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#### TENTATIVE WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Madison in the County of Carroll in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madison on Tuesday, March 12, 1968 at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same, as follows:

Town Officers Salaries Town Officers Expenses Election and Registration Expenses Expenses Town Hall and other Town Buildings Employees' Retirement and Social Security Police Department Fire Department Insurance Damages and Legal Expenses Running Town Lines Health Department, including Hospitals Vital Statistics Town Dump and Garbage Removal Highway Maintenance — Summer Highway Maintenance — Winter Street Lighting General Expenses of Highway Department Town Road Aid (See Article No. 4)

Tarring Library Town Poor and Surplus Commodities Old Age Assistance and Aid to Permanently and Totally Disabled Memorial Day Old Home Week Aid to Soldiers and their Families Parks and Playgrounds Municipally Owned Water and Electric Utilities Advertising and Regional Associations (See Article No. 3) Interest on Temporary Loans Interest on Long Term Notes and Bonds New Equipment Payment on Long Term Notes Payment to Capital Reserve Funds County Taxes School Taxes

- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$630.29, which is 1/2000th of the equalized valuation of the town, to the Lakes Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 4. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$821.49 which is the town's share of Town Road Aid. The State's share is \$5476.59. It is recommended by the Budget Committee that these funds be expended on the Boulder Road.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum, or sums, not exceeding in the aggregate of \$35,000.00

in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year and to issue in the name, and on the credit of the Town, negotiable notes therefore, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year from taxes collected within said current municipal year.

- 6. To see if the town wishes to vote a discount for prompt payment of taxes according to state law. This must be voted each year.
- 7. To see if the town wishes to vote to remodel the Town Hall, and to raise and appropriate sufficient funds to defray the cost of same.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,700.00 to defray the cost of plowing driveways within the town.
- 9. If Article No. 8 should be voted down, to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 to supplement Winter Maintenance Funds.
- 10. To see if the town wishes to vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to install two toilets at the public bathing beach, located between Hayes' Store and Ward's Crossing.
- 11. To see if the town wishes to vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Pine Blister Rust control.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of \$200.00 to help the Carroll County Services, Inc.
- 13. To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to have installed four street lights on Route 16, in the March Hill Area, and will raise and appropriate a sum to defray the cost of the same.

- 14. To see if the town will vote to widen and level the hill on Alexander Avenue and to raise and appropriate sufficient sums to defray the cost of same.
- 15. To transact any further business which may legally come before this meeting.

After several successive years of drought, the rains of 1967 came as a welcome change. Our record of the past fire season is good. Our thanks to all who contributed to achieve this good record. Continued improvement in the matter of accurate, prompt detection and rapid effective suppression action can help to maintain this good, worthwhile record even though we do not have an abundance of rain as in the fire season of 1967.

It will help if we follow these simple suggestions:

- 1. No burning of debris and waste between the hours of 9:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. and then only with a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.
- 2. Take debris and waste to the town dump.
- E. Maintain a clean, safe dump.
- 4. Keep matches away from young children.
- 5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
- 6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.

## WHY SPEECH THERAPY?

A child sits silently in his first grade classroom day after day unable to communicate with the other children or the teacher because his speech has not developed as rapidly as the other children's speech. A girl in Kennett High School dreads being called on in class because her hesitant, stuttering speech makes talking so difficult for her. Across the hall another student is straining to catch all that the teacher is saying. This student is handicapped by a hearing loss.

These are just some of the cases in our school union which have been helped through speech therapy. A total of 125 students have been enrolled in this new remedial speech program. The following breakdown shows the number of students enrolled in speech therapy from each school:

Conway — 22	Tamworth — 20
Pine Tree — 10	Madison — 7
John Fuller — 24	Jackson — 3
Kennett — 12	Chatham — 2
Bartlett — 15	Freedom — 10

Defective speech can be defined as speech which calls attention to itself. When a child uses speech that is not normal or that calls attention to itself, a program of speech therapy is necessary. Our goal is to help the child with defective speech attain normal, acceptable speech.

To facilitate this end we are fortunate enough to have some very up-to-date equipment, including one item of special importance — a video tape recorder This machine is like a miniature T. V. camera in that a child's image can be recorded on tape along with his voice. We then play the tape back so the child can see and hear himself on the T. V. screen. This has proven invaluable in correcting some child-

ren's speech.

Speech difficulties are not something that occur only in other communities to other people's children. We have realized that fact here in School Union No. 9 and have set up an adequate program of speech therapy to help those children who need help in speech.

# ELEMENTARY GUIDANCE COUNSELING

As an Elementary Guidance Counselor for Supervisory School Union No. 9 under the Title I Project, I am also a member of the teaching staff; and am concerned with the normal learning development of all the elementary school children in the Union.

Vocational Guidance is a part of my service. I feel that students should be exposed to the world of work, and should be helped to understand their own abilities and interests so that they can make realistic choices. Educational Guidance is closely related to Vocational Guidance and all other types of guidance, individual or group.

In addition to my personal contacts with students and consultations with teachers and parents, I give such tests as the Stanford Achievement Test, the Lorge-Thorndike I. Q. Test, and the State-Wide test for the eighth grades. These I evaluate and correlate in statistical form.

I am also trying to launch research on the effectiveness of the guidance program as regards its value to school children in their learning and developmental attitudes toward school.
