# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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## TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at 10 a. m. in the forenoon for the election of Town Officials elected by ballot, and at the Troy Elementary School on the same day at 8 p. m. for the meeting on the remainder of the articles in the following Warrant.

Article 1. To bring in your votes for a town clerk, one selectman for three years, town treasurer, tax collector and all other officers elected by ballot.

Article 2. To see what action the town wishes to take upon the figures submitted by the budget committee with their recommendation.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the following town expenditures for the ensuing year:

- a. Town officers salaries
- b. Town officers expenses
- c. Election & Registration
- d. Town Hall and other buildings
- e. Parks & playgrounds
- f. Legal fees and vital statistics
- g. Insurance
- h. Social Security



- i. Interest on temporary loans
- j. Memorial Day
- k. Town Dump
- l. Street lighting
- m. Civil Defense
- n. Pine Blister Control

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for snow removal, salting and sanding of highways.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highways oiling and general maintenance.

Article 6. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$2,230.75 to which the State will contribute \$334.61 if voted and accepted, for the construction and maintenance of Class 5 roads.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of the fire department.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the police department.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the maintenance and operation of the water department.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to extend the water main four hundred feet along the so-called Longmeadow Drive, off South Main Street. (by petition)

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to extend the water main four hundred feet on South Street. (by petition)

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$392.28 (six cents per \$1,000.00 of the town's equalized valuation) to the Monadnock Regional Association.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the employment of a district nurse.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money as its share of the operating cost of Elliot Community Hospital.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the continuation of the War Memorial Program.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the Gay-Kimball Library.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and improvement of cemeteries.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to make the position of cemetery sexton appointive by the cemetery committee rather than elected. If passed, to become effective as of the Town Meeting of 1966.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Public Welfare.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges in anticipation of taxes.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the moderator to name a planning board of seven members to make a study of town needs, and present their findings at annual Town meeting of 1966 for consideration.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to Camp Holiday toward the expense of town children using these facilities during the summer, or take any action relating thereto.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for payment of water bonds and interest on same.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to establish the

pay of the tax collector on a yearly salary basis in place of the percentage payment now being made, or take any action relating thereto.

Article 25. To hear the reports of agents, officers or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

**TRUSTEES REPORT****January 1, 1965**

The Trustees have embarked upon a long-range program for improving the Gay-Kimball Public Library. Upon examination of the report of the treasurer, one will find that a total of \$857.02 was spent for the purchase of books, both fiction and non-fiction. This represents nearly 40% of the total gross income. This is a very good percentage of expenditures for books.

With the introduction of the statewide library development program, where it is possible to receive matching funds from the state and federal government, it is necessary that the library receive additional funds from the town.

The increased appropriation will allow the library to improve its reference section, to keep the library open two more hours a week, and to begin to improve the basement for use by the children during story hours and for stacking of books.

All of the above improvements will make the library more effective as an instrument of learning for the students and more accessible to the public for its reading enjoyment.

The Trustees would like to express their appreciation to the Friends of the Library for their active part in library activities during the past year. The story hour program for children of kindergarten age through grade 6 has been well attended and greatly enjoyed by many youngsters. The Troy citizens are also to be commended for their participation in the excellent arts and crafts exhibit which was at the library last April during National Library Week.

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## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy — both industrial and recreational — is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area — 4,350,000 acres — is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.
