THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 7:00 A.M.to 7:00 P.M.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Barnstead in the County of Belknap in said state, qualified to vote in the Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Barnstead Town Hall in said Barnstead on Tuesday, the Fourteenth (14th) day of March, next at 7:00 a.m. of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. The second session for purpose of discussing and voting upon the articles of the Town Warrant shall be held on Saturday, March 18, 1995, at 9:00 a.m. at the Barnstead Elementary School. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto, and to discuss all other business to come before the meeting.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to reconvey the property on Tax Map 6 known as Lot 63 on Narrows Road to Nancy Rowell and to the estate of Edwin Rowell on payment of all taxes, interest, costs and expenses of the town in maintaining the property. This property was acquired by tax deed in Dec. 1994. Said reconveyance must be completed within 120 days of this town meeting.

4. To see if the voters shall direct the Selectmen to provide to Nancy Rowell, a good and sufficient quit claim deed of the Town's interest in those premises situated on Narrows Road, which said premises were the subject of a recent Tax Collector's Deed to the said town for unpaid taxes, interest and costs relating to the year of the levy 1991; said duty of the Selectmen to be contingent upon the provision to the Town of an amount equal to the balance of the real estate tax liability for said year of levy, all interest which accrued on said tax liability through the date of the Tax Collector's Deed, all statutory costs incurred by the Tax Collector in connection with said tax liability and the preservation of the Town's interest therein, the cost of preparing and recording said Tax Collector's Deed and the cost of preparing and recording said quitclaim deed to Nancy Rowell, and further on the condition that the said Nancy Rowell tenders said

amounts to the Town within 30 days of the presentation by the Selectmen and Tax Collector to her, in writing, an itemization of the said tax liability, interest and costs. (By Petition)

5. To see if the Town will vote to reconvey the property on Tax Map 10 Lot 8 on Narrows Road to William D. Sinclair on payment of all taxes, interest, costs, and expenses of the town in maintaining the property. This property was acquired by tax deed in Aug. 1993 said reconveyance must be completed within 120 days of this town meeting.

6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction all properties now held by the town, acquired by tax deed, or deeded to the town in lieu of taxes. All proceeds from the sale to be used to reduce taxes.

7. To see if the Town will approve withdrawing the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, (\$10,000.00) from the Library Capital Reserve Fund to be used, as needed, to complete the library parking lot, and to begin development of the handicapped access on the library lower level. (Recommended by the Capital Improvements Committee, Budget Committee and Selectmen)

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars, (\$15,000.00), and same to be placed in the Library Construction Capital Reserve Fund, created for this purpose. (Recommended by the Budget Committee and Selectmen)

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nineteen Thousand Three Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars, (\$19,352.00), for the purpose of purchasing a new police cruiser. (Recommended by the Budget Committee and Selectmen)

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, (\$5,000.00), to be placed in the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund. (Recommended by the Budget Committee and Selectmen)

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept Hillsgrove Road as a Class V Town Highway. Said road having a right of way of 50 feet and a length of .35 miles running from Route 28 in a westerly direction to Ridge Road. (By Petition)

12. Shall the term of office for the Road Agent of the Town of Barnstead be for a period of three(3) years, as permitted by New Hampshire RSA 231:62-A. (By Petition) Ballot Vote Required

13. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Town Fire Department under RSA 154 as follows:

(A) Pursuant to RSA 154:1, III, the Fire Chief, Officers; and Fire Fighters shall be selected by the Fire Fighters; and

(B) The Selectmen are hereby authorized to negotiate the lease of property and equipment from Barnstead Fire Rescue Inc. and to utilize Barnstead Fire Rescue Inc. for the management and operation of the Town Fire Department pursuant to RSA 154:1-BB on such terms and conditions as they may deem necessary and convenient and with an annual appropriation for that purpose.

14. 1) Shall the Government of the Police Department of the Town of Barnstead be entrusted to a Police Commission?

2) If so shall such Police Commissioners be chosen by:

(A) Popular election at town election?

(B) Appointment of the Governor with consent of the council?

(By Petition) Ballot Vote Required RSA 39:3-D

15. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund under the provisions of RSA 35:1 for the purpose of purchasing rescue and fire fighting equipment and to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars, (\$20,000.00) to be placed in this fund. (Recommended by the Budget Committee and Selectmen) Majority Vote Required.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Sixty Thousand and no/100 Dollars, (\$60,000.00), for an engineering study on 1.6 miles of the Varney Road. Submitted by Roads and Bridges Committee. (Recommended by the Budget Committee and Selectmen)

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars, (\$25,000.00), to repair (shim) 0.75 miles of the Parade Hill Road. Submitted by Roads and Bridges Committee. (Recommended by the Budget Committee and Selectmen)

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty-Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars, (\$55,000.00), to repair (shim) 1.4 miles of the Bow Lake Road. Submitted by Roads and Bridges Committee.(Recommended by the Budget Committee and Selectmen)

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty-Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars, (\$35,000.00), to pave 0.4 miles of the Walker Road. Submitted by Roads and Bridges Committee.(Not Recommended by Budget Committee and Selectmen)

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Dollars, (\$3,000.00) for the purchase of a highway sander for the Road Agents patrol truck.(Recommended by the Budget Committee and Selectmen)

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate Ten Thousand Dollars, (\$10,000.00) to be placed in the Capital Reserve Account entitled Bridge Construction Capital Reserve Fund.(Recommended by the Budget Committee and Selectmen)

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept sealed bids on the following surplus items owned by the Town:

- 1 Photo Copier
- 1 Cat 112 Grader
- 1 I H Farmall Tractor
- 1 Used Police Cruiser

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE ROAD AGENT

In 1994, the Barnstead Highway Department worked on these projects:

1. Opened the Bosco Bell Bridge to a 6 ton limit.
2. Widened and paved 1.1 miles of Peacham Rd. plus two culverts and guard rail (Paving by Tilcon).
3. Widened and graveled Garland Rd. Put in 9 culverts (12 to 15" X 30') plus one 36" X 40' to make it a through road.
4. Reclaimed and paved a section of Maple St. and Beauty Hill Rd. East (Paving by Pike).
5. The town crew put 3 culverts in Cook Rd, 1 in Tom Berry Rd. and 1 in Province Rd.
6. Built a new salt shed, 12 X 20', with poles from Peacham Rd, used lumber from bridge plank, lumber from blow down trees sawed by Miner's Wood Products, and metal roofing from Barton's Lumber Co.
7. Cut and removed 38" diameter pine tree on White Oak Rd, took out stump with Town's new Caterpillar backhoe/loader.
8. Graded all Barnstead's dirt roads several times and added gravel to many of them.
9. Reconstructed Brindle Pond Rd (Lewis Corner) and put in a 12" culvert.
10. The town crew cut and chipped brush on several roads and paid for the chipper with chips.
11. The town crew screened and hauled winter sand from Valley Dam Rd.
12. The town crew plowed and sanded roads during and after winter storms.

A giant "THANK YOU" to Richard Kennealy for the sand and bank run gravel that he gave to the Town which was used on Garland Rd.

We have a good crew that works well together!

REPORT OF OSCAR FOSS MEMORIAL LIBRARY 1994

It's hard to believe that I have now passed the 10 year mark as the Library Director at the OFML but it is so! I am also pleased to report that in the Spring I received my Library Certification thru the College of Life-Long Learning.

Many things are always happening at the Library and this year was no exception. A few statistics: We circulated 13,385 items which was yet another increase from 1993. Interlibrary loan items and large print book requests were substantially increased and we also circulated 982 videos (600 in 1993) We feel this demonstrates the versatility of "today's library". We have issued 882 family cards to date and many of these cards are for three and four members of a family.

With the addition of 11 hours per week we are now open 29 hours a week and this has given us a chance to better meet the needs of the public as well as allow us the time to start "catching up" on some of our projects. The retrospective conversion is coming along great and we anticipate having a partially automated circulation early in 1995.

Almost 500 acquisitions were added to the library's holdings this year and we continue to keep up with the current best sellers through our McNaughton rental plan. We also held a couple of nonscheduled book sales due to the abundance of donated books.

The summer reading program was once again a great success with 31 children participating in the American Library Association/McDonald's National Reading Program. The theme this year was "Reading is a Magic Trip". Story hours were held throughout the summer and we ended the story hours with a very special program. Keeping true to the reading program title, "Reading is a Magic Trip" we were able to have a professional magician, the Rev. John Udall, at our last story hour. Over 60 children and adults were on hand to see Rev. Udall amaze us with his prestidigitation! We all saw rabbits poking their heads out of hats and half dollars appeared out of thin air - what a way to end the summer!

The summer was also an EXTREMELY busy time for us as the Barnstead Elementary School initiated a required summer reading program. We have always had a number of children who attend area high schools come to us for their required summer reading. However, with the Barnstead school library temporarily closed due to construction we had numerous students in the library and we surpassed all of our other summer circulation statistics!

This fall and continuing through the school year we are delighted to be able to help Barnstead Elementary by offering our support to have their Teddy Bear Circle, a story hour for preschoolers, here at the library.

Several scout troops came to the library this year to have a tour and we are always happy to help someone understand what goes on in a library.

We are very grateful to still have some dedicated volunteers who come to the library on a regular basis and help us out. Carolyn Johnson, Teresa Parra, Shirley Berubee and Melonie Murray continue to help with the computerization of the library and many other tasks.

We of course still have our wonderful Friends group at the library. They worked very hard again this year at the annual Tree Sale, Book Sale and Pie Sale. Some of their funds were spent on carpeting for the downstairs, a button maker we could use for the summer reading program, books, shrubs for the front of the building and the second computer station. The Friends also co-sponsored the magician and had a Christmas Craft night. This is a very positive group of wonderful people who work only to benefit the library and they welcome anyone to join at any time.

Inside the library building, some interior painting was done and our emergency lighting was brought up to date with the installation of an emergency light in the downstairs and exit sign in the upstairs. We have also had a new bookdrop installed as many of the books written today were just too large to fit thru the old existing drop.

Bonnie Brannigan has been the Assistant Librarian since January and is a very welcome addition to the library. Mary Thorne continues to be our part-time librarian and is able to help out whenever we need her.

Libraries are indeed a multi-diversified information center and the Oscar Foss Memorial Library tries very hard to meet the needs of all the patrons. We are small, but with the help of many dedicated people, including the Board of Trustees, we are able to stand back and watch the library grow and feel a real sense of pride and accomplishment!

REPORT OF THE BARNSTEAD PLANNING BOARD

1994 was a year of lessened activity due to the poor economy and subsequently slow real estate market.

During the course of the year the following applications were acted on:

- 5 Site plan reviews for new businesses in Town
- 3 Minor lot line adjustments
- 1 Minor subdivision
- 1 Major subdivision(pending)

This year we welcomed three new members to the Board, Jim Kallgren, Bob Simpson and Dave Foss. Under the guidance of Bob Simpson, the Capital Improvement Plan was updated at the end of the year, thanks to a lot of hard work by a diverse group of volunteers and Department Heads.

We have been working with the Zoning Board of Appeals for several years now to make the Zoning Regulations a document that reflects the way we live. This past year there were only three hearings held by the Zoning Board and four of the ten ballot questions are a result of those hearings.

After Town Meeting, when the results of the voting on the ballot questions are known, we will incorporate the changes in the Zoning Ordinance and reprint it in a new form which revises the numbering slightly and utilizes the capabilities of our word processing software to make the document easier to read.

REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

In 1994 the Conservation Commission added a new member. James Fougere was selected to replace William Jenisch. Jim works for an environmental firm in Concord. He comes to the Commission with a strong background in environmental assessment. We look forward to his participation on the Commission.

Not many residents are aware of the amount of undeveloped land that is in the possession of the Town. Over the years the Selectmen and the Conservation Commission acquired land for a variety of reasons. Many of the lots are small which protect wetlands and water resources. Other larger lots are used for resource management or future expansion.

The Conservation Commission is in the process of mapping these parcels. When completed, they will be incorporated into the State Geographical Information System. Our goal is to have this project completed in 1995.

The Conservation Commission will continue to work with the Wetlands Board of the Department of Environmental Services to review dredge and fill permits and inspect sites for compliance with Administrative Rules.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

In the calendar year 1994, our three (3) leading causes of fires were No Permit, Children and Rekindles of fires where the fire was not properly extinguished.

Violations of RSA 224:27 II, the fire permit law, and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines of up to \$2,000 and/or a year in jail. Violators are also liable for all fire suppression costs.

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Fire Officials, contact your local Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required. This also helps to prevent unnecessary response to a controlled burn.

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REPORT OF THE ROADS & BRIDGES COMMITTEE

The Roads and Bridges Committee is in its second year as a volunteer group of citizens dedicated to assuring that Barnstead will have the best possible roads and bridges consistent with available funds.

During 1994 the Roads and Bridges Committee initiated a program to monitor the traffic flow on the town roads. Attempts to obtain counters for automatic recording of traffic flow were unsuccessful. Although some progress was made the work was not completed and additional work must be done in 1995 to determine the traffic flow on town roads.

A warrant article sponsored by the Roads and Bridges Committee and passed at town meeting resulted in the upgrading and opening of the Garland Road which now provides improved access to a northwest section of Barnstead.

In May the committee was briefed by Mr. David Powelson, N.H.D.O.T, about the practices of bridge inspection and maintenance supported by the State. Various members of the committee have spoken or met with other state officials on a number of subjects.

The Roads and Bridges Committee has continued to work to improve the conditions of Barnstead roads and bridges. The committee has been involved with the budgeting process and has submitted material for the Capital Improvement Plan. This group will continue to strive to help the Selectmen and Road Agent to provide Barnstead with the best roads and bridges consistent with available funds. To the voters of District #5:

We can be proud that New Hampshire has funded several important changes in health care. Among them is insurance, with more coverage for small businesses, community rating and elimination of pre-existing conditions. Eligibility for Medicaid was expanded for low income families. Home care programs to access community services, thus keeping people at home, were started.

There was refinement to the Shoreline Protection Act and smoking area restrictions. Cemetery laws were updated and recodified, and New Hampshire now has its own veteran's cemetery. The striped bass is now the state salt water fish and we have one day family fishing licenses. Laws are now stricter for stalking and sexual assault.

Looking forward to 1995, problems to solve include: auto emission testing and regulation, death with dignity and kindergarten assistance. We will look at the need for a new prison, revamping the education system (changing SAU's), the University System bureaucracy and the juvenile justice system.

Always, what we do will depend on funds available. The House has more veteran legislators than the Senate and we hope our joint efforts will produce the needed answers.

I have enjoyed the Concord work, the county work, and most of all, the constituent work.

The 1993 - 1994 State Legislature ended action on September 15, 1994. The 93 - 94 Legislative Session addressed over 600 pieces of legislation in addition to resolutions and CACR's.

The Committee on Municipal and County Government addressed eighty (80) House Bills and ten (10) Senate Bills. The controversial Ballot Bill (HB 471) was put to interim study and our committee conducted 12 public hearings relating to this issue with the amended version finally drafted in HB 141.

My attendance on this committee coupled with the ongoing study committee addressing the legislation on revaluation, assessing and abatement procedures in conjunction with the Board of Tax and Land Appeals seemed to be an extension to the normal session.

As the session closes, one might believe that all issues have been properly addressed and all is settled. Believe this not! Each session presents unsettled old issues and introduces many new problems of current local and national bearings. I am never of the opinion that all problems were eliminated or the best legislation passed sets a paramount good for the future.

Having analyzed all issues and implemented a common sense approach in trying to accommodate the wishes of all citizens, I express myself as having done the best with the prevailing issues as presented and having exercised my one (1) vote out of 400, I have done my duty.

It has been my extreme pleasure to have served the citizens of Alton, Barnstead and Gilmanston in the 93 - 94 Session and endorse the same pleasure and pledges to represent you in the 1995 - 1996 Session.
