TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. (Polls to close at 6 p. m.)

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for interest on same.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for Northwood Public Libraries.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$550.00 as asked for by Recreation Commission for recreation purposes.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$225.00 for the care of cemeteries.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$572.01 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$3,813.41.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 in addition to the \$572.01 for construction of T.R.A.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purchase of Highway Equipment.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Merrimack Valley Region Association.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Municipal Court Judge.

13.* To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$592.00 for Concord Hospital.

14. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

This year we have added 56 new all steel folding chairs and put a new floor covering in the kitchen. In 1959 the Town plans to put on an outside fire escape from the second floor.

The Fire Department plans to hold its annual ball the middle of April 1959.

SCHOOL WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the Town of Northwood qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Legion Hall in said district on the 10th day of March 1959, at four o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects: (Business meeting at 7 p.m.)

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and apppoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the application for funds from the federal and/or state governments for use in connection with the locating, building, and equipping of a new elementary school, and to provide for the use of such funds, if and when received, to pay for such project or for any bonds or notes issued to finance that project, or to take any other action in connection therewith.

10. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to receive, expend, or utilize, at its discretion, gifts from individuals, estates, and organizations of money, land, or other articles of value for use in locating building, or equipping a new elementary school.

11. To see if the district will vote to change the time and place of its regular annual meeting in 1960 from the second Tuesday in March at the Legion Hall to the second Saturday in March at the Town Hall, with the polls to open at 4 p. m. and the business meeting at 7 p. m. (By request).

12. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate to carry out recommendations of the Office of Fire Marshal, State of New Hampshire, concerning minimum safety requirements for the Brookside and Ridge Schools.

13. To see if the district will (1) vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, not to exceed \$40,000.00, for the repair and renovation of the Brookside and Ridge Schools to place them in condition for extended use; (2) vote to issue serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the district under the Municipal Finance Act or any other enabling authority to pay for all or any portion of the sum or sums to be appropriated, and authorize the School Board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued; and (3) take any other action incidental to or connected with the foregoing. (By request).

14. To see if the district will vote to build and equip a new elementary school consisting of not less than six

regular class rooms, plus an activity area and a kitchen, and with sanitary and administrative facilities, provide the necessary equipment and furnishings, and to acquire any real property that may be necessary for the proper location of such school and take any other action relating thereto. (By Petition, 207 Signatures.)

15. If the preceding article is adopted, to see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000.00) for the construction, equipment and furnishing for such new elementary school and the acquisition of any real property that may be necessary for its location; and whether the district will vote to authorize the issue of serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the School Board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued including their sale, the time and place of payment of the principal and in accordance with the Municipal Bond Statute, N. H. Revised Laws, Chapter 72, and any amendments thereto. (By Petition, 207 Signatures.)

16. If the district has adopted the article for the new elementary school, to see if the district will vote to appoint a building committee to consist of the School Board and five persons to be appointed by the moderator to select the location of the new school and to supervise the construction of said building, provided that the plans, specifications and selection of the site for the new school shall be approved by the School Board acting alone as required by law, and the School Board be further authorized to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary in connection with the construction of said school. (By Petition, 207 Signatures.)

17. To see if the district will vote to recess this meeting until 4 p. m., Saturday, June 27, 1959, at the Town Hall, for the purpose of considering articles in this Warrant upon which no action has been taken, to hear

the reports of Committees appointed or elected by this meeting, and to consider such other matters as may properly come before the district.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The cost of education continues to increase proportionately to the increases in other areas of our economy. The above increase in high school tuition rates and the increased enrollment of pupils attending high school, has a dollar impact in your 1959-60 school budget. These are statutory obligations which must be met by the school district. Another factor is the continued shortage of qualified teachers, making it necessary to increase teachers' salaries in order to keep them. It is fundamentally essential that we retain our good teachers so

that your children may have the benefit of the best education available.

Our testing program has been organized so that every child will receive a test of mental ability in grades 2-4-6-8. All grades receive a battery of the Stanford Achievement test at the end of the first semester, except grade I, their test is given at the end of the first year. These tests are valuable to the teachers as a guide in determining the type of instruction to be administered.

The National Defense Act of 1958 will soon have its effect in the enrichment of the curriculum. The sections of the act which have a direct bearing to this community are as follows:

Title 3

- (a) Grant to states for the acquisition of Laboratory equipment for Science, Mathematics and Modern Foreign Language in public elementary and secondary schools and minor remodeling; to be matched locally on a 50-50 basis.

Title 5

Grants to state educational agencies to assist them to establish and maintain programs of testing, and of guidance and counseling in secondary schools. States to match dollar for dollar after first year.

Title 2

Federal assistance to institutions of higher education in form of student loan funds: Federal 90% — Institutions 10%. Potential college students must make application to colleges participating in this program.

Educational TV in this area will also make its appearance in the coming year. Experience has proved that Educational TV is a potential factor in upgrading the level of education in many areas. The purchasing of TV equipment will be a worthwhile project for civic groups to seriously consider.

I am sure that the community joins me in paying respect to Miss Myrtle Fletcher, R. N., deceased last summer, who for so many years, served faithfully and well, this community.

In conclusion, I should like to express my appreciation for the cooperation given me during the year as your superintendent of schools by the citizens, school board and teachers of Northwood.
