THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Loudon in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

(L.S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Loudon on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Polls will open at 9:00 A.M. and close not earlier than 7:00 P.M.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to allow 2% discount on all property taxes paid within thirty days after presentation of tax bill.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and the Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums of money not to exceed in the aggregate more than 75% of the anticipated amount to be collected in taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town of Loudon negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in 1968 from taxes collected during the current municipal year.

5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the Highway Capital Reserve Fund.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$232.00 for the Concord Hospital to help defray their estimated deficit for the year 1968.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Fire Department's Capital Reserve Fund as set up in the 1963 Town Meeting.

8. To see if the Town is in favor of having a three year term for the Town Clerk.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

S/SGT. ROBERT F. HAINES
U. S. Army

Born December 21, 1942

Died August 27, 1967

Bronze Star Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster Awarded Posthumously to S/Sgt. Robert F. Haines, U. S. Army in connection with ground operations against hostile forces in the Republic of South Vietnam from 16 April 1966 to 27 August 1967, also the Purple Heart for wounds received in action.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT 1967

The most important projects during the past year were the rebuilding of the Twin Bridge and the bridge on the Chichester Road. This was necessary because the stone abutments were loosened by the increase in traffic and heavier loads being carried. If these bridges were not repaired, a fatal accident could have occurred.

In order to accomplish this without an appropriation, our gravel roads did not receive the necessary attention but it is hoped this can be taken care of in the coming year.

The Bumfagon Road was opened from Clough Hill Road to the Lower Ridge Road. This is now a good gravel road.

Throughout the year, we hope to keep on black-topping sections of roads that are a source of trouble and expense, and also to re-surface existing black-top roads as far as the money appropriated will permit.

We had to borrow money again this year to help pay our share of school costs. The loan has been paid back during the year and, unfortunately, it appears we will have to borrow for 1968 in anticipation of taxes.

The Town Budget has been prepared with care for your approval and will be approximately the same as the past year.

The Selectmen will be at the Town Hall Tuesday nights from 8:00 P.M. to 10:00 P.M. unless the weather or road conditions are poor. In this case it might be well to first call one of the Selectmen or the Selectmen's office.

We want to call your attention to the Junk Car Law and ask for your cooperation. We have room at the Town Dump for your old cars.

We also appreciate your response to our plea of last year

to send in your Inventory properly filled out. However, there are still some people who are not complying. How can we wake them up to the fact that failure to do so may cause them inconvenience and may result in errors in the records?

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ROAD AGENT REPORT

The main projects this year were as follows; the construction of bridges on the Chichester Road and Twin Bridge section of the Lower Ridge Road. These bridges were of pre-stressed concrete design, 24 feet in width, with an all steel railing. The replacement of these bridges was made possible by the combined 1966-67 Duncan Fund or Gas Tax.

This past summer extensive renovations were completed on the Town garage. Lengthing and widening the building, plus cementing the floor, has given double the space to store and maintain the equipment. We are in hopes, this year, to install a heating system and over-head doors.

The T.R.A. project continued this year with the paving of 5 miles of Chichester road, excavating and gravel of the remainder to the Chichester town line.

Work was done on the east end of Bumfagon road, consisting of wood cutting, dozer work, and graveling as far as the bridge. This work was done due to the vote taken at Town meeting last year to re-open this road.

About 25,000 gallons of Asphalt were used this past summer for regular seal coating and mixing cold patch.

At the present time we are in the midst of a tough winter with more than usual amount of ice and snow. With increasing demand for clear, safe roads, the salt consumption will exceed the supply used in past winters.

The power sander that was purchased this past summer has proven to be a great asset to your highway department, affording more efficient and faster service.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

This past year has seen a decided drop in the number of fires reported. In 1965 the department answered 35 calls; in 1966, 39 calls and in 1967, we responded to 25 calls; namely, fires of various descriptions such as 5 vehicle fires, 4 calls for grass or brush, 2 chimney fires, 3 house fires, 7 calls for mutual aid to surrounding towns and one each, accident stand-by, resuscitator call and lighting strike. We also answered on drill call, set up by the Capital Area Mutual Aid compact.

For new equipment, we have added this past year, a new Gorman Rupp portable pump. This is to replace a nearly 20 year old model that will be used for stand-by service.

Also, we are awaiting shipment of a Foam Eductor, to be installed on Engine No. 1 to help in the ever increasing call for fires where oil or gas or other highly explosive material is involved.

We, again, want to thank everyone for constant alertness in the prevention of fires. We wish to stress the importance of Fire Safety in the home. Avoid at all times the accumulation of clutter and rubbish around the buildings, aiming for a better record in the coming year.

At this time, I wish to express appreciation for all those who willingly gave of their time and effort to the growth of the Loudon Fire Department, also the Ladies Auxiliary for their ever present help.
