TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. S.]

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Belmont in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall, in said Belmont, on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To choose one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of the Public Library for three years, and one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years.
- 4. To see what the Town will vote to do with its Parsonage Funds.
- 5. To see what the Town will vote to do with its T. R. A. funds.
- 6. The voters are hereby warned a vote will be taken to see if it is expedient to revise the constitution.
- 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for a road machine.

- 8. To see what the Town will vote to do in way of repairs on the tractor shed.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on all taxes paid on or before July 5th.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for Blister Rust control.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the Laconia Hospital Association.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of money to meet the requirements of the State for the construction of the Province Road.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to permit the Selectmen to take such action as may be necessary to make available the necessary town funds, provided a proposal is submitted to the Works Progress Administration for a project.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

There have been no other changes in our teaching force.

Our total enrollment is two hundred twenty-nine. The number enrolled a year ago at this time was two hundred thirty-one.

There are ten Belmont pupils enrolled in the Elementary schools of Laconia, and eight in the elementary schools of Tilton, for whom this district is paying tuition. Those children attending the Laconia schools reside in the Ladd Hill and Winnisquam communities. Those attending the Tilton schools reside near Lochmere.

MEDICAL INSPECTION AND HEALTH

Dr. Nathan Brody, School Physician, made the annual inspection of the school children. He was assisted by Miss Ruth B. Whitcomb, R. N., School Nurse. Dr. Brody's examination was a thorough one.

Fifty-one full days were spent by the nurse working in school, home visits, clinics and follow-up work.

Clinics held for the school children were Toxin-Anti-Toxin and Tuberculosis.

IMPROVEMENTS

The Province Road school room has been repainted and its appearance much improved thereby. The drain pipes from the septic tanks at the Gale School have been relaid.

The interior of the Gale Building is much in need of repainting. The halls and schoolrooms do not now present an attractive appearance. Some of the school furniture should be replaced. The cost to put this building into first class shape would be considerable.

High School

The new building was ready for occupancy at the opening of the school year in September. This was a time of rejoicing for both pupils and teachers. The school is now organized as a Junior-Senior High school and has a total enrollment of eighty-five. The shop work for boys

which has been introduced is proving most popular and profitable. Our need for some work of this kind has long been felt by those who were in a position to understand the situation.

The new building is proving adapted to our needs. The work of the school is progressing well.

The inspection and dedication of the building took place on the evening of November 12, during Education Week. Mrs. Ethel J. Friend, Chairman of the School Board, presided at the formal exercises. The principal address was made by Mr. James N. Pringle, Commissioner of Education of the State of New Hampshire. Other speakers were Dr. J. H. Lockwood, representing P. W. A. Mrs. Nancy Knowlton St. Lawrence the first headmaster of our high school, Mr. W. F. Duffy, Headmaster Dustin and the Superintendent of Schools.

FINANCES

The per pupil cost of the elementary schools of Belmont for the last school year was \$62.22. The median for the State was \$77.93. The per pupil cost of the Belmont High School was \$74.92, and the State median \$99.50.

The amount of State Aid received by the School District this year was \$5,114.78. We may expect about the same amount this coming year.

The proposed budget is about \$1200 larger than the one adopted a year ago. This increase was to be expected. The school board is also asking that a deficiency appropriation of \$800 be made for this current fiscal year.

The 1936-37 budget contained an item of \$900 for the payment of high school tuition. As the school meeting voted not to pay high school tuition for pupils attending a school outside the district this money was used to pay the first of the high school building bonds which matured January 1, 1937, and to meet the interest charges due on the same date.

The total cost of construcion and equipment of the high school building was \$24,953.51. Forty-five per cent, of this total cost, which amounted to \$11,229.07, was a direct grant or gift from the federal government. The school district bonded itself in the amount of \$13,750.00 to meet its share of the cost. As the first bond of \$700.00 has already matured and has been paid the amount of the district's indebt-

edness is now \$13,050.00. The dates of maturity of these bonds are so arranged that one bond matures each year, and in twenty years the entire indebtedness will be discharged. With the maturing of the bonds the yearly interest payments will decrease.

I' again wish to express my appreciation of the assistance given me during the past by the school board, the teachers and others.
