

# Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. S.]

To the inhabitants of the town of Unity, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
2. To choose three Selectmen and all other necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways, and to determine how it shall be expended.
4. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum sufficient to secure state aid for permanent highway improvement.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum sufficient to secure state aid for state road maintenance.
6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for other necessary town charges.
7. To see if the town will vote to buy a road machine and raise and appropriate money therefor.
8. To hear and act upon the reports of the Selectmen, Town Treasurer, Road Agents and Auditor.
9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

5. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
6. To hear the reports of the treasurer, school board,  
auditor and agents or committees heretofore chosen, and pass any  
vote relating thereto.
7. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school  
board to unite with one or more town districts, for the purpose of

Good teachers have been employed and on a whole good results have been obtained. The attendance of pupils though good in some schools is not what it should be. The absence or non absence of pupils, makes very little difference in the cost of the town for maintenance of schools so those parents who do not send their children regularly to school are paying out money for which they get no return. A close inspection of our school registers shows but few parents names in the visitors' column and most of them appear on the last day of school, or some other gala occasion. Now, may we not expect in the coming year more evidence of a kindly interest on the part of parents,
