

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Tuftonboro in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Tuftonboro on Tuesday, the sixth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon until six of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same, forty-two thousand, nine hundred, seventy-two and eighty-seven cents (\$42,972.87) as approved by the Budget Committee.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred, fifty dollars (\$250.00) and authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year, and issue notes therefore, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell Lot No. 11 Little Bear Island.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate two thousand, sixty-eight dollars (\$2,068.00) for use on the Sodom Road and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provision of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate ten thousand, five hundred seventy-nine dollars and forty-five cents (\$10,579.45) for use on the Sodom Road and withdraw this amount from the State Highway Subsidy (Chapter 241, Section 14) Revised Statutes Annotated.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote per RSA 253:17 and RSA 253:18 to declare all town roads scenic roads.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the following article: Book 4, Page 210, March 10, 1874 Article 2:

"Voted to exempt from taxation for a term of ten years any manufacturing corporation that may come into town and expend fifteen thousand or more in machinery and the erection of buildings for the same."

9. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the following article: Book 5, Page 61, March 1884 — Article 8:

"Voted to exempt from taxation any manufacturing company who may erect and operate a manufactory the value of the same to be \$5,000 or more, for ten years."

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to create the Office of Honorary Library Trustee (for life) and to nominate and elect Edna Cheney to said office.
- 11. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

Another year has swiftly come to a close. It has been a very busy year for everyone. We are constantly growing under the capable hands of our Public Health Nurse, Mrs. M. Virginia Dolan, R.N. and her assistants, Mrs. Nathalie Leavitt, R.N. and Mrs. Davena DeWolf, R.N. We also have available an Occupational Therapist, Mrs. Joan Decelle and a part-time Physiotherapist, Mrs. Betty Freeman, with a contract with Huggins Hospital when Mrs. Freeman is not available. We also had two part-time nurses for a short time, Mrs. Patricia Titus, R.N. and Mrs. Constance Shepherd, R.N.

The total number of visits during 1972 were 2184, a slight gain over 1971's 2040 visits.

In September the office of the Public Health Nurse was moved from the Black Building to Huggins Hospital.

Clinics were held monthly in Wakefield, Dr. Gerard G. Bozuwa, M.D. was in charge. They are sponsored by the Public Health Nursing Association in cooperation with the State Department of Health and the School Board of Wakefield. No clinics were held in Wolfeboro this year.

Services cover the Alton, Brookfield, Tuftonboro, Wakefield and Wolfeboro areas. No patient is refused care because of financial stress. Therefore, our drive for funds each year is very important as well as the funds voted for at the Town Meetings, since like everyone, we are feeling the pinch of economy.

The Nursing Committee wishes to thank everyone whose contribution, financial or otherwise, assured the success of our program.

REPORT OF THE TUFTONBORO CONSERVATION COMMISSION

During 1972 the commission carried on the programs started in previous years namely right of way research, water testing, supplying Ranger Rick for the 4th grade at the Tuftonboro School and maintaining and improving the park at Nineteen Mile Bay in conjunction with the Parks and Playgrounds Commission and the 4-H. The commission has this year built wood duck nest boxes and is currently placing them in appropriate places around town. If you see the boxes being molested, broken or otherwise needing attention, we would appreciate your contacting one of the commission members.

We were unsuccessful in getting an article into the warrant last year relative to scenic roads. Hopefully, we will have one for your approval this year. Declaring a road a scenic road does not jeopardize state aid for road building but it does allow the planning board to have a say on what trees will be cut and what stone walls moved.

The commission lost the services of Forrest Perkins this year, but he has been replaced by Frances Howe of Melvin Village. Fran brings a great deal of experience in conservation work to the commission and will be a very valuable addition.

The commission has investigated situations and written letters about events that it felt were not in the best interests of the Town but again we remind you that conservation is everyone's business. If there are ideas you wish us to pursue, contact us.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire, forest fire control is a cooperative state-town program. The Town Forest Fire Warden, appointed by the Director, Division of Resources Development upon recommendation of the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the Town in the cost of most forest fires, except illegal and careless fires, which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews, and back-up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town except backyard cooking fires. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits will be issued for fires between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire; remember it can be an extremely useful tool when under control but once allowed to run wild it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only you can prevent a forest fire.
