TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 8th of March next, at nine-thirty o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose a town clerk, one selectman for three years, and all other town officers.
- Article 2. To see what action the town will take upon the budget submitted by the budget committee.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the following town charges for the ensuing year:
 - a. town officers salaries
 - b. town officers expenses
 - c. election and registration
 - d. expenses of Town Hall and other buildings
 - e. parks and play-grounds
 - f. legal fees, scales and misc.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$3,973.79 as a deficiency appropriation to cover the excess expenditures over appropriations for the year ending December 31, 1948, or act in any way relating thereto.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for snow removal and sanding.
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for oiling and general maintenance of highways and bridges.

- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for construction and maintenance of Class 5 roads, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$351.99 for same, to which the State will contribute \$1,407.96 if appropriated.
- Article 8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor and old age assistance.
- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for street lighting.
- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the installation and maintenance of two street lights on the so-called Quarry Road, one near the Bonnette Homestead, the other near the residence of S. Maki.
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on all taxes, excepting poll taxes, paid on or before dates designated at this meeting.
- Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the Fire Department.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the Police Department.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the maintenance of the water system.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the reconstruction of the water main to replace the present wooden main, and to issue bonds for the purpose, or act in any way relating thereto.
- Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the employment of a district nurse.

- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$1,562.28 in conjunction with other towns of Cheshire County and the City of Keene, in support of the Elliot Community Hospital, the figure named pro-rated on the number of days treatment administered by the Hospital to residents of Troy for the year 1948, or act in any way relating thereto.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and maintenance of the town dump.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care of shade trees.
- Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the continuation of the White Pine Blister Rust control program underway in the town, in cooperation with the State Forestry Commission, or act in any way relating thereto.
- Article 21. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the unused portion of the old highway, beginning on the North-east side of the North-end underpass, to the point where it was discontinued at the meeting of March 8, 1927.
- Article 22. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to dispose of the bridge on above mentioned road in Article 21.
- Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the observance of Memorial Day.
- Article 24. To see if the town will vote to allow the American Legion the use of the town hall one night each month without charge.
- Article 25. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for a Legion Home.

- Article 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for the support of the public library.
- Article 27. To see if the town will vote to erect a library building on the Gay Lot, the cost to be defrayed by the Library Fund now available for that purpose.
- Article 28. To see if the town will vote to pay the tax collector $\frac{3}{4}$ of $\frac{1}{6}$ of the total taxes collected rather than on a salary basis, or take any action relating thereto.
- Article 29. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and improvement of cemeteries.
- Article 30. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$140.00 to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire.
- Article 31. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.
- Article 32. To hear the reports of agents, officers, or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.
- Article 33. To see if the town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of the lands and buildings within the town, to equalize valuations in accordance with the law, and to appropriate money for this purpose.
- Article 34. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

REPORT OF THE HEADMASTER OF THE TROY HIGH SCHOOL

To the Superintendent of Schools:

I herewith submit my third report as headmaster of the Troy High School.

It is indeed gratifying to note the greater enthusiasm which prevails in the high school. This is probably due to the larger variety of courses offered in the fields of Home Economics, Woodworking, Commerce, Science, and Liberal Arts.

The pupils are still required to take certain basic courses in the common learnings. However, they are encouraged to elect courses in which their interests lie and which may be helpful in developing their vocational abilities.

There is the possibility that pupils may not elect the courses of study suited to their needs. In view of this fact, a guidance program was set up so that each pupil can discuss his own problems with his counsellor.

Occupational briefs of America's major job fields are now available to all together with a monthly newsletter which reports the latest job trends. These briefs explain the duties of the employee together with the physical and mental requirements, the training required, the earning capacity, the advantages and disadvantages, and the future in that particular field.

At present we are striving to integrate, with the present courses of study, the objectives as set up by the criteria proposed by the New Hampshire Life Adjustment Education Commission to assist schools in appraising the extent to which they are meeting fundamental life adjustment needs.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Troy:

I herein submit my sixth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The expanding role of public education in general and the increased enrollment in the public schools indicate a need for reorganization in the near future. A study of the school census in Troy indicates that the problem of housing the school population will become increasingly serious.

The increased enrollment since 1943 has made it necessary to maintain two additional classrooms for housing the first six grades. At the present time the first six grades each require a separate classroom and teacher. This necessary arrangement has limited the classroom space for the high school pupils. The addition of the commerce curriculum, the growth of the school lunch program, and the demand for the activities of an enriched program add to the problem of congestion.

It appears that the housing problem in the Troy schools must be solved to some extent in the near future by a choice or combination of the following plans.

- 1. An addition to the present school building to provide adequate classroom space for all pupils in grades 1-12 inclusive with an activities room for music, visual education, school lunches, and a health and physical education program that reaches all pupils.
- 2. A decrease in the number of courses offered in grades 1-12 inclusive, or a decrease in the number of grades maintained in the high school by providing less than a four-year program beyond grade 8.
- 3. A cooperative plan of organization whereby the Troy School District would join with other nearby districts in order to provide an adequate program at a more reasonable per capita cost.

It appears that the growth of the cooperative school district will solve many problems in our schools and promote a

better educational program more economically. This trend will no doubt be subsidized by financial aid from State and Federal appropriations. The immediate problem indicates a need for a study of comparative budgets under the present program and some other plan. The per capita cost of educating high school pupils in Troy is high at present due to limited enrollments. As the enrollments in the upper grades increase, the problem of congestion will become even more acute.

Park, who also resigned, was replaced by Mr. George Wilson of Port Jervis, New York, and Mr. Frederick Perkins of Boston, Massachusetts. Mr. Wilson is employed by several school districts and teaches music in Peterboro, Dublin, Hancock, Marlboro, and Troy High Schools. Mr. Perkins teaches music in the elementary grades of Chesterfield, Fitzwilliam, Harrisville, Marlboro and Troy.

SCHOOL PLANT

The school building has acquired many recent improvements. During the war period some depreciation occurred. New ceilings in five classrooms along with complete redecoration of the building with sight-saver paint have been completed within the last two year period. Window sash has been replaced in several rooms. New translucent shades have also been installed in a majority of the classrooms. An improved system for providing hot water for the Domestic Arts and school lunch programs has also been installed. It appears that the school plant is in good repair at the present time except for the floors in certain hallways and parts of the exterior of the building.





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REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and woods fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1948. In spite of danger conditions nearly equalling at times those of 1947 when great losses were suffered in New Hampshire and New England, fire damage and loss this year have been gratifyingly low.

With the continuing cooperation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1949. Let us remember that in any year, over 90% of all fires are caused by carelessness and that all of these man-caused fires are preventable.

Today, we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will help. as follows:

- (1) Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fire outdoors when the ground is not covered with snow.
- (2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or throwing them down. In automobiles, always use the ash trays.
- (3) Report fires and smokes to the warden without delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage and your cooperation in this way is earnestly solicited.
