate to have its present group of teachers and school nurse .

My sincere thanks are extended to your conscientious School Board, teachers, nurse, bus drivers, janitors, lunch workers, P.T.A.'s, and all who have contributed to the school where your child is educated.
