

## WARRANT

---

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.—

- L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the town hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.
- 2d. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3d. To choose three Selectmen and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 4th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways, and direct how the same shall be paid and expended the ensuing year.
- 5th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 6th. To hear the report of the Auditors and of the School Board of the town district.
- 7th. To determine the division of the school money.
- 8th. So see what action the town will take in relation to the balance of the dog tax of 1889 not ordered to be paid for damage by dogs.
- 9th. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$50 for the proper observance of memorial day.
- 10th. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the south-easterly part of Church street, lying easterly of its intersection with Abbott street.

- 11th. To see if the town will vote to sell the land on Mahan Flat purchased of Spring & Dole for a gravel pit.
- 12th. To see if the town will vote to expend the balance remaining from the sale of burial lots in Glenwood Cemetery in the improvement of the grounds in said cemetery, and direct how said sums of money shall be expended.
- 13th. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to comply with the provisions of chapter 74 of the Pamphlet Laws of the session of 1885, relating to the better preservation of town and other records.
- 14th. To see if the town will vote to raise sufficient sums of money to construct the sewer or sewers proposed in the special town meeting, held on the 8th day of October, 1889, to be laid near the premises of George S. Rogers, to Mascoma river.
- 15th. To see if the town will vote to vest the management and control of the Memorial Hall premises in a board of three trustees, to be chosen to serve one for three years, one for two years, one for one year.
