Bob (Shine) was born in Dover, NH on February 26, 1927. He lived the first half of his life in South Berwick, Maine, but then came to Rollinsford and has since lived here.

Bob attended Berwick Academy, then served 4 years in the U.S. Navy. He is a member of the American Legion Post No. 47.

Some 16 years ago Bob was offered the job of Road Agent here in Rollinsford. He had also been offered work at Pease Air Base, but he favored being a Road Agent because he felt it was the type of work he would enjoy.

Bob has a daughter, Janice Mitchell, and 2 grandsons, who are his pride and joy. He and his wife Alice are both retired now, and doing a little traveling.

SELECTMAN'S REPORT

Rollinsford felt the impact of the Seacoast's rapid economic and population growth during 1986. The Board of Selectmen issued building permits for 56 new homes and 25 new garages. This presents an annual growth rate of nearly 6%. These new homes contribute to growing demand for more municipal services. While many of us would like to keep things sane, simple and small, we face budget pressures driven by rising school enrollments, rising calls for police services, growing miles of streets and street lights to maintain, and growing piles of waste to collect.

In the Town Hall the growing number of auto registration fees collected by the Town Clerk, now exceeds \$140,000 per year. The Tax Collector now sends semi-annual "greetings" to approximately 100 more individuals who own property that has an aggregate market value exceeding 25,000,000.

A major subdivision with 33 units in 89 acres located adjacent to the Salmon Falls River in July 1987. While the developers have created a high quality subdivision, abutters and residents in the Sligo Road area expressed major concern about the impact on local roads and the ground water. Concerns generated by this subdivision serve to emphasize the need to plan for the future landscape of the town. Within the last 12 months, the owners of two major pieces of property along Roberts Road have died. The development of these old farms now becomes a possibility, as new owners ponder the future use of their land. While zoning regulations place limitations on the density of new housing, there is no assurance that this unique landscape will not be converted into an urban real estate project like Stockdale Farm. The purchase of development rights or land purchase, offers the only sureway to preserve the unique rural areas in Rollinsford. The Land Trust Fund, started two years ago, represents some small steps toward implementation of such as rural preservation efforts. The Land Trust Committee in Rollinsford is expected to identify land for future open space preservation, and begin discussion with owners about the owner and town benefits of such efforts.

In November, the Town added approximately 1.25 miles to the road system when Heritage and Moses Carr roads were accepted in the Roberts Farm Subdivision. Houses now occupy 33 of the 43 lots in Roberts Farm.

At the 1988 Town Meeting, the votes are being asked to approve the acceptance of Woods Road and River Road in the Woodland Subdivision off Sligo Road. The developer has completed the road except for the application of the final inch of surface pavement. Funds adequate to pay for applying this final road surface layer will be placed in reserve for the Town. Since the developer has agreed to limit construction to 12 units per year, the Town would prefer to delay the application of the surface layer until 1990 when most of the construction will be finished.

Bob (Shine) Chagnon, our veteran Road Agent, retired in November after 16 years of dedicated service to the Highway Department. Now that he is gone, many people realize what a terrific job he did with a limited budget. He planned to winter in Florida, but don't be surprised to see him back in town, after he realized that being away from home could be a little boring. Andy St. Hilaire, who stepped into Bob's shoes is becoming acquainted with our road problems.

The Police Department's rising service activities and related requests for a larger budget, have generated much discussion in Town this winter. The Police have expressed alarm about the reductions in overtime recommended by the Budget Committee. Some citizens have said that Rollinsford is over policed, while others have suggested that more policemen are needed. The 1987 budget financed the 5th full-time policeman who joined the police force in September.

The 1988 budget calls for a new police cruiser and equipment. The 1986 cruiser required

a major engine overhaul this winter. After the engine problems with the 1984 cruiser, the Town had purchased an extended service contract on the 1986 cruiser. Thus the cost of then \$2500 engine overhaul job was limited to \$75 under the service contract.

The 1988 budget also calls for a new \$148,495 fire truck with equipment. The warrant article calls for financing the truck with \$80,000 to be withdrawn from the Equipment Reserve Fund, and a \$40,000 bond or bank note. This article will require a 2/3's positive vote for passage.

The voters will also be asked to approve funds to finance the re-evaluation of assessed property in Rollinsford. The assessment ratio has declined to 65% and is expected to soon drop to 50%. The re-evaluation would be completed by October of 1988.

The Selectmen again express their appreciation to all the citizens who served on Boards and Committees during 1987. While it gets more difficult to find volunteers, the growing work load placed on Town Officials makes the contribution of volunteers or Boards ever more important, if we hope to continue our local participating form of government.

HYDROELECTRIC REPORT

The Town of Rollinsford received \$66,627.40 for its share of revenue from 5,982,000 KWH of electricity produced by the Hydroelectric Power Plant from November 1986 to October 1987. In accordance with Article 13 approved at the 1987 Town Meeting, \$50,000 was placed in the general fund and used as offset against 1987 town budget expenditures. That reduced the 1987 tax rate by approximately \$1.00 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. The remaining \$16,627.40 was placed in the Hydroelectric Reserve Fund.

The Hydroelectric Reserve Fund had a balance of \$18,421.99 on December 31, 1987. During the year, \$15,000 was removed from the Fund for offset against taxes as authorized by Article 12 of the 1987 Town Meeting. Additions to the Hydroelectric Reserve Fund during the year included \$16,627.40 of hydroelectric revenues and \$844.69 of interest received as deposits.

The 1988 Town Meeting will be asked to authorize the withdrawal of \$15,000 from the Hydro Reserve Fund as offset against 1988 expenditures.

Electrical production during the 12 month period ending in October, 1987 was 5,982,000 KWH, varying from a high of 933,800 KWH in April to a low of 67,200 KWH in August. This reflects the seasonal flow pattern shown for previous years.

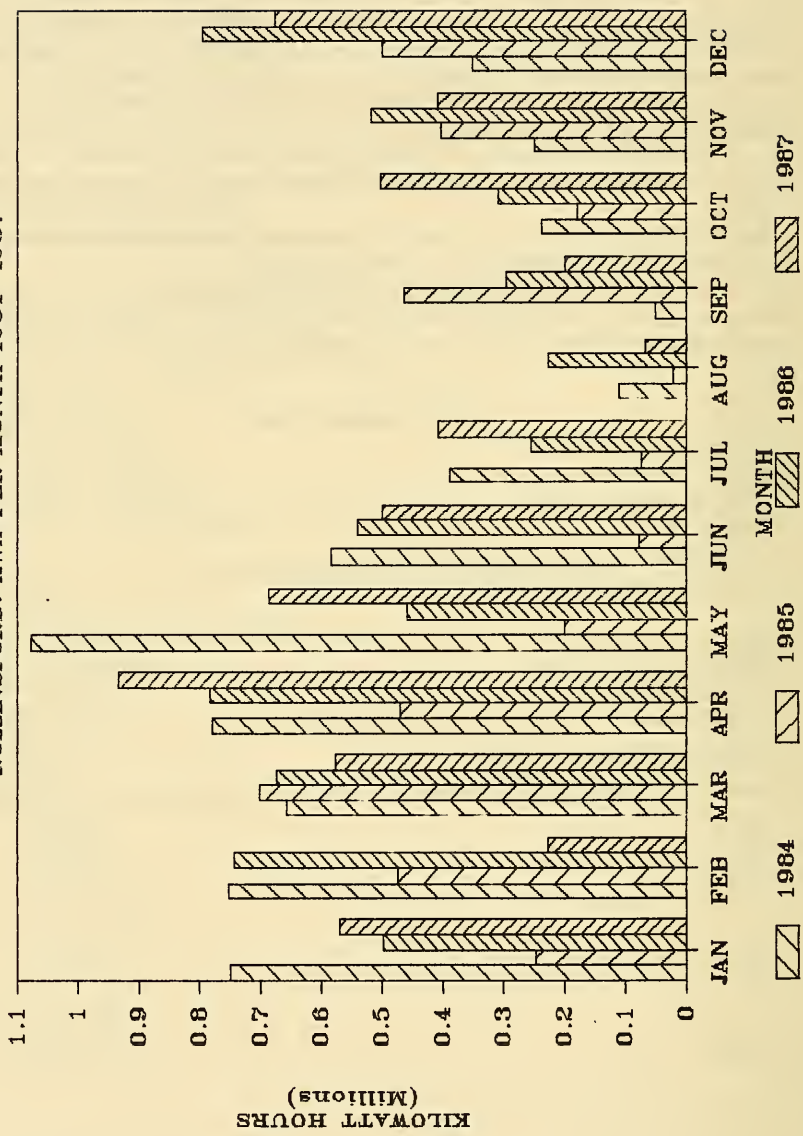

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF ROLLINSFORD,
COUNTY OF STRAFFORD, STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE,
QUALIFIED TO VOTE IN TOWN AFFAIRS:

You are hereby notified that the polls will be open from 10 A.M. to 6 P.M. at the Rollinsford Town Hall, on Tuesday, March 8, 1988, to bring in your ballots for the Town Officers to be elected in Article I, and to meet at the Rollinsford Grade School at 7:30 P.M. on the same day to act on the budget and other articles in the Warrant:

ARTICLE I

To bring in your ballots for:

- One (1) Selectman and Overseer of the Poor for three (3) years,
- Town Clerk for one (1) year,
- Town Treasurer for one (1) year,
- Chief of the Fire Department for one (1) year,
- One (1) Supervisor of the Checklist for two (2) years,
- One (1) Supervisor of the Checklist for six (6) years,
- Three (3) members of the Budget Committee for three (3) years,
- One (1) Trustee of Trust Funds for three (3) years,
- One (1) Trustee of the Rollinsford Library Trust for three (3) years.

ARTICLE II

To see if the Town will appropriate \$148,495 to purchase a Fire Truck Pumper and equipment to be financed with:

1. \$80,000 to be withdrawn from the Town Equipment Fund,
2. \$5,200 to be transferred from liabilities that were originally appropriated to repair the tank on the 1950 Fire Truck,
3. \$40,000 bond or bank note to be repaid in five (5) equal annual payments of \$8,000,
4. \$23,295 from 1988 tax revenues. (Requires 2/3 (Two-thirds) votes.)

ARTICLE III

To see if the Town will appropriate \$17,000 to purchase a new Police Cruiser and equipment.

ARTICLE IV

To see if the Town will appropriate \$13,600 to contract with the AVITAR CO. for a computer assisted re-evaluation of all assessed property in the Town. (The purpose is to equalize the assessed value of property and raise the assessment ratio from 65% to near 100%).

ARTICLE V

To see if the Town will appropriate \$8,200 for computerization of the Town Zoning Map and the Town Tax Map.

ARTICLE VI

To see if the Town will appropriate \$24,840 for Phase 8 of the road resurfacing program.

ARTICLE VII

To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$10,000 for the Land Trust Fund.

ARTICLE VIII

To see if the Town will appropriate a sum equal to all revenues in excess of \$50,000 that may be received from the hydroelectric plant to be placed in the Town's Hydroelectric Fund. (The first \$50,000 or any lesser amount that may be received will be used as offset against Town Budget expenditures).

ARTICLE IX

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$5,000 for land survey and related expenses for the purpose of assisting private land owners who donate conservation easements, or participate in the Land Conservation Investment Program. (LCIP)

ARTICLE X

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal of \$15,000 from Hydro Reserve Fund, to use as set-off against budget appropriations.

ARTICLE XI

To see if the Town will appropriate \$3,000 to assist COAST finance the operation of Route 7A from Dover to South Berwick through Rollinsford.

ARTICLE XII

To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Budget Committee.

ARTICLE XIII

To see if the Town will vote to support the establishment of a full time executive clerk position in the Selectmen's Office beginning in January, 1989.

ARTICLE XIV

To see if the Town will vote to accept the following article. (By Petition)

"Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 80:58-86 for a real estate tax lien procedure? These statutes provide that tax sales to private individuals for non-payment of property taxes on real estate are replaced with a real estate tax lien procedure under which only a municipality or county where the property is located or the state may acquire a tax lien against land and buildings for unpaid taxes."

ARTICLE XV

To see if the Town will vote to elect a Chief of Police at the Annual Town Meeting, held each year. (By petition)

ARTICLE XVI

To see if the Town will vote to hold the business portion of the Town Meeting on the second (2nd) Saturday of March at 9:00 A.M., beginning in 1989.

ARTICLE XVII

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE XVIII

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate that has been or may be acquired through Tax Collector's deeds.

ARTICLE XIX

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to accept Woods Road and River Road in the Skaltsis/Richard Subdivision off Sligo Road. The developer will provide for an escrow fund to cover the cost of applying the final inch of asphalt pavement to the road surface in the summer of 1990, after most of the houses have been constructed.

ARTICLE XX

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for and expend any Federal or State Grant Funds for which the Town may qualify.

ARTICLE XXI

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to lease Parking Spaces along the Scoutland Road near the Bicentennial Park to the Damart Corporation for a period up to two (2) years or until Damart secures other parking spaces, whichever time period is less.

ARTICLE XXII

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to lease or sell up to 5 acres of Lot 15-37 (Foundry Street Lot) to Damart or a future owner of Mill Building 1 for use as a parking lot, the selling price to be based on its value determined by a professional appraiser. A Public Hearing would be held on any proposed sale before any final lease with option to buy were negotiated by Selectmen.

ARTICLE XXIII

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for, accept, and expend a grant for up to 15% of the cost of new Street lights as authorized and approved by the Governor's N.H. Energy Office Special Street Light Program.

ARTICLE XXIV

To see if the Town will vote to adopt the BOCA Basic National Building Code and the Life Safety Code of the National Fire Protection Association. Minor repairs of less than \$1,500 will be exempt from the BOCA code.

ARTICLE XXV

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

ROLLINSFORD POLICE DEPARTMENT 1987

The year 1987 has brought several internal structural changes to the Department. In an effort to increase the Department's effectiveness, a new full time position was added. Due to the current Town Policy regarding recruitment, the position had to be advertised outside. The position was available April 1, 1987, but it was not filled until September, 1987. The tests were given and the position was offered to the top two candidates, who both turned the position down due to the low starting pay. The third candidate, Arthur Unobskey accepted the position. The differential in test scores was a matter of five points between first and third, but the days of having people clamoring to become a police officer, are numbered.

With the addition of the new officer, Robert Pantanella was appointed Lieutenant, and Robert Ducharme was appointed Sergeant. Lt. Pantanella's duties include the direct supervision of all part-time personnel, prosecution of all criminal and motor vehicle complaints, and other administrative functions. Sgt. Ducharme's new duties include the first-line supervision of all line department personnel and the training of all line personnel.

All general categories of activity has increased again outstripping the increase in population which Strafford County Regional Planning Commission has put at 6.4%. The most disheartening fact is that there has been an increase of 35% in reported crime, with Assaults and Burglary leading the increase.

On October 16, 1987 at 9:21 p.m., Officer David Cobban responded to a one car motor vehicle accident, on the Somersworth Road, in the vicinity of Crockett's Crossing. When he arrived on the scene, there were two entrapped persons in the vehicle. The vehicle had just begun to burn. At great personal risk, due to down high tension wire, Officer Cobban extricated both individuals from the vehicle. The Department will award the Medal of Honor to Officer Cobban, for his outstanding performance.

South Berwick Rescue has been servicing the Towns of Rollinsford and South Berwick for the past 26 years, with 24-hour, 365 days a year ambulance service. We have trained volunteer members readily available to answer emergency ambulance calls. Our equipment is up to date and our members continuously trained and licensed in the medical field to attend the ill and injured.

South Berwick Rescue is a non-profit volunteer service totally supported by donations. Yearly, we have a membership drive, to raise money. Rollinsford and South Berwick citizens participate in this. For \$20.00 yearly (\$10.00 senior citizens) your family will be covered for any emergency calls to the hospital (no transfers; doctor's appts., etc.) A non-member is charged \$100.00 for each call. Our membership letters and donation forms will be in the mail by May 1, 1988. Please watch for them.

The Rescue also provides free blood pressures at the office, first aid lectures to the public and other institutions and public CPR courses.

We are also always looking for good dedicated, dependable people to join our service as EMT's, Ambulance Attendants, and drivers.

1987 ROLLINSFORD PLANNING BOARD REPORT

During 1987 the Planning Board met 22 times to consider various issues affecting land development proposals that included eleven (11) subdivisions, and five (5) site review actions, either processed or initiated.

Subdivision activity against six (6) original lots has resulted in the creation of forty-nine (49) new lots. Site reviews resulted in one (1) home occupation approval and one (1) commercial floating zone approval.

Strafford Regional Planning Commission (SRPC) was hired to assist the Planning Board in updating the town's Master Plan. The Planning Board met several times with the SRPC and have updated the following chapters in the Town's Master Plan, Goals and Objectives, Population, Existing Land Use, Community Facilities and Services, Economic Development and Future Land Use. A Capital Improvements Program has also been initiated. A public hearing on the Master Plan update and the Capital Improvements will be held in early February 1988.

Board changes during 1987 included the appointment of Steve Roberts to fill the vacancy resulting from the resignation of Dave Safford. Three new alternates were appointed by the selectmen, they were Kenneth Bolduc, Robert Bersin and Susan Beauvais.

I wish to express my sincere thanks to the Planning Board members for their dedicated service during this year. I would especially like to thank Marc Couture for the excellent job he has done as our secretary.

The Commissioners would like to update the members of the Sewer District on the descisions that have been made during 1987 and what is in store for them in 1988.

During the past year a study was completed by HTA Associates concerning the upgrade of the collection. (Moving the collection system off private property and into the street).

The Commissioners, after a review of the HTA report, signed a contract with HTA for the design of the new collection system. This contract was broken down into various work tasks. Task 1 (A survey of the town) was authorized and completed before the end of 1987.

The following tasks are schedules to be completed in 1988:

Task 2 - A conceptual design for the proposed new system based on the survey data obtained on Task 1.

Task 3 - Test borings in the street where proposed new collection system will be installed. The location of each one of the test borings is determined using the conceptual design of Task 2.

Task 4 - The completion of the design for the new collection system based on the data provided by the three previous tasks.

Task 5 - A proposed cost analysis for the new system.

We are anticipating that the design for the new system will be complete in May of 1988. We will have a special Sewer District Meeting in June to present all the facts as we know them. At this time we also hope to have financing information and what the proposed cost would be to each homeowner if the District decides to do all or part of the design. We hope that everyone will come to listen to our presentation, express his or her opinion, and to vote for his or her choice. We as commissioners have gone as far as we can go at this time. We feel that this special meeting is important and is related to various occurences over the last several years.

The other item we need input on is the increase in the unit connection fee. HTA Associates has recommended that the fee structure be changed from a per unit connection fee to a per bedroom fee. It has been suggested that this fee be set at \$1800 per bedroom for any new housing unit that will be added in the town of Rollinsford.

Under the old unit connection fee, we collected \$51,000 in 1987 for the building permits that were issued that had access to a sewer line. We have opted at this time to use the money collected for the upgrade of the collection system. The money could also be used for any upgrades that may be required at the treatment plant. At the present time our greatest need is the collection system. Any suggestions you may have pertaining to the unit connection fee can be sent to the Rollinsford Sewer District, P.O. Box 174, Rollinsford, NH 03869.

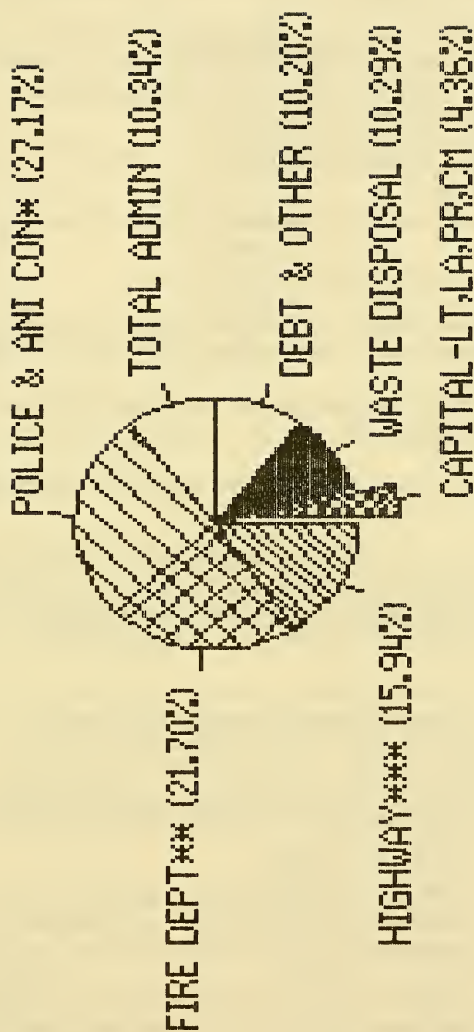

REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

To the Citizens of Rollinsford:

This year began with an intensive, school-wide study of the Constitution. Many students memorized the Preamble and many classes wrote their own constitutions. This study culminated in a professional play, "The Road to the Constitution", that was sponsored by the Rollinsford American Legion and the Patrolmen's Benevolent Association.

Other special events for the year have included two Christmas programs, one put on by the younger grades and one by the older students. In January, we studied Martin Luther King, Jr. and the role of the Civil Rights Movement. As this letter goes to press, we are preparing for our first Artist-in-Residence program; a painter will be working with all the

students in the school for two weeks. In the spring, the older students plan to present an elementary school version of the musical "Grease". As always, we have had an active intramural program of soccer, floor hockey, basketball, softball, etc.

The heart of the school is its academic program, and the staff (with the help of many parents and community volunteers) has been working hard to improve our Math program, using our new textbooks and working with more manipulatives and studying more real-life problems. Based on the results of a Writing Sample our fifth-graders take every year, we are trying to incorporate more writing in our Language Arts program, realizing more than ever that to **write** about a subject is to **learn** about that subject.

Finally, we try to provide a wholesome, nurturing environment for our growing student-body; an environment that stimulates young people to learn and grow academically, socially, emotionally and physically. We believe the Town of Rollinsford has much to be proud of in its Grade School.

To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are established to be received from the state foundation and fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Estimated 1987-88 - \$1,251,111.00 to operate the school and have the asbestos removed from the school. Vote accepted. Motion carried.

Article 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Other business: Appreciation to John Powers for his 16 years of service. Officers sworn in: Howard Hammond, Kathleen Ellis, and Nancy Dionne.

We have examined the general purpose financial statements of the Rollinsford School District as of and for the year ended June 30, 1987, as listed in the table of contents. As described in Note 1B, the general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the General Fixed Asset Group of Accounts, which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The amount that should be recorded in the General Fixed Assets Account Group is not known.

In our opinion, except that omission of the general Fixed Asset Group of Accounts results in an incomplete presentation, as explained in the above paragraph, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly the financial position of the Rollinsford School District at June 30, 1987, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, inconformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Our examination was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole. The combining and individual fund financial statement and scheduled listed in the table of contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of the Rollinsford School District. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the examination of the general purpose financial statements and, in our opinion, if fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole.

**WARRANT FOR ROLLINSFORD TOWN MEETING
STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
STRAFFORD, SS.**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rollinsford, County of Strafford, State of New Hampshire,
Qualified to vote in Town Affairs,

You are hereby notified that the polls will be open from 10 A.M. to 6 P.M. at the Rollinsford Town Hall, on Tuesday, March 10, 1987, to bring in your ballots for the Town Officers to be elected in Article I; to hear the results of the referendum articles voted on during the day; and to meet at the Rollinsford Grade School at 7:30 P.M. on the same day to act on the budget and other articles in the Warrant.

ARTICLE I

To bring in you ballots for:

- One (1) Selectman and Overseer of the Poor for three (3) years,
- Town Clerk for one (1) year,
- Town Treasurer for one (1) year,
- Chief of the Fire Department for one (1) year,
- Three (3) members of the Budget Committee for three (3) years,
- One (1) member of the Budget Committee for two (2) years,
- One (1) member of the Budget Committee for one (1) year,
- One (1) Trustee of Trust Funds for three (3) years,
- One (1) Trustee of Library Trust Fund for three (3) years,

Articles 2 thru 9 are changes to the Zoning Ordinance to be voted on by ballot at the Town Hall between 10 A.M. and 6 P.M.

ARTICLE II

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to the Town Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board?

This Amendment modifies the 'Definition' section of the Ordinance with the addition of three new terms, "private airport", "wetland", and the revision to the terms "mobile home" and "sectional homes". These terms are included or modified to support specific use regulations currently included in the Ordinance or being proposed elsewhere in these warrant articles.

ARTICLE III

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to the Town Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment modifies the 'Zoning Districts' section of the Ordinance for the addition of a newly proposed "Wetland Conservation District", identified as an overlay district, and designed for managing development activity in wetland areas of Rollinsford. This new overlay district will complete the recommended water resource protection (wells, aquifers, and now wetlands) highly urged for all communities in New Hampshire.

ARTICLE IV

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 3 to the Town Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment modifies the 'Use Regulations' section of the Ordinance for the addition of specific regulations governing uses within the proposed "Wetland Conservation District". Also, modifications to the residential portion of the Table of Uses are included to append new special provisions reference for residential development within the Industrial Zone, so as to maximize the preservation of this part of Rollinsford for commercial and industrial uses. An entry for "home occupation" is also added so that this use may be recognized as permitted in Rollinsford, subject to special provisions control.

ARTICLE V

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 4 to the Town Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment modifies the 'Land Space Requirements Table' section of the Ordinance for the addition of footnote references (10 and 11) to the Table, and for the addition of footnote references statements. The first footnote specifies the exclusion of wetland areas and steep slopes in the calculation of minimum lot sizes, and the second restricts the building of structures within the 100 feet of the Salmon Falls river and within 50 feet of other active streams in Rollinsford.

ARTICLE VI

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 5 to the Town Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment modifies the 'Special Provisions' section of the Ordinance for more clearly detailing the rules guiding the development of land under "open space" or "cluster" building concepts.

ARTICLE VII

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 6 to the Town Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment modifies the 'Special Provisions' section of the Ordinance for the addition of rules governing "home occupation" uses within residential areas of Rollinsford.

ARTICLE VIII

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 7 to the Town Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment modifies the 'Special Provisions' section of the Ordinance for the addition of a provision limiting residential development within the Industrial Zone to lots fronting on Somersworth Road, Rollins Road, Pease Lane, and a portion of Old Indigo Road (not currently closed to gates and bars).

ARTICLE IX

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 8 to the Town Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment modifies the 'Enforcement' section of the Ordinance for the purposes of updating the fee structure associated with the issuance of Building and Occupancy permits.

ARTICLE X

To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE XI

To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provision of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as

set off against budget appropriations in the amount indicated, and to further authorize Selectmen to make pro-rata reduction in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or take any other action thereof.

ARTICLE XII

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal of \$15,000 from the Hydro-Reserve fund, to use as set off against budget appropriations.

ARTICLE XIII

To see if the Town will appropriate a sum equal to all revenues in excess of \$50,000 that may be received from the hydroelectric plant to be placed in the Town's Hydroelectric Fund. (The first \$50,000 or any lesser amount that may be received will be used as offset against town budget expenditures).

ARTICLE XIV

To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$10,000 for the Town Land Trust Fund.

ARTICLE XV

To see if the Town will authorize the use of money from the Land Trust Fund to pay for land appraisals required before property owners can donate land development rights to land trusts.

ARTICLE XVI

To see if the Town will appropriate \$5,000 for land appraisals as approved under Article XV and authorize the withdrawal of the funds from the Land Trust Fund. The Selectmen would hold a public hearing on proposed use of the money before authorizing expenditures.

ARTICLE XVII

To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$25,000 for the Town Equipment Fund to be reserved for the future purchase of a 1000 gallon pumper for the Fire Department. (\$50,000 already in the Fund will also be reserved for future purchase of the pumper. If approved, an article will be in the 1988 Town Warrant to purchase the truck.)

ARTICLE XVIII

To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$23,000 for phase 7 of the road resurfacing program.

ARTICLE XIX

To see if the Town will appropriate \$2,600 to purchase a road sander for the Highway Department.

ARTICLE XX

To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$32,000 to purchase new street lights.

ARTICLE XXI

To see if the Town will vote to borrow the sum of \$32,000 to finance the purchase of new street lights. A four (4) year note would be secured to be repaid four (4) equal annual payments.

ARTICLE XXII

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend a grant for up to 10% of the cost of new street lights as authorized and approved by the Governor's N.H. Energy Office Special Street Light Program.

ARTICLE XXIII

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to transfer \$500 from the proposed 1987 Welfare Account number 800.58 to a new account number 800.62 for the Strafford County

Community Action Committee to use in efforts to meet needs of low income Rollinsford residents for weatherization, fuel assistance, surplus commodities, transportation and other services.

ARTICLE XXIV

To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Budget Committee.

ARTICLE XXV

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE XXVI

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate that has been or may be acquired through Tax Collector's deeds.

ARTICLE XXVII

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept Heritage Road and Moses Carr Road in Roberts Farm Subdivision after the Planning Board certifies that these roads have been built and completed to meet Subdivision standards.

ARTICLE XXVIII

To see if the Town will vote to amend its vote of 1985 so that a building permit may be issued to the owner of Lot No. 6, without requiring further improvement to a Woodland Drive. (By Petition)

ARTICLE XXIX

To see if the Town will vote to petition the U.S. Postal Service to change the Rural Free Delivery on RFD 1, from the Dover Post Office to the Rollinsford Post Office.

ARTICLE XXX

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for, accept, and spend any Federal or State grants for which the Town may be eligible.

ARTICLE XXXI

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

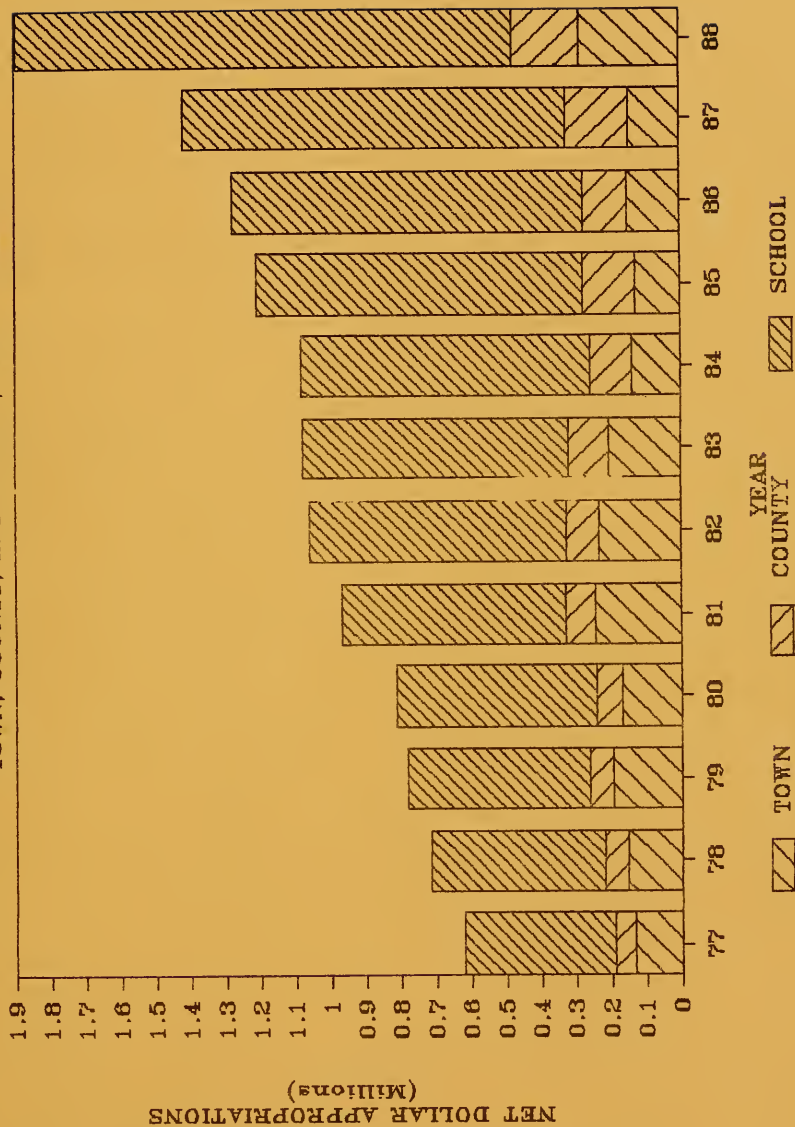
