TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Landaff, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Landaff on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for T. R. A. Roads, and raise and appropriate money for same.
- 4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Lisbon District Nursing Association.
- 5. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 6. To see if the town will vote a discount of 2% on property taxes paid on or before July 1, and 1% September 1.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27.90 for the support of the White Mountain Region Association.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control in 1960.
- 9. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$500.00 to be used for gravelling Class V Roads in 1960.
- 10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$500.00 for the purchase of a Swenson Road Sander.
- 11. To see if the town will raise and set aside an amount to be put in the bank each year toward the eventual purchase of a rubber tired Tractor Loader.

To transact any other business that may legally come before the said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of the Landaff School District:

I herewith submit my seventeenth annual report as

Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment in Blue School last year was 25. The average membership was 23.8 and the percent of attendance was 92.9. There were 12 pupils attended Lisbon Elementary School and 14 attended Lisbon High School.

The enrollment in Blue School at the present time is 22. Ten pupils are attending Lisbon Elementary School, 13 pupils are attending Lisbon High School and one pupil is attending St. Johnsbury Trade School. There are three elementary pupils enrolled at Woodsville Elementary School.

Under the Foster Child law Landaff pays tuition for three elementary pupils enrolled at Woodsville Elementary School and receives tuition for one high school pupil from the town of Bethlehem, who attends Lisbon High School.

Tuition rates increase moderately next year. The high school rate is \$360 and the elementary rate is \$235. These rates are well below state average but do reflect higher

living costs everywhere.

Excellent school facilities are now offered the Landaff pupils enrolled at Lisbon. The Science and Home Economics laboratories are modernized and newly equipped. A spacious gymnasium and auditorium, a new library and enlarged classrooms give your children better study conditions. You are invited to visit the Lisbon school and see your children at work.

Mrs. Hildah Bedard is completing her fourth year as teacher at Blue School. Landaff is to be complimented for

retaining Mrs. Bedard at Blue School. Competent teachers are in great demand. Her work is highly satisfactory and the children make excellent progress under her guidance.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all who have been so helpful during the year, a special word for your School Board so generous with time and effort for the educational interests of your children.

SUPERVISORY UNION NO. 34

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent.

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union #34 during 1958-59 received a salary of \$7,600.00 which was made up as follows: \$4,250.00 paid by the State Department of Education from the per capita tax and \$3,350.00 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1,100.00 for travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.

The table below shows the proration of salary and travel charged to each school district.
