SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The past year brought many challenges to your Select Board. After a marathon town meeting and the re-election of Selectman Dalton, the Select Board settled in for another eventful year. This year included a major flood and flood-related damage on Halls Stream Road and several other town roads. Highlights for our highway department included an unusually heavy snowfall and the receipt of a new truck. Our fire department received a new tanker truck with a second new truck approved at town meeting. Our sewer department saw the State temporarily close our septage site on Indian Stream Road. Although the water department had several minor leaks, they were not faced with a major leak as had been experienced in the past.

In July, our Town Clerk resigned. Out of ten applicants, Marise Burns was selected to fill the vacancy until March. Mrs. Burns was required to attend several certification training classes in Concord during the month of August which was an unexpected additional cost in the budget. Mrs. Burns resumed regular office hours in mid September. Mrs. Dionne, Clarksville Town Clerk, handled our town clerk duties while Mrs. Burns was receiving required training.

In August, a deluge of rain caused extensive damage to several of the town roads, most notably Halls Stream Road, but also Arthur Scott Road, Tabor Road, Stewart Young Road, Golden Eagle Road, and Rogers Pond Road. Total cost of repairs to date is \$44,191.50. We received \$55,181.64 from FEMA and we have a balance of \$10,990 for graveling not yet completed on Arthur Scott Road, Tabor Road, and Halls Stream Road.

In September, the Town received notification from the NH Department of Environmental Services that we were to cease dumping in the septage lagoons on Indian Stream Road due to high nitrate levels in monitoring well number seven. In October, the Select Board met with a DES representative to tour the site and to discuss viable options to get the site re-opened. In the meantime, residents who needed their tanks pumped did so at a cost of approximately \$300 because the waste had to be hauled to Berlin. In November, the site samples came back with acceptable levels and dumping resumed on a limited basis. In the summer of 2009, we plan to reconfigure the lagoons to meet the town's needs and comply with State requirements. A new site would be cost prohibitive.

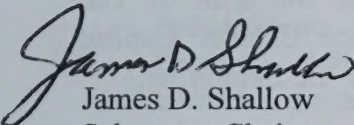
The cemetery trustees continue to make progress on our town cemeteries. Last summer, the fences at the Lake Cemetery and French Cemetery were replaced. The Indian Stream Cemetery has been our main focus over the past two years. Several monuments have been cleaned to include alignment and foundation replacement at a cost of approximately \$7,000. This summer we plan to replace the fence that runs along Tabor Road at the Indian Stream Cemetery.

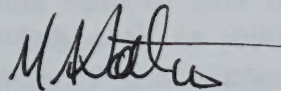
Our 2003 ambulance was sold to the 45th Parallel EMS on September 30th for \$52,500. We agreed to accept a \$10,000 deposit with 36 monthly payments of \$1,180.55 over the next three years. These funds will be going back into the Gayle Carr Trust as was voted on at last year's town meeting.

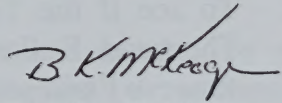
The town water system experienced seven minor problems during the year. Most were corrected within a few hours with one house being without water for approximately 24 hours. The town highway crew worked the lead with town equipment reducing the cost to the taxpayers. One pump at our reservoir in Clarksville had to be replaced in August. We also purchased a storage and pumping unit to be installed in the old fire station which will help water pressure in the lower village.

The town water system is old and in need of a major overhaul which includes a very expensive engineering study to decide how best to proceed. At this time, without Federal Assistance, it is unlikely this will happen anytime soon.

While the town did not have all the "cash on hand" to complete the purchase of the town park property from Roy Amey, we had received financial commitments to complete the purchase. All funds were received in early January 2009 with the deed being signed to the Town shortly thereafter.

**TOWN WARRANT
PITTSBURG, NEW HAMPSHIRE**

THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 6:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Bremer Pond Auditorium in said Town of Pittsburg on Tuesday, the 10th day of March 2009, at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of one Selectman for three years; one Town Clerk for one year; one Town Treasurer for three years; one Road Agent for three years; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Library Trustee for three years; one Overseer of Welfare for one year.
2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to be added to the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to be added to the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
4. To see if the Town will vote to trade in the 1999 Caterpillar Backhoe/Loader for a new one and to raise and appropriate the sum of Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000) for this purpose and authorize the withdrawal of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) from the Highway Heavy Equipment Capital Reserve Fund created for that purpose. The sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000) would come from the regular highway budget and the sum of Thirty-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$37,000) would be raised in additional taxation.
5. If the previous article does not pass, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) to be added to the Highway Heavy Equipment Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)

6. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Dump Closure Capital Reserve Fund created in 1989, the Fire Station Capital Reserve Fund created in 1990, and the Fire Station Expendable Trust created in 1997 in accordance with RSA 35:3. All of these funds have been completely expended and have zero balances. This is a “housekeeping” article requested by the Dept. of Revenue Administration.
7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to enter into a contract with the Town of Clarksville for fire coverage in that town.
8. To see if the Town is in favor of adopting the following ordinance under the authority of NH RSA 31:39, I (b):

PROPOSED ORDINANCE

“It shall be unlawful for any person to keep horses, cattle, swine, geese, goats, or poultry animals in such a manner that allows said animals to travel onto the property of another or onto any municipal right-of-way, unless under the direct supervision and control of it’s owner. Said animals shall be provided with a barrier or other means that prevents them from running at large onto the property of another. Adequate shelter, food and water shall also be provided to such animals.

Enforcement: This ordinance shall be enforced by any member of the Pittsburg Police Department upon receiving a complaint or personally observing a violation of this ordinance.

Penalty: Any person who violates this ordinance shall receive a written warning for the first offense and a \$100.00 minimum fine up to \$1,000 for any further violations and shall be liable for any damages resulting from a violation of this ordinance. If necessary, the New Hampshire State Veterinarian shall be notified and asked to investigate if there are any questions regarding an animal’s physical health or well being.”

Effective Date: This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.

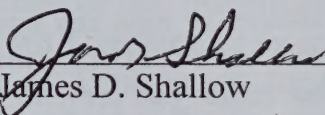
9. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board for the sole and limited purpose of administering a municipal flood plain ordinance to be subsequently enacted in the municipality to qualify the Town of Pittsburg and its inhabitants for participation in the National Flood Insurance Program. The Board shall consist of five [5] members and two [2] alternate members to be appointed by the Board of Selectmen until March 2010 when they shall be elected in accordance with RSA 673:2, II (b) (1), Local Land Use Boards.

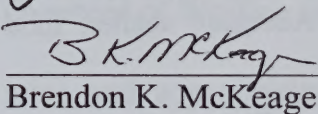
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Million One Hundred Twenty-Two Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-Eight Dollars (\$1,122,948) which represents the operating budget. Said sum DOES NOT include special warrant articles addressed.
11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

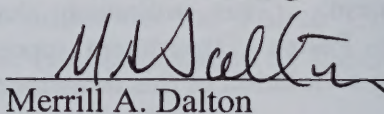

POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

Just like all of you, the Police Department felt the impact of the record gas prices in 2008. We cut back on some of our patrols and property checks in order to conserve fuel. We also spent more time in the village area. As a result, coupled with the fact that two of the part time Officers lost time due to injuries we were able to stay under budget. We finally saw a decline in gas prices, but we all know that this could change very suddenly. We also continue to seek grant money that enables us to purchase equipment without placing a burden on the taxpayers. Grants are only temporary and we never know when they will dry up.


All of the Officers received over and above the mandatory training time required by the State. We applied for a radio grant through Homeland Security and were fortunate enough to have it approved. This grant will cover the purchase and installation of mobile radios that will be combatable with our neighboring Vermont Agencies. This will allow direct communications with them in the event of a cross border incident. These radios will be installed in several cruisers along the Vermont/New Hampshire Border as well as in the Pittsburg Command Post trailer.

In 2008 we covered 103 Accidents, 144 Criminal Cases, 7 Juvenile Cases, 62 Motor Vehicle Court Cases, 6 Animal Cases and 9 OHRV Cases. Additionally, we had hundreds of Calls for Service, issued several hundred warnings, did motor vehicle lock outs and performed numerous property checks.

We strongly believe in the concept of community policing and feel it is important for us to be involved with the school and community. In 2008, we assisted the Coos County Sheriff's Department and the Colebrook Kiwanis in doing identity kits at the Pittsburg School. We hope to continue this in 2009 with an emphasis on the older students. As a result of this program we have on record, a picture ID of the participants as well as their fingerprints.

In closing, I want to thank the area Fire, EMS, State, Local & Federal Law Enforcement Agencies that came to our assistance in 2008. It is reassuring to know that they are always there when called upon. I also want to thank each of my Officers for the job they do. To their families I say thanks for allowing them to do their jobs. Thank you to the Selectmen for their support. Finally, to all of you that reside or visit our area, thanks for your continued support in our effort to make Pittsburg a safe community to visit or reside in.

In the year 2008 our Department responded to 108 calls, consisting of structural fires, haz mat spills, Car, skidder fires , snowmobile rescue and first response calls.

When you meet Lindsey Gray on the street please congratulate him on his 40 plus consecutive years of service on our Department.

We should thank the grant committee Dan Shallow, Sandy Young, Beverly Lord ,David Parker, Arnold Gray, Steve Kiley, Steve Wright, Mike Desroschers, Neil Prehmo and Sid Young without these devoted people we would not have received a grant for our new 4000 gallon Vacuum Tanker which replaced the 1972 delivery truck that was made into a 1500 gallon Tanker. This saved the towns people \$250,000 and got us back on track to replace the trucks in our aging fleet.

Just a little information, a lot of people have asked about ISO which is all towns Insurance ratings. For instance Hall Stream is in Pittsburg but if we cover from our station Instead of having Beecher Falls Fire Department cover this area which is 8 miles closer, the residents of this area insurance would double on their homes. This is a quote from an insurance company that I have had to clarify coverage areas. Beecher Falls Fire has been on automatic call with an Engine since Engine 3 (New Market engine that was given to us and was used for many years.) was taken out of service do to pump and other major problems. When you see any of the members of the Beecher Falls Fire Department, thank them for covering without question.

I also would like to thank the members of the Pittsburg Ambulance Corps, members who joined the Fire Department. Working with the 45th Parallel, has our first response stronger by not having to transport the patient, this has made the response faster, smoother and taken some of the burden off business or individuals that give or take time off from their work to go to help others.

PITTSBURG AMBULANCE CORPS REPORT

Well here it is, another year has passed and I need to tell the townspeople where we stand.

In March, the town voted to go along with the 45th Parallel ambulance service and to sell our ambulance for a fair market price.

The 45th Parallel took over in July as an ambulance service under the hospital and on October 1st at 12:00 AM, it started as a non-profit ambulance service and they purchased the Pittsburg ambulance.

We as an ambulance corps voted to join the Pittsburg Fire Department as a medical team fast responders and to keep going with our own meetings, but to take a leave of absence from these meetings until the first of the year. Some of the corps members also joined the 45th Parallel as attendants.

The 45th Parallel EMS is a NOT FOR PROFIT private corporation, recognized by the Internal Revue as a 501c (3). The agency is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of representatives appointed by the selectpersons from the following New Hampshire and Vermont towns: Bloomfield, Canaan, Clarksville, Colebrook, Columbia, Dixville, Lemington, Norton, Stewartstown, and Pittsburg; the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital, the Colebrook, Beecher Falls, and Pittsburg fire departments, the UCVH Emergency Department Medical Director, and two at large members elected by the board. The current board members are: President - Greg Placy (Colebrook); Vice President – Harry Brown (Stewartstown); Secretary - Clayton Hinds (At Large); Treasurer – Vacant; Bloomfield – Lynda Paquette; Canaan – Greg Noyes; Clarksville – Michael Dionne; Columbia – Brett Brooks; Dixville – Burnham “Bing” Judd; Lemington – Vacant; Norton – Franklin Henry; and Pittsburg – Brian Dorman; the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital – Louise McCleery, Colebrook Fire – Robert Lawton; Beecher Falls Fire – Steve Young; Pittsburg Fire – Sandy Young; and the UCVH Emergency Department Medical Director – Vacant.

The resource hospital for the agency is the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital which provides medical direction for providers in the field. The 45th Parallel EMS began operations on October 1, 2008 with a fleet of four ambulances three were donated by UCVH and one was bought from the Town of Pittsburg. It operates 24 four hours a day/7 days a week with a full time crew of 4 EMT-Intermediates, 2 EMT-Basics, twenty-five per diem employees and a Chief. Advanced Life Support providers respond on each 911 call. Advanced and Basic Life Support providers transport patients to other hospitals for specialty care, often with an Advanced Healthcare Provider on board, depending on the needs of the patient.

The 45th Parallel headquarters is temporarily housed on the grounds of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital. The transfer ambulance is housed off campus in a heated garage on the grounds of the Colebrook Country Club. A building that will house all of the ambulances and operations of the 45th Parallel EMS is

scheduled to be completed by September 30, 2009 on a building site, already purchased by the 45th, located on Ramsay Road off US Rte 3 in Colebrook. The 45th Parallel EMS serves an area of approximately 900 square miles and is anticipating responding to around 750 calls in 2009. During the months of October, November, and December 2008, the 1st three months of our operation, we responded to the following calls as outlined below by town:

- Bloomfield – 1 medical emergency.
- Canaan - 23 medical emergencies and 1 motor vehicle accident.
- Clarksville - 4 medical emergencies, 2 motor vehicle accidents, & 3 fire standbys.
- Colebrook – 31 medical emergencies & 2 motor vehicle accidents.
- Columbia - 2 medical emergencies.
- Dixville - 2 medical emergencies & 1 fire standbys.
- Lemington – 1 medical emergency.
- Norton – 1 medical emergency.
- Pittsburg - 22 medical emergencies, 2 motor vehicle accidents, 1 snowmobile accident, 4 medical alarm activations, 2 lift assists & 1 fire standby.
- Stewartstown - 22 medical emergencies including 9 at the Coos County Nursing Home, 1 motor vehicle accident, & 1 fire standby.

- Mutual Aid Requests –
 - 1 Advanced Life Support (ALS) intercept with Errol Rescue
 - 3 mutual aid responses for Errol Rescue
 - 1 mutual aid response for Groveton Ambulance

The 45th Parallel EMS works closely with Beecher Falls Volunteer Fire Department and Pittsburg Fire and Rescue who provide FAST Responder service within their catchment areas. This tiered system is what has helped to improve the time that it takes for patient care to be initiated and be transported. The 45th Parallel is committed to providing all area EMS providers with the required continuing education that is necessary for them to maintain their EMT licenses. The agency is sponsoring an EMT-Basic course and a FAST Responder course in 2009.

The leadership of the 45th Parallel is dedicated to fiscal responsibility and to operating the service efficiently to minimize the burden to the taxpayers in the participating towns. And the 45th is not immune from the challenges of health care reimbursement as we anticipate collecting 34% of charges. Though this may not sound like a significant amount, by health care standards, it is at or better than average. The agency has put a billing system in place and now has an approximate 20 day turn around for Medicare payments. Grant application opportunities are taken advantage of.

The 45th Parallel EMS is the first regional, not for profit ambulance service in the state of New Hampshire. The agency started out as a brand new service with many learning curves along the way. The dedication of the leadership and staff of the 45th Parallel EMS has allowed the agency to provide Advanced Life Support services to the area and to reduce response times significantly. One individual who is retiring, Perry Richardson of Stewartstown and the Beecher Falls Volunteer Fire Department, has stepped down as a board member and Treasurer of the organization after many years of leadership. His drive, dedication, and motivation to others are one of the primary reasons that the 45th Parallel EMS is up and running as a viable and vibrant agency. We will continue to strive to serve the citizens and visitors to the Great North Woods quickly and professionally in 2009.
