

You are hereby notified to meet at the West Milan Town Hall in West Milan on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, to act on the following subjects: (Polls open 1 to 9 p.m. — Business Meeting at 8 p.m.)

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' salaries.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' expenses.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for summer and winter road and bridge maintenance.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$356.98 and the State will give \$2,379.86 for Town Road Aid.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of 1,000.00 and the State will give \$10,000.00 for State Aid Construction on the East Side River Road.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Town Poor.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for aid to soldiers and their families.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the White Mountain Regions Association.
11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Civil Defense.
12. To see if the town will vote to accept a deed from the State

of New Hampshire to the Right of Way and Parking Lot at Nay Pond and to maintain said road as a Class VI Highway.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,200.00 for the purchase of a used truck for the Fire Department. (Replacement for the 1947 Ford).
14. To see if the town will vote to repair the foundation and vault at the Town Building and to raise such sums of money of money as may be necessary.
15. To see if the town will vote to accept the "Orvis and Maude Twitchell Beach" at Cedar Pond in accordance with the provisions of Clause III of the will of the late Maude Twitchell Jordan.

## Report of Superintendent

To the School Board and Citizens of the Milan School District:

### FOREWORD

Your School Board recommends that the sum of \$69,359.51 be raised and appropriated for support of schools. The budget for 1965-66 totaled \$75,594.16 and of this amount \$6,000.00 was authorized for a heating system. Disregarding the heating system the proposed budget represents a decrease of \$234.65.

Included in the \$69,359.51 budget are salary increases for teachers, a special appropriation of \$3,000.00 for the tuition payment, and \$286.77 for Milan's share for a federal coordinator. The regular tuition account shows a sizeable decrease.

### Warrant

State law requires a special Warrant and a regular Warrant when operating under the provisions of Statute 197 (elections of school officials at Town Meetings). The Special Warrant provides notice of when and where to vote for school officials; while the regular Warrant provides notice of where and when to meet to conduct the regular business of the School District.

Your regular Warrant contains six special articles that deserve special comment. These are:

**Article 4** relating to Public Law 89-10. It is reasonable to assume that some federal money under Public Law 89-10 may become available to your School Board. Passage of this article will probably be required if the School Board is to receive and expend federal funds, if allocated to the District.

**Article 5** relating to the balance. This article provides your School Board with authority to allocate the balance, if any, to the Berlin tuition account. Please refer to Tax Commission letter in last year's School Report.

**Article 6** relating to a special tuition payment. Following the vote last year the balance and \$3,000.00 was applied against our arrears tuition account with Berlin. This article provides an opportunity to pay \$3,000.00 to reduce this account.

**Article 7** relating to a federal coordinator. As a result of increasing federal involvement and financial aid being a part of our educational pattern; Supervisory Union No. 20 is requesting permission to hire and meet expenses of a part-time position. The person will write proposals and advise School Boards on ways and means of securing federal funds. The total project carries a budget allocation of \$3,300.00 with each District requested to furnish the following sums of money: Dummer \$48.18, Errol \$171.60, Gorham \$2,565.75, Milan \$286.77, Randolph \$121.44 and Shelburne \$106.26

**Article 8** relating to the West Milan School. Your School Board wishes to have the West Milan School taken down. If sold and not taken down the District could be involved with heavy expenditures.

**Article 9** relating to sale of land. If Article 8 is passed the School Board would like to sell the land after the building is taken down. A sealed bid system would be used.

#### **Special Tuition Account**

Your arrears tuition account is estimated to be \$24,000.00, against this, your School Board has applied \$3,000.00 and the 1964-65 balance of \$1,935.33. This leaves as estimated an account of \$19,064.67.

#### **Instructional Staff**

I believe that the District is very fortunate to have the efficient and capable staff working with our students. Mrs. Nichols has returned to the Village School for grades 5 & 6 and Mr. Herbert Oliver, graduate of Farmington Teachers College, is teaching grades three and four. Mrs. Esther Bean is carrying out her assignment in a high quality manner.

#### **The Future**

One is sometimes foolish to predict anything, however, I feel it is my obligation to present to the District my views and thoughts as to what may happen educationally within the District within the near future.

1. People will request and insist on more and better educational services for their children. Financial resources to implement these services will not be available within a small school pattern.
2. The economy and national interest will dictate what is taught in the schools.

3. School libraries will become the learning centers of elementary and secondary schools.
4. Individual states will enact more legislation concerning the education of the children within the respective states.
5. Milan, as with most districts will need to constantly evaluate and examine what it is doing educationally; and to seek solutions to difficult problems.

Three children attended the Orthopedic Clinics in Berlin, one child attended the Pediatric-Cardiology Clinic in Lancaster. Fifteen children were given physical examinations, and 144 immunizations were administered at the Preschool Clinic. 100 children were Heaf tested for tuberculosis detection.

With the advent of Medicare, all local communities will find themselves directly involved. Local efforts should be directed toward the problems of organizing and implementing personal health services. Is your community ready?

Medicare is the bringing together of people **needing** and providing service. A major contribution to the health care for the aged lies in the provisions for home care benefits.

Communities need to plan and develop new patterns of services geared to meeting the needs of the chronically ill, aged and infirm persons living in their own homes. Care in the home often saves money for the family and the community.

All citizens of your community must work in a spirit of partnership in recognition of a common purpose—the assurance that health care of high quality will be part of the security to which all Americans can look forward in the latter years of their lives.

It has indeed been a pleasure to work with the Citizens of Milan, and I extend my appreciation to them for their cooperation during the past year.
