# TOWN WARRANT The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Tuftonboro in the County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town House in said Tuftonboro on Tuesday, the Fourth (4th) day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. The sum of one hundred forty-eight thousand three hundred fifty dollars and eleven cents, (\$148,350.11), as approved by the Budget Committee.
- 3. To see what action the Town will take on the Amendments to the Zoning Ordinances prepared by the Planning Board. The amendments to the Zoning Ordinances will appear in the form of questions on the Official Town Ballot.

The following ten amendments are a complete list of all proposed changes and will be on file and available at the Office of the Town Clerk and, on the day of the Town Meeting, will be available for inspection at the Town House:

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amendment No. 1. All lots on a public road or private road with no water frontage in Zone 1 and Zone 2 shall have an area of at least two (2) acres and frontage of at least 200 feet. Lots in Zone 3 shall have an area of at least one (1) acre and shall have at least 150 feet of frontage. In addition, each lot must be of adequate size to support approved on-site water supply and sewage disposal systems.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 2 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amendment No. 2 All lots on a pond or lake shall be at lesat one (1) acre in area and shall have at least 150 feet of frontage measured in a straight line distance between the side boundaries at their intersection with the normal high water line. They shall be at least 200 feet in depth. In addition, each lot must be of adequate size to support on-site water supply and sewage disposal systems.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 3 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amendment No. 3. All lots on ponds and lakes designated for communal use of the owners of contiguous back lots shall have a minimum depth of 200 feet, except those lots with frontages of 100 feet or less shall have minimum depths of twice the ontage.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 4 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amendment No. 4. Change Article IV B. 2 (a) to require all Mobile Homes to be 500 square feet in minimum size, and comply with national standards.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 5 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amendment No. 5. Change Article IV B. 3 to require mobile home parks to be at least (20) twenty acres in size.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 6 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zining ordinance as follows?

Amendment No. 6. Change Article IV B. 3 to require mobile home parks to have a 30 foot setback from adjacent property lines and eliminate screening adjacent to property lines.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 7 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amendment No. 7. Change Article IV B. 4 to require Recreational Camping Parks to have a 25 foot setback between the campsites and all adjacent property lines and eliminate screening adjacent property lines.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 8 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amendment No. 8. Change Article IV B to require recreational areas of 20,000 square feet or a minimum of 1000 square feet per unit in all mobile home parks.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 9 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amendment No. 9. Delete Article IV B. 4 (e) which allows for use of transient recreational vehicles to be used as a residence for 6 months in any calendar year and substitute the following:

7. Residential occupancy of tents and recreational vehicles shall be permitted only for bona fide guests in connection with the occupancy of a residence (as defined above) and such occupancy of either tents or recreational vehicles at any residence shall not exceed a total of four weeks in any season of the year. No more than one such unit may be occupied in connection with any residence. Any tent or recreational vehicle temporarily placed upon a residential lot shall be located as inconspicuously as possible so as to minimize to the greatest degree possible the unit's visibility from public roads or neighboring lands. Children's tents, used by the minor children of the occupants of the residence are exempt from this paragraph.

Overnight camping in tents or recreational vehicles shall be permitted provided that each unit is located out of sight of public roads and neighboring lands, and provided that no more than one such unit shall be permitted for each acre of the property on which it is located.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 10 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amendment No. 10. To change Article V to redefine the limits of Zone 2 (Lake shores and islands) to include a strip 600 feet wide on the north side of Route 109 from Mirror Lake to Route 109-A at its intersection with Route 109 at Melvin Village.

These amendments will become effective upon date of passage.

- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Hundred Twenty-two Dollars and Ninety-six Cents (\$722.96) for Town Road aid as approved by the Budget Committee. The State to contribute the sum of Four Thousand Eight Hundred Nineteen Dollars and Seventy-two cents (\$4,819.72).
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) to help finance the Wolfeboro Area "Meals-on-Wheels" program for local elderly residents who may need such services through the year as authorized under R.S.A. 167-A;10. This Article submitted by petition.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) to be used by the Wolfeboro Rescue Squad to purchase new equipment.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) and authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year, and issue notes therefore, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year. As approved by the Budget Committee.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Five Hundred Ten Dollars and Sixty-two Cents (\$10,510.62) and authorize its withdrawal from State Highway Subsidy (Ch. 241, Sect. 14). This money to be applied toward the general repair and betterment of Town roads and bridges for the ensuing year. As approved by the Budget Committee.
- 9A. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) for Town Dump solid waste disposal building and machinery (at the Fred Sargent property on Route 171) and to issue notes therefor, said notes to be repaid from taxes in the fiscal years 1975, 1976 and 1977. And further, to see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1500.00) to pay interest on said notes for the year 1975.
- 9B. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-eight Thousand Dollars (\$28000.00), for solid waste land fill (of which sum Twelve Thousand Dollars \$12,000.00) will be applied from Town surplus, and to authorize the withdrawal of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00) from the Revenue Sharings fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, to be used as part of this appropriation.

- 10. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell Lot No. 11, Little Bear Island to Thomas P. Hall at \$16,520.00. Such sale to be contingent upon the quieting of title on the subject parcel by the Town; and the granting of septic system approval thereon; and the taking back of a purchase money mortgage by the Town in connection with the conveyance, terms of said mortgage to include a \$7,000.00 down payment with 8% interest on the balance over a ten year period with no penalty for early payment.
  - 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

# REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid-August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodlands closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.

#### REPORT OF PLANNING BOARD 1974

As the result of a citizens' petition relative to mobile homes and larger residential lots, the Planning Board undertook in 1974 a revision of the subdivision regulations and the proposal of amendments to the zoning ordinance. The subdivision regulations were thoroughly revised and were aired at a required public hearing on the 12th of July. The Board adopted these revisions at a Special Meeting on July 19th. Amendments to the zoning ordinance were proposed at two informational meetings and the two public hearings required were held on the 12th of November and the 10th of December. The ten amendments proposed are to be voted upon by ballot at the polls on the day of the town meeting.

A great part of the work of the Planning Board is the processing and approval of subdivisions of land. Forty-seven lots were created in eleven approved subdivisions. Of these eleven subdivisions, only three were for more than three lots. These three subdivisions involved fourteen, seven and seven lots.

The following changes were made in office and membership of the Planning Board. Lincoln Page was chosen chairman to succeed Edmund Dagnino. Thomas Hunter and Edmund Dagnino resigned and were replaced by Susan Ramsbotham and Albert Southard. The member from the Board of Selectmen is Daniel Lewis.

Roger Krey, secretary of the Board, represents Tuftonboro at the Lakes Region Planning Commission. The other representative to the Commission is Pamela Devork Albee, appointed this year by the Selectmen with the concurrence of the Planning Board.
