The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next, at 10:00 9.M. in the forenoon, the Polls to close not earlier than 6:00 P.M., to act upon the following subjects:

Business meeting at 8:00 P.M.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$38,000.00 for the maintenance and repair of Highways and Bridges.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,024.38 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute the sum of \$6,829.17.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for tarring of Class V roads.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Cemeteries.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the care of the Village Cemetery.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of hospitals.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Bristol Community Center.

15. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of purchasing a new firetruck and raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 for the same.

16. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of purchasing new highway equipment and raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 for the same.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,250.00 for painting half of the Central Bridge.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for widening and repairing a section of the Sky Pond Road.

19. (Petition) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Lakes Region Mental Health Center.

The past year has seen progress in the organization of the Fire Department. Interest has continued in attendance at regular and training meetings.

We were fortunate in obtaining the services of our long time Fire Chief Harold T. Chase, to serve again for the year 1968. Due to health, Harold presented his resignation on December 20, 1968 to take effect on January 7, 1969 which was the date of the Department's first 1969 meeting. The Fire Wards regretfully accepted Harold's resignation which took effect nearly to a day to the tenth anniversary of his appointment as Fire Chief. Harold received this appointment upon the resignation of Harry E. Hubbard who held this position for the twenty-one years previous. We thank Harold and his faithful wife for their many years of service.

The Fire Wards were glad to obtain the services of Bernard C. Lowell to take over the duties as Fire Chief. He is already a very busy man being Police Chief for our town. Bernard will need the assistance of us all and we are sure he will receive this backing.

The Fire Wards looked over several possible sites for our much needed fire station and were sufficiently impressed with a site at the top of Shingle Camp Hill to petition the selectmen to look into its possibilities. A similar petition was signed by twenty-six of our firemen and also given to the selectmen.

A set of bylaws for our Fire Department have been developed and adopted. A list of officers have been chosen and consist of a Deputy Fire Chief, Captain, Clerk-Treasurer and Engineer. The bylaws set up the manner of appointment or election of these officers and their duties. The Fire Wards feel that consideration should be given to establishing a capital reserve fund for the replacement of the Ford pumper. This piece of equipment will have reached its life expectancy in the near future.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

New Hampshire is the fastest growing state in the northeast in terms of population increase. It is also an industrialized state and this growth is likely to continue, all of which means more families and homes. Our growing summer population is scattered throughout the state with a phenomenal increase in vacation homes.

Many new homes and practically all cottages are being located in woodlands and abandoned fields and forests crowd into the back yards of our village streets. In a state where the forests cover 86% of the land surface, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the season, which comes with the disappearance of the snow until the snow comes again, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following action will help:

- 1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.
- 2. To *never* discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- 3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn—

a. You need a written permit from the town fire warden for all debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fireplaces or in charcoal brasiers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.

b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on grass by householders between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.

c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire *before* you light the match.

4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column and save our tax dollars for useful purposes.
