#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Ellsworth in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Ellsworth on Tuesday, the 4th day of March next, at 6:30 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same. (Town officers' salaries \$2,370 Expenses \$600 Election & Registration \$50 Total \$3,020)
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000.00 for the maintenance of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$77.66 as their share of T.R.A. (State share \$517.72).
- 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for maintenance and repair of the Town House.
- 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for use of the Campton-Thornton Dump.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to cover the cost of insurance.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 each for Campton and Rumney Fire Departments. (total \$200.00)
- 9. To see if the Town, in order to clarify vote at 1972 Town Meeting relating to one (1) acre lots, will now vote to require all building lots to have a minimum dimension of 209 feet on highway by 209 feet depth.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to dissolve the Willey Bridge Fund and use same for extensive repair of the Town House.

- 11. To see if the Town will vote to dissolve the Anniversary Fund, so called.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to dissolve the position of Trustee of Trust Funds.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of agents and officers.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The year started out uneventfully. However, before 1974 was over we had the floods. They were disastrous for many Towns, but for Ellsworth, to a certain extent, they were a blessing in disguise.

We experienced some road damage requiring the replacement of numerous culverts. The banking alongside the Pond Bridge was badly washed out, necessitating extensive shoring work. Last, but by no means least, the entire bridge on the Willey Road, over Branch Brook, was completely washed out.

The total cost of all the above repairs, including a completely new Willey Bridge, amounted to approximately \$25,000. Luckily we were able to apply for, and received, this money from Federal Disaster Funds. By applying for these funds all the above repairs were made without the necessity of using any Town funds. Therefore no tax rate increase.

We also started a project of improving the Willey Road, which we hope to continue in stages, up to the Bridge. This year's costs of widening, grading, and filling the Willey Road were paid from a two year accumulation of various highway fund monies.

#### REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

#### **REPORT TO TOWNS**

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodlands closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.
