

Report of the Board of Education.

In compliance with law and custom, the Board of Education herewith presents the following report of schools for the year ending February 15, 1900.

We believe that the year has been one of harmony and progress. We have been enabled, by a more liberal appropriation, to lengthen our schools beyond the usual limit, thus making the winter term of more than ordinary profit.

The High school began the year in charge of Mr. N. T. Abbott. His work among us is too well known to need comment; suffice it to say he sustained his reputation as an able instructor. Near the opening of the fall term Mr. Abbott resigned to accept a situation in Boston. Mr. Ernest L. Silver was elected to fill the position thus left vacant. Mr. Silver is a graduate of Dartmouth College and comes to us highly recommended. We have found him to be a thorough instructor, and in all points able to carry on the work to the satisfaction of the Board and the patrons of the school.

The Village school, under the care of Mrs. Alma F. Bartlett, has done good work along all lines of study. This school is the largest in town and it needs both perseverance and energy, combined with love for the work, to make it a success. All of these qualities we have found united in the present teacher.

The school at Rowe's Corner has been in charge of Miss Mattie Brown for the year. Firm in discipline, thorough in instruction, this school has advanced rapidly under her management.

Miss Myra M. Day has completed her sixth year with the Pond street school. Miss Day has the rare faculty of making the school-room home-like and attractive. In visiting this school, we have been pleased to notice a marked improvement along several lines of work.

The Junction school was favored with the return of Miss C. M. Swain for the year. Miss Swain's pleasing method of imparting instruction has made her a favorite with her pupils and the public.

We believe, that in the education of youth, as in the construction of a building, the foundation should be laid both broad, strong and deep; one upon which it is safe to build without limit as to the size of the superstructure.
